Subject: Resolution Authorizing Award of Competitive Contract, Competitive Contract Modifications, Rejection of Bids, and Use of Charter County Surtax Funds

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize award of competitive contracts and authorize contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew (OTRs), and reject bids received. The items are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Section 1 – Competitive Contract Awards

The item included in this section will award a competitive contract to the recommended vendors for the purchase of goods and services. The total spending authority requested is \$7,225,000 for two contracts.

Item 1.1 – Inspection, Testing, Repair, and Maintenance Service of Fire Suppression Systems: Awards a contract for the purchase of fire suppression systems services including inspection, testing, repair, and maintenance for various County departments. The amount requested for the five-year term is \$5,985,000. This item includes an allocation from Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) Operating Funds.

Item 1.2 – Parts and Services for Flight Instruments and Avionics Systems: Awards a contract for the purchase parts and service to flight instruments and avionic systems used on ten County aircrafts operated by the Police and Fire Rescue departments. The amount requested for the five-year term is \$1,240,000. This item does not include an allocation from MDT Operating Funds.

Section 2 – Contract Modifications

The items included in this section will modify competitive contracts for additional time and/or spending authority for the purchase of goods and services. The total additional spending authority requested is \$221,000 for two of the three contracts. One contract is only modified for time.

Item 2.1 – Uniform Rental: Modifies this contract for an additional six months and \$102,000 in spending authority so the Aviation and Water and Sewer departments may continue to rent uniforms. There is no request at this time to modify Transit's allocation that is supported by MDT Operating Funds.

Item 2.2 – Bell Helicopter OEM Replacement Parts, Maintenance and Repair: Modifies this contract for an additional six months so various County departments can continue to purchase original equipment manufacturer parts, maintenance and repair services for Bell helicopters. This item does not include an allocation from MDT Operating Funds.

Item 2.3 – On-Site Vehicle Alignment Services: Modifies this contract by \$119,000 in spending authority to add a five-year allocation for MDT. MDT will use this contract for the purchase of on-site alignment services for buses and other vehicles.

Section 3: Rejection of Bids

The item included in this section will reject all bids tendered in response to a competitive solicitation.

Item 3.1 – Roll-Up Doors – Inspection, Repair, Furnish and Installation Services: Rejects all five bids received under solicitation 6050-1/23 – *Roll-Up Doors – Inspection, Repair, Furnish and Installation Services*. The fiscal impact for the five-year contract term would have been \$2,384,000.

Section 29-124 of the Code requires all contracts, funded by People's Transportation Plan Surtax proceeds, regardless of value, to be approved by the Citizen's Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) and the Board. This package is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). These recommendations may only be considered by the Board if the CITT has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this contract award recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the filing of this award recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of this item. The contracts in this package are scheduled for the July 2013 CITT meeting.

Scope

The impact of the items is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocations and funding sources, by department, is listed in the attached items.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in this package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the attached items.

Delegated Authority

If the items in this package are approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew periods and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of each contract.

Due Diligence

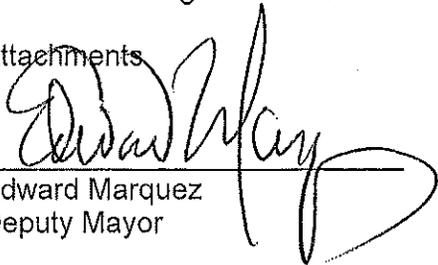

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACTS IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$7,225,000, AUTHORIZING THE MODIFICATION OF COMPETITIVE CONTRACTS FOR PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$221,000.00 IN ADDITIONAL SPENDING AUTHORITY, AUTHORIZING REJECTION OF BIDS RECEIVED, AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF CHARTER COUNTY TRANSPORTATION SURTAX FUNDS FOR SUCH CONTRACT

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board authorizes award of competitively established contracts as set forth in items 1.1 and 1.2 of the incorporated memorandum in a total amount up to \$7,225,000.00.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the modification of competitive contracts as set forth in items 2.1 – 2.3 of the incorporated memorandum to add up to an additional \$221,000.00 of spending authority for the purchase of goods and services.

Section 3. This Board authorizes the rejection of bids received in response to a solicitation as set forth in item 3.1 of the incorporated memorandum.

Section 4. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise contract modifications, options-to-renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contracts.

Section 5. This Board authorizes the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds for the contracts, contract pools and contract modifications set forth herein.

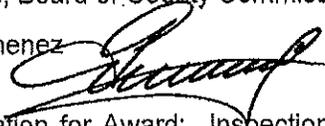

Subject: Recommendation for Award: Inspection, Testing, Repair and Maintenance Service of Fire Suppression Systems (Contract No. 0751-0/18)



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of *Contract No. 0751-0/18 Inspection, Testing, Repair and Maintenance Service of Fire Suppression Systems* to the five vendors listed further in this memorandum for the purchase of fire suppression systems services including inspection, testing, repair and maintenance for various County departments.

Approval is also requested to allow the Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) to use funds as a component of MDT Operating funds for this contract. This award recommendation is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). The MDT allocation within this contract recommendation may only be considered by the Board if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this pool contract recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the filing of this award recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of the MDT allocation from this item.

Scope

The impact of this Item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$5,985,000. The cumulative value for the previous contract was \$7,101,000 for five-years. The replacement contract is approximately 11.5 percent lower than the previous contract amount based on anticipated usage. The proposed allocations are budgeted as follows:

Track Record/Monitor

The contract managers for each department are listed in the table above. Lenny Sandoval of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications and extensions, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract for Group A. For Group B, a pre-qualification pool of vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate contract amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. Additionally, the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board. The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications, subsequent options-to-renew, and extensions, and to issue work orders, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the pool contract.

Vendors Recommended for Award

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on December 21, 2012. Award of this contract will be made to the two lowest priced responsive, responsible bidders for Group 1. Group 2 establishes a prequalified pool of vendors to participate in future spot market competitions.

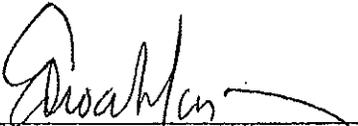

Subject: Request for Responsiveness Determination on ITB No. 0751-0/18: Inspection, Testing, Repair and Maintenance Service of Fire Suppression Systems

You have asked this office if bids submitted by various vendors bidding on ITB No. 0751-0/18: Inspection, Testing, Repair and Maintenance Service of Fire Suppression Systems are responsive. We rely on the information provided in your January 30, 2013 memorandum to Hugo Benitez, with attachments, a copy of which is attached hereto, and our meeting regarding the bids at issue.

The purpose of the ITB is to establish a contract for the procurement of services to fire suppression systems including the inspection, testing, repair and maintenance at various County facilities in conjunction with the County's needs. You have identified various issues with the bids of six (6) vendors: (1) All American Fire Inspections, Inc.; (2) All Fire Services, Inc.; (3) Century Fire, Inc.; (4) DP Plumbing & Fire Protection, Inc.; (5) National Fire Protection LLC; and (6) SimplexGrinnell LP.

Each of these six vendors will be analyzed separately below.

All American Fire Inspections, Inc.

You have identified four issues with All American Fire Inspections, Inc.: (1) failed to provide a bid for items in Group H of the bid; (2) failed to list Bid Addendum No. 5 on Acknowledgement of Addenda page; (3) failed to complete subcontractor listing form; and (4) failed to submit Class D license issued by the State Fire Marshal per Florida Statutes § 633.061.

- (1) All American Fire Inspections, Inc.'s failure to provide bid prices on certain items in Group H deprives the County of the assurance that the contract will be performed and guaranteed in accordance with the terms of the solicitation and thereby renders its bid for Group H non-responsive. Section 2.4 of the solicitation provides that award of the contract will be made "on a group-by-group basis" and clearly delineates that "[i]f a bidder fails to submit an offer for all items within the group, the offer for that specific group will be deemed non-responsive."
- (2) The failure to acknowledge Addendum No. 5 renders All American Fire Inspection, Inc.'s bid on Group I does *not* render its bid non-responsive. You have informed me that although All American Fire Inspection, Inc. did not notate in its acknowledgement of addenda form that it received Addendum No. 5, a copy of Addendum No. 5 was in fact included in All American Fire Inspections, Inc.'s bid submittal. Therefore, All American Fire Inspections, Inc. did receive Addendum No. 5. In these circumstances, the mere failure to notate an acknowledgement form is a minor and waivable variance.

- (3) The failure to complete the subcontractor listing form does not render the bid non-responsive. "Generally, a requirement that a bidder list subcontractors in its bid involves a matter of responsibility because it relates to the agency's need to evaluate the subcontractor's qualifications or the bidder's ability to meet equal employment opportunity and minority business requirements." Matter of: CDM Federal Programs Corp., B- 249022, 1992 WL 186992, at *2 (Comp. Gen. 1992); see also Matter of: Hughes Georgia, Inc., B- 244936, B- 244936.2, 91-2 CPD 457, 1991 WL 251277 (Comp. Gen. 1991) (holding that submission of list of potential subcontractors relates to issues of bidders' responsibility). Issues going to bidder responsibility can be satisfied post-bid opening, any time prior to actual contract award. See Matter of: John Short & Assocs., Inc.; Comprehensive Health Servs., Inc., B- 236266, B- 236266.4, 89-2 CPD P 448, 1989 WL 241451, at *2 (Comp. Gen. 1989). Furthermore, the County ordinance requiring the submittal of a subcontractor list provides that the submission of a subcontractor list is a condition of award. See Miami-Dade County Code § 2-8.1(f). Accordingly, the subcontractor information requested in the solicitation is information that can be submitted after bid submission but prior to award.
- (4) The failure to merely submit the Class D license at bid submission does not automatically render the bid non-responsive. All American Fire Inspections, Inc. can submit the Class D license after bid submission but prior to award. Additionally, County staff can verify through public sources whether All American Fire Inspections, Inc. possesses a current Class D license.

All Fire Services, Inc.

You have identified two issues with All Fire Services, Inc.'s bid: (1) failed to submit a current copy of Contractor I or II license; and (2) submitted an incorrect FEIN number.

- (1) The failure to merely submit a current copy of a Contractor I or II license at bid submission does not automatically render the bid non-responsive. All Fire Services, Inc. can submit a current copy of a Contractor I or II license after bid submission but prior to award. Additionally, County staff can verify through public sources whether All Fire Services, Inc. possesses a current Contractor I or II license.
- (2) All Fire Services, Inc.'s submission of an incorrect FEIN number does *not* render its bid non-responsive. The variance is minor and waivable. From the face of the bid, the FEIN number is merely a typographical error that does not adversely affect competitive bidding or place All Fire Services, Inc. in a position of advantage over other bidders.

Century Fire, Inc.

You have identified several issues with Century Fire, Inc.'s bid but Century Fire, Inc.'s failure to sign the bid or otherwise provide any signature or assurance that Century Fire, Inc. intended to be bound by its bid moots the other issues.

Century Fire, Inc.'s bid is *not* responsive because, it has failed to include a signature from its authorized representative and has failed to otherwise indicate an unequivocal intent to be bound by its bid. Generally, an unsigned bid may be considered responsive if it "is accompanied by other material

indicating the bidder's intention to be bound by the unsigned bid (such as the submission of a bid guarantee or a letter signed by the bidder, with the bid, referring to and clearly identifying the bid itself)." 48 C.F.R. 14.405 (c)(1); To Salmons Dredging Co., B-130203, 1957 WL 1437, at *2 (Comp. Gen. January 22, 1957) ("It is established that an unsigned bid may be considered for award if accompanied by a letter, bond or other document signed by the bidder clearly evincing his intent to submit the bid."); Robinson Electric Co. v. Dade County, 417 So.2d 1032, 1034 (Fla. 3d DCA 1982) (the standard for finding whether "a specific noncompliance constitutes a substantial and hence nonwaivable irregularity" includes "whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the municipality of its assurance that the contract will be entered into, performed and guaranteed according to its specified requirements"). Here, no such other evidence exists.

DP Plumbing & Fire Protection, Inc.

You have identified one issue with DP Plumbing & Fire Protection LLC. DP Plumbing & Fire Protection, Inc. did not fill out the Subcontractor Listing Form correctly.

DP Plumbing & Fire Protection, Inc.'s failure to correctly fill out the subcontractor list does not invalidate its bid. Such a variance is minor and waivable. Furthermore, as noted above, submissions of subcontractor lists relate to issues of bidders' responsibility. Issues going to bidder responsibility can be satisfied post-bid opening, any time prior to actual contract award. See Matter of: John Short & Assocs., Inc.; Comprehensive Health Servs., Inc., B- 236266, B- 236266.4, 89-2 CPD P 448, 1989 WL 241451, at *2 (Comp. Gen. 1989). Lastly, the County ordinance requiring the submittal of a subcontractor list provides that the submission of a subcontractor list is a condition of award. See Miami-Dade County Code § 2-8.1(f). Accordingly, the subcontractor information requested in the solicitation is information that can be submitted after bid submission but prior to award.

National Fire Protection, LLC

National Fire Protection, LLC: (1) failed to correctly complete and sign Subcontracting Practice Form; (2) submitted previous version of Subcontractor Listing Form; and (3) provided different FEIN numbers.

- (1) The failure to correctly complete and sign the Fair Subcontracting Practices form at the time of bid submittal does not invalidate the bid. Pursuant to Miami-Dade County § 2-8.8(4) the submission of a bidder's subcontracting policies and procedures is a condition of award. As such, National Fire Protections, LLC can submit the form after bid submission but prior to contract award.
- (2) The submission of a previous version of the subcontractor listing form is a minor variance that does not invalidate National Fire Protection, LLC's bid. If the variance is solely a matter of submitting a different form but the form provided provides sufficient subcontractor information in compliance with the bid and County Code requirements there is no need to seek further information from the bidder. Even if the County requires additional or a clarification of subcontractor information from National Fire Protection, LLC, the County can obtain the information or clarification after bid submittal and prior to award. The submission of a subcontractor list relates to issues of bidders' responsibility. See Matter of: Hughes Georgia, Inc., B- 244936, B- 244936.2, 91-2 CPD 457, 1991 WL 251277 (Comp. Gen. 1991) Issues going to bidder responsibility can be satisfied post-bid opening, any

time prior to actual contract award. See Matter of: John Short & Assocs., Inc.; Comprehensive Health Servs., Inc., B- 236266, B- 236266.4, 89-2 CPD P 448, 1989 WL 241451, at *2.(Comp. Gen. 1989).

- (3) National Fire Protection, LLC's submission of an incorrect FEIN number in one part of its bid does *not* render its bid non-responsive. The variance is minor and waivable. From the face of the bid, the incorrect FEIN number is merely a typographical error that does not adversely affect competitive bidding or place Nain a position of advantage over other bidders.

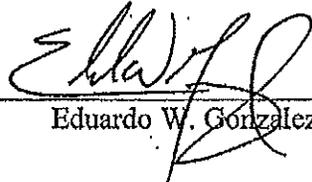
SimplexGrinnell LP

You have identified four issues with SimplexGrinnell LP's bid: (1) failed to submit Section 4 price proposal in an Excel format; (2) failed to complete the Subcontracting practices form; (3) failed to complete subcontractor listing form; and (4) submitted a Class D license from Master Protection instead of SimplexGrinnell.

- (1) You have informed me that SimplexGrinnell LP submitted its bid in a manner that the County can clearly determine the prices SimplexGrinnell LP bid on the solicited items. As such, the failure to submit the prices in a certain format does *not* invalidate SimplexGrinnell LP's bid.
- (2) The failure to correctly complete the Fair Subcontracting Practices form or submit an erroneous subcontracting form at the time of bid submittal does not invalidate the bid. Pursuant to Miami-Dade County § 2-8.8(4) the submission of a bidder's subcontracting policies and procedures is a condition of award. As such, National Fire Protections, LLC can submit a corrected form after bid submission but prior to contract award.
- (3) The failure to complete the subcontractor listing form does not render the bid non-responsive. "Generally, a requirement that a bidder list subcontractors in its bid involves a matter of responsibility because it relates to the agency's need to evaluate the subcontractor's qualifications or the bidder's ability to meet equal employment opportunity and minority business requirements." Matter of: CDM Federal Programs Corp., B- 249022, 1992 WL 186992, at *2 (Comp. Gen. 1992); see also Matter of: Hughes Georgia, Inc., B- 244936, B- 244936.2, 91-2 CPD 457, 1991 WL 251277 (Comp. Gen. 1991) (holding that submission of list of potential subcontractors relates to issues of bidders' responsibility). Issues going to bidder responsibility can be satisfied post-bid opening, any time prior to actual contract award. See Matter of: John Short & Assocs., Inc.; Comprehensive Health Servs., Inc., B- 236266, B- 236266.4, 89-2 CPD P 448, 1989 WL 241451, at *2 (Comp. Gen. 1989). Furthermore, the County ordinance requiring the submittal of a subcontractor list provides that the submission of a subcontractor list is a condition of award. See Miami-Dade County Code § 2-8.1(f). Accordingly, the subcontractor information requested in the solicitation is information that can be submitted after bid submission but prior to award.
- (4) The bid solicitation provides that the bidder or the bidder's subcontractor must possess a valid and existing Class D license. The failure to submit the Class D license at bid submission does not automatically render the bid non-responsive. SimplexGrinnell LP can submit the Class D license after bid submission but prior to award. Additionally, County

staff can verify through public sources whether SimplexGrinnell LP possesses a current Class D license.

Assuming SimplexGrinnell LP does not possess a Class D license, SimplexGrinnell LP can still meet the bid's requirement of a Class D license through a subcontractor. If Master Protection is SimplexGrinnell LP's subcontractor, the solicitation's requirements on a Class D license are satisfied. Alternatively, SimplexGrinnell LP can meet the requirement through the use of a different subcontractor with a Class D license. Such subcontractor, however, must be disclosed and submitted to the County prior to contract award.

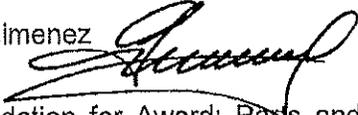

Subject: Recommendation for Award: Parts and Services for Flight Instruments and Avionic Systems



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of *Contract No. 2960-0/18, Parts and Services for Flight Instruments and Avionic Systems*, to Peninsula Avlonics, Inc., the incumbent vendor.

Flight instruments are the devices in the cockpit of an aircraft that provide the pilot with information regarding flight conditions, e.g., altitude, speed and direction. Avionics are electronic systems used on the aircraft that include communications and navigation. The purpose of the contract is to provide parts and services to flight instruments and avionic systems used on ten County aircraft. Four are operated by Fire Rescue and six by Police. The vendor's services include labor, supplies, tools, equipment, maintenance and repair.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$1,240,000. The current contract is for two years and has an allocation of \$634,000. The decrease in annual allocation is attributable to historical expenditures and estimated needs. The allocations are budgeted as follows:

The contract managers for the client departments are listed above. Jocelyn R. Fulton of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications and extensions, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

Vendor(s) Recommended for Award

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on March 7, 2013. Award was to be made to the two responsive and responsible bidders offering the lowest aggregate price, per group, as primary and secondary vendors. Two bids were received for both Group One, Flight Instruments Parts and Services, and Group Two, Avionic Instruments Parts and Services. The bid submitted from Southeast Aerospace, Inc. was deemed non-responsive by the County Attorney's Office (copy attached). Aerospace did not comply with the

requirements of the solicitation in that it neither signed the offer nor included a price. Therefore, the one responsive bidder was awarded both Group One and Group Two. There are no compliance issues with the awardee.

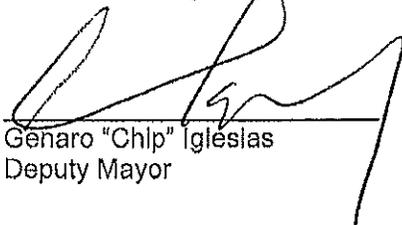

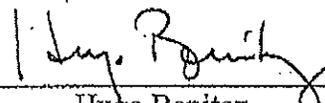
You have asked this office if a bid received from Southeast Aerospace is responsive. For the reasons set forth below, we conclude that the bid is non-responsive.

FACTS

We rely on the information you provided in email correspondence dated April 9, 2013. Southeast Aerospace submitted the bid one minute late, through electronic means. The invitation to bid requires that an original and two copies be delivered to the County which would suggest delivery through means other than electronic. Southeast Aerospace submitted the bid without signature. The bid has a cover page that is also unsigned. The information that you forwarded to me suggest that the pricing for Southeast Aerospace would be included within an Attachment (1), however, a review of Southeast Aerospace's bid and the bid's attachment(s) does not reveal any pricing. Southeast Aerospace did not provide any pricing anywhere in its bid.

DISCUSSION

Based on these facts, Southeast Aerospace is not responsive. It does not appear that Southeast Aerospace met the fundamental purpose of the invitation which was to procure a binding offer for the requested goods. It appears that no offer was proffered, and whatever was delivered was not binding.

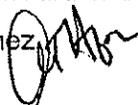

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the rejection of all five bids received under solicitation 6050-1/23, Roll-Up Doors – Inspection, Repair, Furnish and Installation Services. The purpose of the solicitation is to enter into a fixed pricing contract for the inspection, general repair and installation of various roll-up doors for multiple County departments as well as to pre-qualify vendors for emergency roll-up door and window repair services. A rejection of all bids received is recommended as pricing exceeds departments' allocations.

Scope

The impact of this item would have been countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact of the total five-year contract term would have been \$2,384,000. The allocations were budgeted as follows:

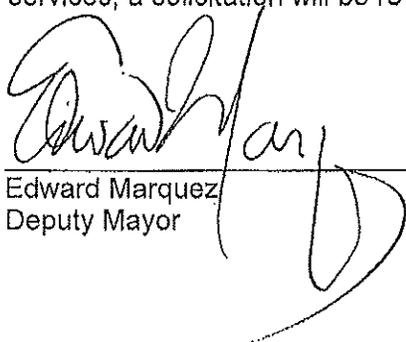

- The User Access Program provision was applicable.
- A Community Small Business Enterprise set-aside and the Local Preference Ordinance were included in the solicitation, to be applied at the time of spot market competition.
- The Living Wage Ordinance did not apply.

Background

The solicitation was comprised of three groups. A Community Small Business Enterprise set-aside was established for Groups 1 and 2. Of the five bids received, only one bidder was deemed compliant for competition in the set-aside groups. A comparison of the current contract's prices to the single eligible bid indicates a 100 percent increase for the first group and a 145 percent increase for the second group, which exceed the budget allocations of the County departments. As such, the rejection of all bids received is recommended. In an effort to obtain competitive prices for the required services, a solicitation will be re-issued with revised measures to encourage competition.
