Subject: Resolution Authorizing Award and Modification of Legacy Contracts and Use of Charter County Surtax Funds

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached contract award and contract modifications for Legacy Purchases of goods and services pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(2) of the County Code. These items are described briefly below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments.

Section 1 – Contract Award

The contract award in this section is for a Legacy Purchase of parts and services for a system. The total amount awarded for this purchase is \$1,977,000.

Item 1.1 – Oil/Water Separation Equipment Maintenance Repair – Approves a Legacy Purchase contract award to Sorbant Environmental Corporation for the Transit and Internal Services departments to purchase parts, maintenance and repair services for the existing Sorbant Oil/Water Separation System. The amount being requested for the five-year contract term is \$1,977,000. The system is a filtration mechanism which is installed in approximately 195 storm water catch basins throughout County facilities. These filtration systems are part of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan and a requirement of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System federal permit. The awarded vendor was originally selected via a competitive process. However, the vendor owns the patent to the system, and is the only vendor which may provide parts and services to this system while in use by the County.

Section 2 – Contract Modifications

The contract modifications in this section provide for additional time and/or spending authority for the purchase of necessary Legacy Purchased goods and services. The total additional funding requested for the contracts listed is \$19,482,000.

Item 2.1 – SCADA Process Control System – Modifies this contract for an additional 60 months and \$17,250,000 in spending authority to allow the Water and Sewer, Public Works and Waste Management, and Regulatory and Economic Resources departments to continue obtaining parts, supplies, maintenance, and repair services for the existing Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems which facilitate the monitoring and control of all pumping infrastructure for water treatment, water distribution, wastewater collection, and wastewater treatment. The SCADA system is proprietary and the required maintenance support services, parts, software licenses, and repair services can only be obtained through the awarded vendor, Emerson Process Management Power & Water Solutions, Inc., while in use by the County.

Item 2.2 – A/C Chiller & Related Equipment/Maintenance Repair - Modifies this competitively awarded contract for an additional 12 months and \$2,212,000 in spending authority so various County departments can continue to purchase maintenance and repair services for A/C chillers and related equipment. This contract is reaching the end of its original term and it is necessary to request a 12-month extension of this contract while the replacement contract is being solicited, thus, a new, competitively awarded contract will replace this contract upon award, which is expected by the first quarter of 2013.

This agenda item is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). The recommendation in Section 2 of this item may only be considered by the Board if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this contract award recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the filing of this award recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of this item. This contract is scheduled for the July 2013 CITT meeting.

Scope

The scope of the actions in this item are countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocation and funding source for the departments are listed in detail in the attached items.

The contract amounts and departmental allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by the department. Funding will be expended only if the department's budget can support the expenditures approved in its annual budget adopted by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the attached items. Each departments' contract manager is reflected in the individual items.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to extend the contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the attached items.

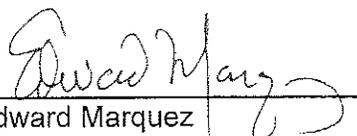
Due Diligence

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF A LEGACY CONTRACT IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$1,977,000.00 AND MODIFICATION OF LEGACY CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES BY A TWO THIRDS VOTE OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT, IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$19,482,000.00, AND AUTHORIZES USE OF CHARTER COUNTY SURTAX FUNDS

WHEREAS, the County Mayor recommends to this Board to authorize Legacy Purchases for goods and services,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1: This Board authorizes Legacy Purchases pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(2) of the County Code by a majority vote of the members present.

Section 2: This Board authorizes award of a Legacy contract as set forth in Item 1.1 of the incorporated memorandum to add an additional \$1,977,000.00 spending authority for the purchase of goods and services.

Section 3: This Board authorizes the modification of contracts as set forth in Item 2.1 and 2.2 of the incorporated memorandum to add an additional \$19,482,000.00 in spending authority for the purchase of goods and services.

Section 4: This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise contract modifications, options-to-renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contracts.

Section 5: This Board authorizes the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds for the contracts, contract pools and contract modifications set forth herein.

Item 1.1 Legacy Contract Award

Contract No.: SS5477-1/23	Title: Oil/Water Separation Equipment Maintenance Repair

Justification:

In 1996, the County purchased the Sorbant Oil/Water Separation System (System) after researching and testing various types of filtration systems. This System is a filtration mechanism which removes pollutants by suspending them in a filter media or pillow, housed in boxed frames inside various sizes of catch basins. It is installed in approximately 195 storm water catch basins located throughout County facilities. A filtration system is an important part of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System federal permit requirement. The permit requires proper maintenance of the catch basin drains and yearly sampling and analysis of storm water run-off.

In 2008, a competitive solicitation for maintenance and repair of the system was awarded to the manufacturer of the existing filtration system, Sorbant Environmental Corp. (Sorbant), as a result of a formal open and competitive Invitation to Bid process. Two bidders responded to the solicitation, with the second bidder offering an alternate system. The bid offering an alternative system was not compatible with the existing system, thus requiring the complete replacement of the system. An analysis of that option concluded the replacement of the system would have been cost prohibitive and not necessary since the existing system is in good condition. In addition, Sorbant advised there are no other vendors authorized to service or provide replacement parts to its patented system. The companies that provide similar products and services cannot maintain this system due to proprietary rights.

The existing competitive contract with Sorbant expires September 30, 2013. It is recommended the County award this contract to Sorbant to continue providing maintenance, repair and parts for this filtration system. The vendor is maintaining same prices for all services, except the price of filter is higher by five dollars under this contract.

Contract Description and Reason for Change:

Authorization is requested to modify this sole source contract for additional time and spending authority to allow the Water and Sewer, Public Works and Waste Management, and Regulatory and Economic Resources departments to continue obtaining parts, supplies, maintenance, and repair services for the existing Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems. The SCADA system is proprietary and the required maintenance support services, parts, software licenses, and repair services can only be obtained through Emerson Process Management Power & Water Solutions, Inc.

This sole source contract was established in 2007 for an initial term of three years, with three one-year options-to-renew. The entire current contract is valued at \$18,843,000 for 78 months, inclusive of the initial three year term and the three, one year options-to-renew. The County is currently in its third option-to-renew period, which was extended from 12 to 18 months.

SCADA systems facilitate the monitoring and control of all pumping infrastructure for water treatment, water distribution, wastewater collection, and wastewater treatment. The departments must properly maintain their SCADA Systems to comply with the mandates and agreement requirements issued by Federal Consent Decrees, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, and the South Florida Water Management District. The County must purchase SCADA equipment on an on-going basis to comply with federal regulations mandating that certain components be replaced periodically. Occasionally, equipment must also be replaced after it has been unexpectedly damaged by the weather. Continuity of services is required by the departments to ensure that an inventory of replacement parts and components as well as access to repair services can be obtained to respond quickly in case of an emergency situation.

Negotiations achieved a fixed percentage discount that avoids any additional increases and escalations. Approval of this modification will extend this contract for an additional five year period with fixed pricing.

In the case of Water and Sewer, the \$16,625,000 modification is necessary to meet the anticipated needs over the next five years. More specifically, Water and Sewer's allocation will: 1) replace/upgrade outdated SCADA technology to monitor, as required, the County's water and sewer system 24 hours a day, and 2) replace outdated remote terminals at three wastewater treatment plants and 521 pump stations.
