



Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Disbursement of up to \$2,500,000.00 from the Wetlands Trust Fund to the Environmentally Endangered Lands (EEL) Program for Land Acquisition in the South Dade Wetlands EEL Project Area and Providing for Land Management Activities

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached resolution authorizing the disbursement of up to \$2,500,000 as funds become available from the Wetlands Trust Fund to the Environmentally Endangered Lands (EEL) Program for land acquisition in the South Dade Wetlands EEL Project Area for the reasons set forth below.

Scope

The subject properties are located in the South Dade Wetlands EEL Project Area within Commission District 9 (Commissioner Moss).

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Pursuant to Section 24-37 of the Code, this resolution authorizes the disbursement of funds, as funds become available, from the Wetlands Trust Fund for land acquisition. The total unencumbered available balance of the Wetlands Trust Fund as of September 30, 2013 is \$7,402,149. The total unencumbered available balance of the Special Area Management Plan (SAMP) Index Code within the Wetlands Trust Fund (Project 618266/ER005A) as of September 30, 2013 is \$1,902,012.

Track Record / Monitor

Michael Spinelli, Environmental Resources Project Supervisor within the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, Division of Environmental Resources Management, will monitor the disbursement of funds.

Background

In July 1985, the Board expanded the Urban Development Boundary to include 1,600 acres of wetlands within the Bird Drive Everglades Wetland Basin and the North Trail Basin. In 1992, the Board established the Wetlands Trust Fund and authorized interagency agreements with federal and state environmental agencies for the collection of monetary contributions by property owners as mitigation for impacts within the Bird Drive Everglades Wetland Basin and the North Trail Basin.

Pursuant to Section 24-37 of the Code, disbursements from the Wetlands Trust Fund can only be used for acquisition, restoration, enhancement, management or monitoring of wetland properties in Southeast Florida. Pursuant to the interagency agreements, the Special Area Management Plan (SAMP) Implementation Committee was established to review and approve the use of funds disbursed from the Wetlands Trust Fund for SAMP purposes. Members of the Implementation Committee represent the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the (former) Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, the South Florida Water Management District and the Miami-Dade County Department

of Environmental Resources Management (now part of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources). Wetlands Trust Fund disbursements to be used for land acquisitions also require approval by the Board following a public hearing.

On June 30, 2010, the SAMP Implementation Committee unanimously recommended the disbursement of up to \$2,500,000 from the Wetlands Trust Fund to the EEL Program to acquire wetlands from willing sellers within the South Dade Wetlands EEL Project Area. The EEL Program will provide matching funds toward wetlands purchases that will contribute to the goal of restoring the greater Everglades ecosystem (see Attachment A). Allowable costs include land cost, environmental audits, title insurance, surveys, and other costs associated with EEL's conduct of due diligence in acquiring real property in the project area.

In July 2013, the EEL Program completed acquisitions via a prior disbursement authorized through Resolution Nos. R-574-05 and R-148-09 and is prepared to begin acquiring land with this additional funding upon approval of the attached resolution. Historically, the EEL Program advances the funds for acquisition when reimbursement grants are available and then deposits the reimbursed funds into the EEL Management Trust Fund to allow for the long-term management of EEL properties. All reimbursed matching funds authorized by R-574-05 and R-148-09 received to date were similarly deposited into the EEL Management Trust Fund and future reimbursements will be deposited into the EEL Management Trust Fund.



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve the attached resolution to authorize the disbursement of \$8,000,000 from the Wetlands Trust Fund to the EEL Program for land acquisitions in the EEL South Dade Wetlands Project for the reasons set forth below.

Scope

The properties to be acquired from willing sellers are located in the EEL South Dade Wetlands Project, which is located in County Commission District 9 (Commissioner Moss).

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source



Background

In July 1985, the BCC expanded the Urban Development Boundary to include 1,600 acres of wetlands within the Bird Drive Everglades and the North Trail Wetlands Basins. In 1992, the BCC established the Wetlands Trust Fund and executed interagency agreements with federal and state environmental agencies for the collection of monetary contributions by developers as mitigation for impacts within the Bird Drive Everglades and the North Trail Wetland Basins.

Pursuant to Section 24-37 of the County Code, funds in the Wetlands Trust Fund can only be disbursed for the purposes of acquisition, restoration, enhancement, management or monitoring of wetland properties in southeast Florida. Disbursements from the fund are collectively agreed upon by the Special Area Management Plan (SAMP) Implementation Committee, which is comprised of the US Army Corps of Engineers, the US Fish and Wildlife Service, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, the South Florida Water Management District and the Miami-Dade Department of Environmental Resources Management. Wetlands Trust Fund disbursements to be used for land acquisitions also require approval by the BCC following a public hearing.

On August 28, 2008, the SAMP Implementation Committee met and unanimously approved the \$8,000,000 proposal to acquire listed wetlands in Miami-Dade County with funds from the Wetlands Trust Fund. Once approved by the BCC, these funds will provide up to 50% of the costs for land acquisition from willing sellers within the EEL South Dade Wetlands Project (see Attachment A) that will contribute to the goal of restoring the greater Everglades ecosystem. Allowable costs include land costs, environmental audits, title insurance, surveys, and other costs associated with the EEL Program's due diligence for such acquisitions. These funds may be used for the purchase of parcels recently approved for acquisition by the BCC.



Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Expenditure of \$7,000,000 from the Wetlands Trust Fund to the Environmentally Endangered Lands Program (EEL) for Land Acquisitions in the South Dade Wetlands EEL Project Area

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached resolution authorizing the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000 from the Wetlands Trust Fund (Fund) to be matched on a fifty (50) percent to fifty (50) percent basis by the Environmentally Endangered Lands (EEL) Program for land acquisition in the South Dade Wetlands EEL Project area (See attached map).

BACKGROUND

In July 1985, the Board of County Commissioners expanded the Urban Development Boundary to include 1,600 acres of wetlands within the Bird Drive Everglades and the North Trail Wetlands Basins. In May 1987, Miami-Dade County offered to be the local sponsor for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Special Area Management Plan (SAMP) for the Bird Drive Everglades Basin.

On September 17, 2004, the SAMP Implementation Committee met to review six (6) proposals to acquire, restore, enhance and/or manage wetlands in Miami-Dade County with monies from the Fund. The Committee approved all six projects that will contribute to the goal of Everglades ecosystem restoration, including a 50 percent matching grant to the EEL Program for land acquisition in the South Dade Wetlands, a project which the Board of County Commissioners previously approved for the EEL Acquisition Priority A List. Allowable costs include land cost, environmental audits, title insurance, surveys, and other costs associated with EEL's conduct of due diligence in acquiring real property in the project area.

The SAMP provides that mitigation will be accomplished through the restoration of 4,000 acres of Brazilian pepper-infested wetlands in Everglades National Park, known as the Hole-in-the-Donut, for biological impacts to the wetlands of the Bird Drive and North Trail Wetland Basins that are within the Urban Development Boundary. In addition, the mitigation funds will be used for the acquisition, restoration, enhancement, management and monitoring of publicly owned wetlands in Miami-Dade County. The overall goal is to restore and manage one and one-half acres of wetlands for each acre of wetlands developed in the Bird Drive and North Trail Basins. The mitigation work is being funded by contributions from developers as part of the County, State and Federal permitting processes. Monies collected are deposited into the Miami-Dade County Wetland Trust Fund that was established in 1992 to receive monetary contributions as mitigation for projects in Miami-Dade County. Monies in the Trust Fund can only be disbursed for the purposes of acquisition, restoration, enhancement, management or monitoring of wetland properties in southeast Florida. The SAMP Implementation Committee collectively agrees upon disbursements from the fund. The fund is protected by the terms and conditions contained in interagency agreements and Section 24-37 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, which expressly prohibits the commingling of the funds, or their use for any purpose other than disbursements as discussed above.


