



Subject: Request for Award and Expenditure of up to \$811,461.30 of State Housing Initiative Partnership Funds FY 2013-14 to Miami-Dade Community Action and Human Services Department

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award and expend up to \$811,461.30 of FY 2013-14 State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) funds to Miami-Dade Community Action and Human Services Department (CAHSD) for the purpose of managing and implementing contracts resulting from state and federal allocations/grants to provide a variety of home rehabilitative services to low-moderate income residents throughout Miami-Dade County. It is also recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute all contracts, agreements, and amendments necessary to carry out the project and authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the cancellation provisions contained therein.

Scope

This item will allow timely expenditure of FY 2013-14 SHIP funds in accordance with the Florida Housing Finance Corporation's approved strategy for Miami-Dade County which includes provision for owner occupied rehabilitation loans. First priority will be given to persons with developmental disabilities as defined by Section 393.063, Florida Statutes for home modifications that allow for independent living. Services will be provided to low-moderate income residents throughout Miami-Dade County and will have a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

FY 2013-14 SHIP funds must be encumbered by June 30, 2015 and expended by September 30, 2015. The funding source for this item is the State Housing Initiative Partnership program. Approval of this resolution will not create a fiscal impact to the Miami-Dade County General Fund.

Track Record/Monitoring

The project will be monitored by Gregg Fortner, Executive Director, Public Housing and Community Development (Department).

Background

The Florida Housing Finance Corporation administers the State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) program which provides funds to local governments as an incentive to create partnerships that produce and preserve affordable homeownership and multifamily housing. The County's FY 2013-14 Funding Certification was approved by the State on July 18, 2013 with a total allocation of \$2,279,857.00 (Attachment A). The strategy for expenditure of funds includes owner-occupied rehabilitation, home ownership assistance and home ownership counseling. At least twenty percent (20%) of the allocation must be spent to serve persons with special needs as defined by s.420.0004, Florida Statutes; and of this population, the first priority for use of funds must be used to assist persons with developmental disabilities as defined by the s.393.063, Florida Statutes, with an emphasis on home modifications, including technological enhancements and devices, which will allow homeowners to remain

independent in their own homes and maintain their homeownership. These funds may also be used to assist households that include a member(s) that is developmentally disabled.

The Department has a long standing relationship with CAHSD in managing/implementing contracts resulting from state and federal allocations/grants to provide a variety of home rehabilitative services to low-moderate income residents throughout Miami-Dade County. CAHSD has a long wait list of clients that may meet the eligibility criteria for these funds that can be easily identified. Additionally, the public will be notified via local newspapers, the County's website and 311 of the availability of these resources, activities that are eligible for funding, and the process for applying for funding. CAHSD has a pool of qualified contractors that can be accessed to complete the rehabilitative services that is allowable with these funds. CAHSD has the capacity to manage the level and scope of work required under this project within the specified timeframe. Additionally, CAHSD will be reimbursed for project delivery costs associated with work completed under the agreement with PHCD from these funds.

Expenditure Deadline:

All funds must be encumbered by June 30, 2015 and expended by September 30, 2015. Therefore, a contract must be approved and effectuated with CAHSD as soon as possible to enable the Department to meet the expenditure deadline. In addition, by awarding up to \$811,461.30, the item gives the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the flexibility to award and expend funds, allowing the projects to move forward without any further delays.

RESOLUTION APPROVING AWARD AND EXPENDITURE OF UP TO \$811,461.30 OF FY 2013-14 STATE HOUSING INITIATIVE PARTNERSHIP (SHIP) FUNDS TO MIAMI-DADE COUNTY COMMUNITY ACTION AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT (CAHSD); AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ALL CONTRACTS, ANY NECESSARY AGREEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS AND CANCELLATION PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the County annually receives an allocation of State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) funds from the Florida Housing Finance Corporation to create partnerships that produce and preserve affordable homeownership and multifamily housing; and

WHEREAS, the County's FY2013-14 Funding Certification was approved by the State on July 18, 2013 (Attachment A) with a total allocation of \$2,279,857.00, and the County is required to expend at least 20% of the County's allocation to serve persons with special needs as defined by s.420.0004, Florida Statutes with first priority for use of funds to assist persons with developmental disabilities as defined by s.393.063, Florida Statutes with an emphasis on home modifications, including technological enhancements and devices which allow homeowners to remain independent in their homes and maintain homeownership. Funds may also be used to assist households that include a member(s) that is developmentally disabled; and

WHEREAS, the Board authorizes the award and expenditure of up to \$811,461.30 to Miami-Dade Community Action and Human Services (CAHSD) for the purpose of managing and implementing contracts, resulting from state and federal allocations/grants to provide a variety of home rehabilitative services to low-moderate income residents throughout Miami-Dade County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award and expend up to \$811,461.30 of FY 2013-14 State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) funds to Miami-Dade Community Action and Human Services Department (CAHSD) for the purpose of managing and implementing contracts, resulting from state and federal allocations/grants to provide a variety of home rehabilitative services to low-moderate income residents throughout Miami-Dade County.

Section 2. The Board also authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute all contracts, agreements, and amendments necessary to carry out the project and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the cancellation provisions contained therein.

Legislative Language

Except as otherwise specified in this section, local governments must use this funding according to the SHIP statute and rules and within the parameters of their adopted local housing assistance plan.

(2) All funding appropriated under this section must be targeted for one or more of the following strategies:

- (a) Rehabilitating or modifying owner-occupied houses, including blighted homes or neighborhoods.
- (b) Assisting with purchases of existing housing, with or without rehabilitation.
- (c) Providing housing counseling services.
- (d) Providing lease-purchase assistance.
- (e) Implementing strategies approved by FHFC which are related to assisting households and communities impacted by foreclosures, using existing housing stock.

(3) Of the funding provided in this section, each local government must use a minimum of 20 percent of its allocation to serve persons with special needs as defined in s. 420.0004, Florida Statutes. Before this portion of the allocation is released by FHFC, a local government must certify that it will meet this requirement through existing approved strategies in the local assistance plan or submit a new local housing assistance plan strategy for this purpose to the FHFC for approval to ensure that it meets these specifications. The first priority of these special

** 420.0004 (13), F.S. *"Person with special needs" means an adult person requiring independent living services in order to maintain housing or develop independent living skills and who has a disabling condition; a young adult formerly in foster care who is eligible for services under s. 409.1451(5); a survivor of domestic violence as defined in s. 741.28; or a person receiving benefits under the Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) program or the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program or from veterans' disability benefits.*

***393.063 (9), F.S. *"Developmental disability" means a disorder or syndrome that is attributable to retardation, cerebral palsy, autism, spina bifida, or Prader-Willi syndrome; that manifests before the age of 18; and that constitutes a substantial handicap that can reasonably be expected to continue indefinitely.*


**CERTIFICATION TO
FLORIDA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION**

Name of Local Government: Miami- Dade County, FL

- (1) The local government will advertise the availability of SHIP funds pursuant to Florida Statutes.
- (2) All SHIP funds will be expended in a manner which will insure that there will be no discrimination on the basis of race, creed, religion, color, age, sex, familial or marital status, handicap, or national origin.
- (3) A process for selection of recipients for funds has been developed.
- (4) The eligible municipality or county has developed a qualification system for applications for awards.
- (5) Recipients of funds will be required to contractually commit to program guidelines.
- (6) The Florida Housing Finance Corporation will be notified promptly if the local government (or interlocal entity) will be unable to comply with the provisions the plan.
- (7) The Local Housing Assistance Plan shall provide for the expenditure of SHIP funds within 24 months following the end of the State fiscal year in which they are received.
- (8) The plan conforms to the Local Government Comprehensive Plan, or that an amendment to the Local Government Comprehensive Plan will be initiated at the next available opportunity to insure conformance with the Local Housing Assistance Plan.
- (9) Amendments to the approved Local Housing Assistance Plan shall be provided to the Corporation with in 21 days after adoption.
- (10) The trust fund shall be established with a qualified depository for all SHIP funds as well as moneys generated from activities such as interest earned on loans.
- (11) Amounts on deposit in the local housing assistance trust fund shall be invested as permitted by law.
- (12) The local housing assistance trust fund shall be separately stated as a special revenue fund in the local governments audited financial statements, copies of the audits will be forwarded to the Corporation as soon as available.

Certification

- 13) An interlocal entity shall have its local housing assistance trust fund separately audited for each state fiscal year, and the audit forwarded to the Corporation as soon as possible.
- 14) SHIP funds will not be pledged for debt service on bonds or as rent subsidies.
- 15) Developers receiving assistance from both SHIP and the Low Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) Program shall comply with the income, affordability and other LIHTC requirements, Similarly, any units receiving assistance from other federal programs shall comply with all Federal and SHIP program requirements.
- 16) Loans shall be provided for periods not exceeding 30 years, except for deferred payment loans or loans that extend beyond 30 years which continue to service eligible persons.
- 17) Rental Units constructed or rehabilitated with SHIP funds shall be monitored at least annually for 15 years for compliance with tenant income requirements and affordability requirements or as required in Section 420.9075 (3)(e)
- 18) The Plan meets the requirements of Section 420-907-9079 FS, and Rule Chapter 67-37 FAC, and how each of those requirements shall be met.
- 19) The provisions of Chapter 83-220, Laws of Florida X has or has not been implemented. (note: Miami-Dade County will check "has")
