

Subject: Recommendation for Approval to Establish a Pre-Qualification Pool for Lot Clearing Services

Agenda Item No. 8(F)(5)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the establishment of a Contract, No. 8239-0/24, Lot Clearing Services Pre-qualification Pool for multiple County departments. Services include the removal and disposal of debris, plant material and abandoned equipment. The services will be performed in one of three ways: (1) tractor mowing, chipping, trimming and weed eating; (2) mechanical clearing; or (3) loading, hauling and light or heavy disposal of solid waste.

Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces utilizes this contract to service both private and County acquired properties that have been found by the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department to be out of compliance with Chapter 19, Responsible Property Owner and Merchant Act, of the County's Code of Ordinance. In these cases, property owners are then billed for the services rendered.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the ten-year term is \$3,630,000. The current contract, 8239-4/12, is for seven years and valued at \$2,859,000. The replacement contract's proposed allocation is based on the user departments' projected needs. The proposed allocation is budgeted as follows:

Track Record/Monitor

This contract is used by various County departments, and the contract manager for each department is listed in the table above. Lina Bonilla, CPPB, of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

Upon approval of this item, a pool of pre-qualified vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate contract amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. Additionally, the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board.

The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications, options-to-renew, and other extensions in accordance with the terms and conditions of the pool contract.

Vendors Pre-Qualified for Pool

A Request to Qualify (RTQ) was issued on December 24, 2013 under full and open competition. The method of award is to all responsive and responsible vendors who meet the minimum requirements in the RTQ for participation in future spot market competitions. Additional qualified vendors may be added to the pool at any time during the RTQ term. The vendors listed in the table below meet the pre-qualification criteria.

Pre-qualified vendors will be invited to participate in future competitions. Thirteen vendors responded to the RTQ, of which five did not provide the required documentation. A public meeting was held on January 15, 2014 to assist firms in complying with the RTQ, and as a result one of the five vendors who attended the meeting provided the required documents. Of the nine firms pre-qualified to date, seven of those firms are either Micro/SBE, DBE and/or CSBE certified firms.



Due Diligence

Due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine Contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues. The lists that were referenced include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Contractor responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two percent User Access Program provision applies and will be collected on all purchases where permitted by the funding source.
- The Small Business Enterprise Bid Preference and Local Preference Ordinances will be applied at the time of spot market competitions where permitted by the funding source. A SBE set-aside also applies where permitted by the funding source for spot market competition up to \$100,000 when there are three or more certified SBE firms available.
- The Living Wage Ordinance does not apply.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PRE-QUALIFICATION POOL
CONTRACT 8239-0/24 LOT CLEARING SERVICES IN A
TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$3,630,000 FOR PURCHASE OF
GOODS AND SERVICES

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board authorizes the establishment of a pool contract for the purchase of goods and services as set forth in the incorporated memorandum in a total amount of up to \$3,630,000, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to conduct spot bids, award subsequent contracts, and add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise contract modifications, options-to-renew, any cancellation provisions, and any other rights contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contracts.
