Subject: Resolution Declaring the Reduction in Square Footage of the Designated Property Known as Parcel 17 for Right-of-Way Needed for the People's Transportation Plan Project Entitled Improvements to SW 137 Avenue from the Homestead Extension of the Florida Turnpike (SR 821) to SR-5 (US-1) to be a Public Necessity, Authorizing the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds, and Rescinding Resolution R-810-11

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve the attached resolution which:

- Rescinds Resolution R-810-11, adopted on October 4, 2011, which authorized the acquisition of Parcel 17 needed for the People's Transportation Plan Project Entitled Improvements to SW 137 Avenue from the Homestead Extension of the Florida Turnpike (SR 821) to SR-5 (US-1) Project; and
- Approves the attached resolution authorizing the acquisition of said parcel, by negotiation, donation, right of way designation, purchase at values established by appraisals or tax assessed value whichever is the higher of the two together with reasonable attorneys' fees, expert fees, business damages and costs pursuant to Sections 73.091 and 73.092, Florida Statutes, or eminent domain court proceedings including a declaration of taking as necessary for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County and decreasing the square footage of Parcel 17 by 1,996 square feet, from the original 15,499 square feet to 13,503 square feet, as a result of this Project being subjected to value engineering and cost effectiveness. Bond proceeds from the Charter County Transportation Surtax bond will be used to fund this Project, therefore, approval by the BCC and the Citizen's Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) is required.

This resolution is for the acquisition of Parcel 17, which is one of the final parcels needed by Public Works and Waste Management (PWWM) for programmed improvements to the Project. Florida Statute Section 127.02 requires that there be a separate resolution for each individual property.

Said Resolution is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). This item may only be considered by the BCC if the CITT has forwarded a recommendation to the BCC prior to the date scheduled for BCC consideration or forty-five (45) days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this item. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and forty-five (45) days have not elapsed since the filing of this item, I will request a withdrawal of this item.

Scope

The impact of this project is countywide; however, it is located within Commissioner Lynda Bell's District 8 and Commissioner Dennis C. Moss' District 9.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding for the right-of-way acquisition, design and construction of this Project is from Charter County Transportation Surtax bond proceeds, and may be supplemented by other eligible funding sources. Funding is programmed within the adopted FY2013-2014 Capital Budget and the index code is CPEPTP478137. The initial acquisition costs have been budgeted and no additional fiscal impacts are expected; however, in the event of litigation the ultimate acquisition costs would be subject to a future ruling by the Court.


The total cost estimate of the project (inclusive of construction, design and the right-of-way acquisition of all parcels) is \$7,536,890.00.

Track Record/Monitor

The Public Works and Waste Management Department is the entity overseeing this project and the person responsible for monitoring this acquisition is Mr. Francisco Fernandez, Chief Real Estate Officer, Roadway Engineering and Right-of-Way Division.

Background

In an effort to curtail costs, the SW 137 Avenue Project was reevaluated for cost effectiveness and subjected to value engineering. These efforts resulted in the redesign of a segment of the project, yielding cost savings, minimizing the amount of right-of-way to be acquired, maintaining the integrity of the project, while adhering to the goals of the BCC. This resolution authorizes the reduction in square footage of Parcel 17 for right-of-way needed by PWWM for roadway expansion. The proposed project includes roadway expansion, beautification and improvements consisting of reconstructing the existing roadway to include raised landscaped medians, bicycle facilities, sidewalks, curb and gutters, a continuous storm drainage system, signalization, pavement markings and signage, and roadway lighting. These improvements will increase vehicular capacity, improve traffic mobility, ensure ADA compliance, and provide multiple modes of transportation.

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE ACQUISITION OF THE DESIGNATED PROPERTY KNOWN AS PARCEL 17 FOR THE PEOPLE'S TRANSPORTATION PLAN (PTP) ENTITLED IMPROVEMENTS ON SW 137 AVENUE FROM THE HOMESTEAD EXTENSION OF FLORIDA'S TURNPIKE (SR 821) TO SR-5 (US 1), TO BE A PUBLIC NECESSITY; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE AND THE COUNTY ATTORNEY TO TAKE ANY AND ALL APPROPRIATE ACTIONS TO ACCOMPLISH ACQUISITION OF THE SUBJECT PROPERTY IN FEE SIMPLE, BY PURCHASE AT APPRAISED VALUE OR BY EMINENT DOMAIN PROCEEDINGS; RESCINDING RESOLUTION R-810-11 AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF COUNTY TRANSPORTATION SURTAX FUNDS

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds and declares the acquisition of Parcel 17 in fee simple as legally described in Exhibit "A" and shown on the project location map in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and made a part hereof, for the public purpose of roadway expansion and right-of-way improvements to SW 137 Avenue from the Homestead Extension of Florida Turnpike (SR 821) to SR-5 (US-1), to be required or necessary to accomplish such construction; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County is authorized under the Constitution and laws of Florida, including Chapters 73, 74, 125, 127 and 341, Florida Statutes and Sections 1.10 (A)(1) (2) and (21) of the Home Rule Charter of Miami-Dade County to acquire said property by eminent domain proceedings,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board ratifies and adopts these matters set forth in the foregoing recitals.

Section 2. This Board finds and declares that the acquisition of parcel 17, as legally described in "Exhibit A" and shown on project location map in "Exhibit B" all attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, is needed for the public purpose of improvements to SW 137 Avenue from the Homestead Extension of Florida Turnpike (SR 821) to SR-5 (US-1).

Section 3. This Board authorizes and directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee and County Attorney to employ appraisers, review appraisers and expert witnesses, to obtain required environmental audits and to take any action to acquire the subject parcel, as legally described in "Exhibit A" in fee simple, including any businesses thereon, either by negotiation, donation, right of way designation, purchase at values established by appraisals or tax assessed value whichever is the higher of the two together with reasonable attorneys' fees, expert fees, business damages and costs pursuant to Sections 73.091 and 73.092, Florida Statutes, or eminent domain court proceedings including a declaration of taking as necessary for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County and authorizes the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds.

Section 4. Pursuant to Resolution No. R-974-09, this Board directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to record the instruments of conveyance accepted herein in the Public Records of Miami-Dade County, Florida; and to provide a recorded copy of the instrument to the Clerk of the Board within thirty (30) days of execution of said instrument; and directs the Clerk of the Board to attach and permanently store a recorded copy together with this resolution.

Section 5. This Resolution shall supersede Resolution Number R-810-11, which is hereby rescinded and replaced herewith.


