RESOLUTION DIRECTING MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO ESTABLISH A CHINESE CONSULATE-GENERAL IN MIAMI

WHEREAS, the People's Republic of China is the world's second-largest economy by both nominal total gross domestic product and purchasing power parity, and is also the world's largest exporter and importer of goods; and

WHEREAS, the People's Republic of China maintains an embassy in Washington, D.C., and five (5) consulates-general in New York, Chicago, San Francisco, Los Angeles and Houston; and

WHEREAS, the Chinese Consulate-General in Houston covers a consular jurisdiction that includes the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, due to the growth and improvement in China-US relations and increased interactions between the Chinese and American business communities, Miami-Dade County residents have shown heightened interest in travel to China; and

WHEREAS, it places a significant burden and hardship on Miami-Dade County residents to obtain a visa from the Chinese Consulate-General in Houston, as visas are necessary to visit China's mainland and must be applied for and obtained in person, or entrusted to someone else; and

WHEREAS, establishing a consulate-general in Miami is in the best interest of Miami-Dade County as it will bring Chinese investments to Miami-Dade County, expand and promote China-US trade relationships, and encourage greater tourism; and WHEREAS, establishing a consulate-general in Miami could assist in establishing direct flight routes to/from Miami International Airport, which will increase passenger and cargo traffic and enhance international trade and commerce,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the Board requests the Mayor or Mayor's designee to develop a plan to establish a Chinese Consulate-General in Miami.
