

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The proposed ordinance amends Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code) to exempt organizations providing animal placement services to the Animal Services Department; veterinary services provided by licensed veterinarians from submitting any other affidavit, disclosure or registration otherwise required by the Code for contractors and entities transacting business with the County. Implementation of this ordinance will not have a fiscal impact to the County.

ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO EXEMPT CERTAIN ANIMAL SERVICES TRANSACTIONS AND PURCHASES FROM COUNTY VENDOR AFFIDAVIT AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

**Section 1.** Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:<sup>1</sup>

**Sec. 2-8.1. Contracts and purchases generally.**

(d) *Disclosure required of contractors and entities transacting business with Miami-Dade County.*

\* \* \* \* \*  
(5) Notwithstanding any other provision of the Code, entities contracting or transacting business with the County for performances; honorariums; training services; historical preservation services; rehabilitative services; cable and satellite services; video conferencing services; dental services for inmates; tutoring services; animal medication purchases; shipment of animals; ~~>>organizations providing animal placement services to the Animal Services Department; veterinary services provided by licensed veterinarians;<<~~ anti-venom purchases; purchases of land; and car leases for County officials shall only be required to submit, at a minimum, a W9, the entity's full legal name, business address, telephone number and email address on a

form to be provided by the Department of Procurement Management and shall not be required to submit any other affidavit, disclosure or registration otherwise required by the Code.

**Section 2.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

**Section 3.** It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

**Section 4.** This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.
