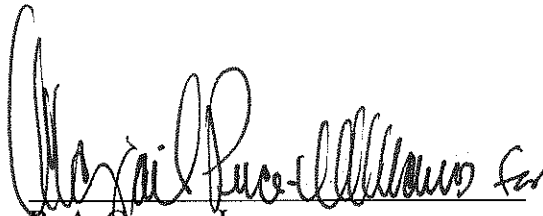

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS
TO ENACT LEGISLATION THAT WOULD ALLOW STATES
AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, INCLUDING MIAMI-DADE
COUNTY, TO PROHIBIT CONTRACTING WITH ENTITIES
DOING BUSINESS WITH OR FUNDED BY STATE
SPONSORS OF TERRORISM

WHEREAS, Cuba is a totalitarian police state which relies on repressive methods to maintain control including intense physical and electronic surveillance of both Cuban citizens and foreign visitors; and

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2012, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-659-12 placing a straw ballot question on the November 6, 2012 General Election ballot asking the voters of Miami-Dade County whether they would support, to the extent permitted by federal law, prohibiting use of taxpayer's dollars to procure services and projects from companies actively doing business with state sponsors of terrorism; and

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2012, the voters of Miami-Dade County overwhelmingly by a margin of 62 percent to 38 percent expressed their will that Miami-Dade County should not do business with companies which profit from and foster the economic activities of repressive governments like Cuba and Syria; and

WHEREAS, there are currently four countries that the federal government identifies as state sponsors of terrorism, Cuba, Iran, Sudan and Syria; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to enact legislation, upon a change in federal law, to enforce the will of the electors of Miami-Dade County to restrict commerce with all state sponsors of terrorism,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Congress of the United States to enact legislation that would allow states and local governments, including Miami-Dade County, to prohibit contracting with entities doing business with or funded by state sponsors of terrorism.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the President of the United States and the members of the Florida Congressional Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2014 Federal Legislative Package to include this item and to include this item in the 2015 Federal Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Esteban L. Bovo, Jr. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, vote was as follows:
