Subject: Resolution Authorizing Expenditure Authority and Extending Prequalification Pool Contracts for Purchase of Goods and Services

Agenda Item No. 8(F)(8)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize time extensions for prequalification pools and grant additional expenditure authority, with authority to exercise option-to-renew (OTR) periods, as described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments. The total additional expenditure amount requested for the prequalification pools is \$1,147,000.

Item 1 – Mobile Materials Handling Equipment - Prequalification: Requests additional expenditure authority in the amount of \$763,000 to allow the Water and Sewer Department to continue purchasing various maintenance equipment needed for routine and emergency operations countywide.

Item 2 – Caster and Industrial Wheels - Prequalification: Extends this prequalification pool for an additional five years so various County departments may continue to use this pool to purchase casters and industrial wheels. The amount requested for the five-year extension is \$69,000.

Item 3 – Veterinary & Pharmaceutical Supplies - Prequalification: Requests additional expenditure authority in the amount of \$315,000 to allow the Animal Services Department to satisfy outstanding invoices for purchases of veterinary medical and pharmaceutical supplies.

Scope

The impact of the items is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocations and funding sources, by department, is listed in the attached items.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in this package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the attached items.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contracts, Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.

Additionally, vendors will continue to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate contract amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may also add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board.

Due Diligence

Due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine Contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and review of performance or compliance issues. The lists referenced include convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Contractor responsibility. This information is provided pursuant to R-187-12.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL TIME AND EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$1,147,000.00 FOR PREQUALIFICATION POOL CONTRACTS FOR PURCHASE OF MOBILE MATERIALS HANDLING EQUIPMENT, CASTER AND INDUSTRIAL WHEELS, AND VETERINARY & PHARMACEUTICAL SUPPLIES; AND AUTHORIZING COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO CONDUCT SPOT BIDS AND AWARD CONTRACTS UP TO AUTHORIZED AMOUNT

WHEREAS, the County Mayor recommends to this Board to authorize additional time and expenditure authority for the purchase of goods and services,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board authorizes additional time and expenditure authority as set forth in items 1 through 3 of the incorporated memorandum in an amount up to \$1,147,000.00 for prequalification pools for the purchase of mobile materials handling equipment; caster and industrial wheels; and veterinary & pharmaceutical supplies.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute contracts for the items approved herein and exercise all provisions of the contracts contained therein in accordance with the terms and conditions of such contracts, Section 2-8.1 of the County Code, and Implementing Order 3-38.

Section 3. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to conduct spot bids, award subsequent contracts, and add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis, for the pools set forth in items 1 through 3 of the incorporated memorandum.

Contract Description and Reason for Change:
 Authorization is requested to increase expenditure authority of this prequalification pool contract by \$763,000 to allow the Water and Sewer Department (WASD) to continue purchasing various maintenance equipment needed for routine and emergency operations countywide. The majority of the equipment being purchased will replace existing equipment (e.g., excavators, pumps, light towers and air compressors) that are well beyond their useful life, are too costly to repair, and no replacement equipment exists. The existing equipment is frequently inoperable causing significant downtime in WASD's operations as the equipment is used to perform a variety of critical water treatment infrastructure projects. The requested increase also covers four new pieces of equipment: a skid steer loader, a 35-ton lowboy trailer, an 8,000-pound forklift, and an electric golf cart. The new equipment is required components of WASD's fleet operations as they will be used for repairing sewer infrastructure, handling kiln bricks at water treatment plants, cleaning lines and transporting materials to and from job sites. All of these purchases will be competitively solicited through invitations to quote under this pool contract.

Contract Description and Reason for Change:

Authorization is requested to extend this existing pre-qualification pool contract for an additional five years to allow multiple County departments to continue purchasing casters and industrial wheels. The wheels and casters purchased under this contract replace old wheels on storage cabinets, transport carts, hydraulic lifts, work platforms, shop chairs and diagnostic equipment, mobile generators and other shop machines that require ease of mobility. The value of the five-year extension of this pool contract is based on current and anticipated usage during the extension period requested. Pre-qualified vendors participate in spot market quotes as required by County departments on either an as-needed or on a periodic basis.

Market research shows the requirements, terms and conditions of the contract will not change if a replacement contract is issued, and it is anticipated that the same vendors will pre-qualify for a replacement solicitation. As such, it is in the best interest of the County to modify the existing pool for an additional five years to allow user departments to continue accessing this contract. Additionally, qualified vendors may be added to the pool at any time during the term of the contract, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board. This pre-qualification pool will remain advertised on the County's procurement management services website to encourage additional participation, and staff will also notify other vendors enrolled in this commodity code that the pre-qualification pool is available to access.

Contract Description and Reason for Change:
 Authorization is requested to modify this contract for additional expenditure authority to enable the Animal Services Department (ASD) to satisfy \$315,000 in outstanding invoices for purchase of various veterinary medical and pharmaceutical supplies. This prequalification pool contract was originally established for purchase of veterinary medical and pharmaceutical supplies, related emergency and miscellaneous items for various County departments.

The outstanding invoices are for supplies purchased from Patterson Veterinary Supply, Inc. and include apomorphine, dexalyte, penicillamine, bladewash, cotton rolls and gloves. ASD incurred these expenses from September 2013 to June 2014. Approval of the requested increase will function as a retroactive modification, enabling ASD to pay their supplier.

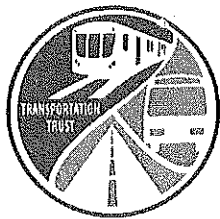
