Resolution Waiving the Requirement for an Annual Exemption Application for

Surviving Spouses of First Responders who died in the line of duty

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) waive the requirement for an annual exemption application for Surviving Spouses of First Responders who died in the line of duty if there has been no change in eligibility for the exemption.

SCOPE

The annual application waiver for Surviving Spouse Exemption will benefit eligible property owners countywide and shall apply to the 2015 assessment roll and the assessment roll of each year thereafter until rescinded by the Board.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

There is no fiscal impact.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

Section 196.011(1)(a) of the Florida Statutes requires an annual application to be submitted to the Property Appraiser's Office (PA) to maintain eligibility for the Surviving Spouse Exemption. Waiving the requirement for an annual application for entitlement to the Surviving Spouse Exemption would make this exemption renew automatically similarly to other exemptions for which the Board has previously waived annual application requirements. Section 196.011 of the Florida Statutes includes language that affords reasonable course of action for the PA to recover the taxes should this exemption be improperly claimed under automatic renewal.

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Section 196.011(9)(a) of the Florida Statutes, a county may, upon the request of the Property Appraiser and by a majority vote of its governing body, waive the requirement that annual renewal application be made for the renewal of the Surviving Spouse Exemption.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolution waiving the requirement for an annual exemption application for Surviving Spouses of First Responders who died in the line of duty.

RESOLUTION WAIVING THE REQUIREMENT FOR AN ANNUAL EXEMPTION APPLICATION FOR SURVIVING SPOUSES OF FIRST RESPONDERS WHO DIED IN THE LINE OF DUTY IF THERE HAS BEEN NO CHANGE IN ELIGIBILITY FOR EXEMPTION

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 196.081(6) of the Florida Statutes, the surviving spouse of a first responder who died in the line of duty is, under certain specified circumstances, entitled to a total exemption from ad valorem taxes upon their homestead ("Surviving Spouse Exemption"); and

WHEREAS, section 196.011(1)(a) requires an annual application to be submitted to the property appraiser to maintain eligibility for the Surviving Spouse Exemption; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 196.011(9)(a) of the Florida Statutes, a county may, upon the request of the property appraiser and by a majority vote of its governing body, waive the requirement that an annual renewal application be made for the renewal of the Surviving Spouse Exemption; and

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County Office of the Property Appraiser ("Property Appraiser") has requested this Board to waive the requirement for an annual renewal application for the Surviving Spouse Exemption; and

WHEREAS, waiving the requirement for an annual application for entitlement to the Surviving Spouse Exemption would make this exemption renew automatically similarly to other exemptions for which this Board has previously waived annual application requirements; and

WHEREAS, this Board is required to consider the possibility of fraudulent exemption claims which may occur due to the requested waiver of the annual application; and

WHEREAS, the requirement that property owners receiving an automatically-renewed exemption notify the Property Appraiser promptly whenever the property loses its eligibility for the exemption, together with the Property Appraiser's ability to lien a property retroactively for 10 years with penalties and interest if any such exemption is wrongfully obtained or carried over, limit the possibility and consequences of fraudulent exemptions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board adopts the foregoing recitals, and:

Spouse Exemption granted pursuant to section 196.081(6), the requirement that an annual renewal application be submitted to the Property Appraiser for continued exemption within the County is hereby waived, except as provided below.

Section 2. Timely annual application for the Surviving Spouse Exemption shall be required whenever the property exempted on the assessment roll of the immediately preceding tax year is sold or otherwise disposed of, when the ownership changes in any manner, when the applicant ceases to use the property as his or her homestead, or when the status of the owner changes so as to change the exempt status of the property, as provided in section 196.011(9)(a). This resolution shall become effective immediately and shall apply to the 2015 assessment roll

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and to the assessment roll of each year thereafter until this resolution is rescinded by the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 3. This Board urges the Property Appraiser to mail an annual renewal notice to any property to which the waiver in this Resolution is applied providing the property owner(s) with information regarding the exemptions currently being applied to their property and the potential consequences of an improperly renewed exemption.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
