**Subject:** Recommendation for Approval to Award: Chillers and Water Treatment Service Contract

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of *Contract No. FB-00074, Chillers and Water Treatment Service Contract* to six (6) vendors as shown in the attachment to this transmittal memorandum to obtain inspection services and water treatment services for air conditioning chillers and related HVAC (i.e., heating, ventilating and air conditioning) equipment located at various County facilities.

The awarded vendors are required to deliver a comprehensive preventive maintenance program per awarded facility, including all necessary labor, transportation, material, and equipment for the safe operation of chiller and related HVAC equipment. In addition to equipment maintenance, the awardees shall institute a complete water treatment program to protect air conditioning and heating equipment, and piping from deterioration.

## Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

## Fiscal Impact and Funding Sources

The fiscal impact for the six-year term is \$7,177,000. The recommended contract consolidates two (2) current contracts for this service: 6046-2/12 (*A/C Chillers and Related Equipment Maintenance and Repair Services*) valued at \$11,864,254 for seven (7) years, which includes chiller and related HVAC equipment maintenance services, and TBW9742-1/14 (*Boiler and Chilled Water Chemical Treatment Services*) valued at \$567,600 for one (1) year and nine (9) months, which includes water treatment services for chiller and related HVAC equipment.

The Aviation Department is not included in this replacement contract as a turnkey airport-specific maintenance contract was recently advertised (*FB-00123*). The total allocation requested for this award is based on the aggregate pricing offered by the recommended vendors and includes an additional 20 percent allocation by department for unforeseen repairs to auxiliary equipment.

**Delegated Authority**

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contract pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.

**Vendors Recommended for Award**

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on May 23, 2014. Seven bids were received in response to the solicitation. The method of award was to the lowest-priced responsive, responsible bidder by group in the aggregate (i.e., for all items and years) that met the solicitation's minimum requirements. 
**Due Diligence**

There are no adverse findings relating to Contractor responsibility.

- The two (2) percent User Access Program provision applies and will be collected on all purchases were permitted by funding source.
- The Community Small Business Enterprise Bid Preference was not applied due to insufficient availability of small businesses firms.
- The Local Preference was applied in accordance with the Local Preference Ordinance where permitted by the funding but did not impact the outcome.
- The Living Wage Ordinance does not apply. The Responsible Wages Ordinance applies to this contract as it is classified as a construction project under the Community Small Business Enterprise Program.

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You have asked this office if the bid submitted by Southeastern Chiller Services (“Southeastern Chiller”) for Group 37 of Solicitation FB-00074 (Chillers and Water Treatment Service Contract) is responsive. For the reasons set forth below, we conclude that Southeastern Chiller’s bid for Group 37 of the aforementioned solicitation is *non-responsive*.

## FACTS

We rely on the information provided in your September 2, 2014 email to Rita Gonzalez regarding the bidding issues, the attachments to that email, the terms of the solicitation itself and the bid submitted by Southeastern Chiller. The purpose of the solicitation is to establish a full service contract to provide all necessary labor, transportation, material and equipment to furnish a comprehensive program of inspections, testing, preventive maintenance, emergency repair, routine repair and water treatment services for air conditioning chiller and related HVAC equipment. The solicitation’s method of award provision provided:

Award of this contract will be made to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder per group. To be considered for award, the bidder shall offer prices for all items and years listed in each group. The County will then select the bidder whose offer represents the lowest grand total per group, and who meet the minimum requirements listed below. If a bidder fails to submit an offer for all items within the group, its offer for that specific group may be rejected.


Southeastern Chiller failed to offer prices for all the chiller items and years in Group 37 of the solicitation.

## DISCUSSION

In general, a bid may be rejected or disregarded if there is a material variance between the proposal and the advertisement. A minor variance, however, will not invalidate the proposal. See Robinson Elec. Co. v. Dade County, 417 So. 2d 1032, 1034 (Fla. 3d DCA 1982). The determination of whether a variance or irregularity is minor is fact specific and may differ from bid to bid. Florida courts have used a two part test to determine if a specific noncompliance in a bid would constitute a substantial and, thus, nonwaivable issue: (1) whether the effect of the waiver would be to deprive the County of the assurance that the contract would be entered into, performed and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) whether it would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a proposer in a

position of advantage over other proposers. See Glatstien v. City of Miami, 399 So. 2d 1005 (Fla. 3d DCA 1981).

Southeastern Chiller's failure to provide bid prices on certain items and years in Group 37 deprives the County of the assurance that the contract will be performed and guaranteed in accordance with the terms of the solicitation and thereby renders Southeastern Chiller's bid for Group 37 non-responsive. See Matter of: New Shawmut Timber Co., B-286881, 2001 CPD P 42, 2001 WL 185214, \*1 (Comp. Gen. Feb. 26, 2001) ("The failure to include a price for a line item evidences a bidder's intent not to be bound or obligated to perform that element of the requirement, and thus generally renders the bid nonresponsive."); Matter of: The Jorgensen Forge Corp., B-255426, 94-1 CPD P 157, 1994 WL 64911, \*2 (Comp. Gen. Feb. 28, 1994) ("Where, as here, an IFB provides that award will be made to the low aggregate bidder, a bid that fails to include a price for every item required by the IFB generally must be rejected as nonresponsive since the bidder would not be obligated to provide the item for which it has provided no price.").
