Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing

Contracts for the Human Resources Department

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in their discretion, the options-to-renew (OTRs) set forth in this item for the Human Resources Department. Ordinance No. 07-139 provides for committee review exemption.

The OTRs being considered by the Board in this item are described briefly below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Item 1 – Technical Training – Prequalification Pool: Seeks authority to exercise the sixth and seventh OTR terms to purchase technical application training for the Human Resources Department on behalf of all County departments in an estimated amount of \$900,000. Approval of this item will extend the prequalification pool contract until February 19, 2017.

Item 2 – Professional Training – Prequalification Pool: Seeks authority to exercise the sixth and seventh OTR terms to purchase computer software, diversity, management and web-based training for the Human Resources Department on behalf of all County departments in an estimated amount of \$776,000. Approval of this item will extend the prequalification pool contract until February 19, 2017.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Contract amounts and allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amounts/values will be expended by the Human Resources Department. Funding will be expended only if the department's budget can support the expenditures as approved in its annual budget adopted by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award. The Human Resources Department's contract manager is Andrew Mullings.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise the OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to solicit pricing, and award contracts, up to an aggregate contract amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. Additionally, the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee may add qualified vendors to the pool at any time during the contract term, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to exercise, at their discretion any cancellation and renewal provisions, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the pool contract.

Background

The contracts listed in this item require approval to exercise the OTRs.

Prior to exercising any OTR, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. This item only seeks the advanced delegated authority to exercise the OTRs if determined that it is in the best interest of the County.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract provides the County with the ability to obtain technical application training, as needed, for County staff. The Human Resources Department manages the contract on behalf of all County departments. Staff conducts spot market purchases on an as-needed or on a periodic basis to obtain pricing specific to the training engagement. This pool provides the County with flexibility and access to a wide range of technical application training ensuring open competition and awards are based on best value and lowest price.

The need to provide computer software training in technical applications has increased as new technology is continually implemented within the County. It is essential to provide technical application training to satisfy the training needs of County employees. Due to the ample spot market competition that this contract provides, it is recommended that only two (2) OTR periods be approved to ensure continuity of services.
