RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING SB 536, SB 998, HB 823, OR
SIMILAR LEGISLATION THAT WOULD PROHIBIT THE
SALE OF POWDERED ALCOHOL

WHEREAS, powdered alcohol, known by the brand name Palcohol, may soon be introduced to the market; and

WHEREAS, Palcohol is freeze-dried alcohol in powder form, packaged in small packets; and

WHEREAS, Palcohol has been advertised as a convenient method of alcohol consumption for outdoor enthusiasts and travelers because of the product's lightweight package; and

WHEREAS, the recommended use for Palcohol is to add the powdered substance to water; and

WHEREAS, some physicians and experts, however, warn about the risks of misuse and abuse of Palcohol due to consumers' lack of familiarity with the product's potency; and

WHEREAS, difficulties may also arise with regulating Palcohol, considering that the colorful packaging would likely appeal to kids and that the product can be snorted, easily smuggled into venues and put into drinks of unwilling consumers; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 536 ("SB 536") has been filed for consideration during the 2015 session of the Florida Legislature by Senator Anitere Flores (R – Miami); and

WHEREAS, SB 536 would prohibit the sale of distilled spirits in powdered form; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 998 (“SB 998”) has been filed for consideration during the 2015 session of the Florida Legislature by Senator Gwen Margolis (D – Miami); and

WHEREAS, companion House Bill 823 (“HB 823”) has been filed for consideration during the 2015 session of the Florida Legislature by Representative Lori Berman (D – Lantana); and

WHEREAS, SB 998 and HB 823 would:

- (1) prohibit the sale, offer for sale, purchase, use, offer for use, or possession of powdered alcohol;
- (2) impose penalties; and
- (3) provide an exemption for the use of powdered alcohol by specified entities for research purposes; and

WHEREAS, considering the myriad of potential dangers associated with powdered alcohol, this Board supports SB 536, SB 998, HB 823, or similar legislation that would prohibit the sale of powdered alcohol,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Supports SB 536, SB 998, HB 823, or similar legislation that would prohibit the sale of powdered alcohol.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, Senator Anitere Flores, Senator Gwen Margolis, Representative Lori Berman, and the Chair and remaining Members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the passage of the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2015 State Legislative Package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
