

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO (I) REVIEW AND AMEND THE COUNTY'S AFFORDABLE HOUSING GUIDELINES TO ESTABLISH A CAP ON THE NUMBER OF ADDITIONAL FUNDING APPLICATIONS THAT AN AGENCY MAY SUBMIT FOR DOCUMENTARY STAMP SURTAX FUNDS IF THE PROJECT HAS BEEN AWARDED GAP FUNDING FOR ITS FIRST APPLICATION, AND (II) REQUIRE THAT APPLICATIONS FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDING BE APPROVED FOR FUNDING ONLY UNDER EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County provides funding, including Documentary Stamp Surtax funds, for affordable housing activities throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, the County's need is great but its resources are limited, making the efficient and expedient use of these Documentary Stamp Surtax funds imperative; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to ensure that Documentary Stamp Surtax funds are used in a way that maximizes the amount of affordable housing provided to the residents of Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, in order to maximize the amount of affordable housing, it is necessary to effectively and efficiently fund affordable housing developments; and

WHEREAS, the effective and efficient use of affordable housing funds requires that funds be allocated to projects that are financially feasible and ready to begin construction within 30 days of closing on financing; and

WHEREAS, the County provides gap funding to affordable housing projects; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of that gap funding is to fill the financial gaps left after all other funding has been provided to an affordable housing project and not to be the primary source of funding for any affordable housing project; and

WHEREAS, the County depends upon affordable housing applicants to accurately and honestly state the amount of gap funding a project needs in order to make funding decisions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board directs the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to review and amend the County's affordable housing guidelines to: (1) establish a cap on the number of additional funding applications that an agency may submit for Documentary Stamp Surtax funds if the project has been awarded gap funding for its first application; and (2) require that applications for additional funding be funded only under extenuating circumstances.


