Subject: Resolution Ratifying Various Actions Related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the actions of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded projects identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

Consent Decree Project

Item 1 - Recommendation to Award: Design-Build Services for the Replacement/Rehabilitation of a 72-inch Sanitary Sewer Force Main along Northwest/Northeast 159th Street between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue. The item requests ratification of a contract award in the amount of \$16,746,672 with a contract completion date of May 31, 2016 to Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc.

Multi-Year Capital Plan Project

Item 2 - Recommendation to Award: Professional Engineering and Geological Services for Water, Wastewater and Reclaimed Water Planning Services. The item requests ratification of a non-exclusive professional services agreement in the amount of \$7,700,000 with a total contract term of three (3) years and one (1) two (2) year option-to-renew to Tetra Tech, Inc.

Scope

The commission district of the project locations are noted on Exhibit A. The capital projects awarded through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance have a Countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact and funding sources for each project in this item are detailed on Exhibit A and the other accompanying attachments.

Track Record/Monitoring

WASD's Deputy Director of Capital Improvements and Regulatory Compliance, Juan Carlos Arteaga, AIA, NCARB, will oversee the implementation of these projects.

Background

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services and accelerate the approval of WASD's: 1) Consent Decree projects, and 2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan's Capital Improvements Program, without the need for prior Board

approval but subject to ratification by the Board. The County entered into the Consent Decree in order to resolve a lawsuit that had been brought in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida (Case No. 1:12-cv-24400-FAM) based on violations caused by the County's deteriorating sewer system.

The accelerated approval process provided through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance reduces the time period to award a contract by approximately 60 days in order to assist WASD in meeting Consent Decree deliverables implementation deadlines and rehabilitation project deadlines. Under the terms of the Consent Decree, failure to meet stipulated implementation dates and project completion dates could result in daily penalties to the County ranging from \$1,000 - \$2,000 and \$500 - \$2,500, respectively.

****CONSENT DECREE****

Subject: Recommendation approving award of a Design-Build Contract to Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. for Design-Build Services for the Replacement/Rehabilitation of 72-inch Sanitary Sewer Force Main along Northwest/Northeast 159th Street between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue-Project No. DB14-WASD-01

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Mayor or Mayor's designee approve this recommendation to award a design-build contract to Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. for Design-Build Services for the Replacement/Rehabilitation of 72-inch Sanitary Sewer Force Main along Northwest/Northeast 159th Street between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue. The total compensation amount is \$16,746,672 with a contract completion date of May 31, 2016; Project No. DB14-WASD-01; Contract No. 15RMCFI001.

On January 21, 2015, the Negotiations Committee recommended that the County Mayor or Mayor's designee accelerate the approval of this contract award recommendation in order to ensure a Notice to Proceed is in place no later than February 2, 2015. In addition, the Negotiations Committee recommended that the Substantial Completion Date be extended from March 31, 2016 to April 30, 2016. The date of Final Completion shall remain May 31, 2016.

BACKGROUND:

On December 16, 2014, the Board of County Commissioners (Board), via Resolution No. R-1119-14, authorized the Mayor or Mayor's designee to contract for the emergency replacement/rehabilitation of the 72-inch sanitary sewer force main along Northwest/Northeast 159th Street between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue. Specifically, the Board authorized the Mayor or Mayor's designee to: 1) reject all proposals for Project No. DB14-WASD-01; 2) support Miami-Dade County's commitment to the United States Department of Justice for the Consent Decree and prevent an undue hardship to the health and safety of the community and the County; 3) waive competitive bids pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Charter, Section 2-10.4(8)(b)(i) of the Code, and Section 287.055(9)(c)(6) of the Florida Statutes; 4) request lump sum bids from the following three (3) short-listed firms under the Sanitary Sewer Request for Design-Build Services process: Insituform Technologies, Inc., Lanzo Construction Co., Florida, and Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc.; 5) authorize the Mayor or Mayor's designee to enter into a design-build contract with the lowest responsible bidder to address the emergency condition of the 72-inch sanitary sewer force main; 6) waive protest procedures under Section 2-8.4 of the Code of Miami-Dade County in

connection with the rejection of the previous competitive bids and any resulting award of the contract; and 7) provide for ratification of any resulting emergency design-build contract by the Board. Upon approval by the Mayor or Mayor's designee, this award will be subject to ratification at the next available Board meeting.

This project is part of the Consent Decree, which was entered on April 9, 2014 in the United States of America, State of Florida and State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection v. Miami-Dade County, Case No. 1:12-cv-24400-FAM. It is identified as Project No. 4.4 on Exhibit D-1 of Appendix D of the Consent Decree.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

The authority of the County Mayor or Mayor's designee to execute and implement the contract is consistent with those authorities granted under the Code of Miami-Dade County. The Contract will delegate authority to the County Mayor or Mayor's designee to terminate the Contract and resolve disputes. Additionally, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

PROJECT NAME:

Design-Build Services for the Replacement/Rehabilitation of 72-inch Sanitary Sewer Force Main along Northwest/Northeast 159th Street between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The County (through its Water and Sewer Department) must comply with the regulatory deadlines and milestones specified in Consent Decree, Case No. 1:12-cv-24400-FAM. This new Consent Decree was approved by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida on April 9, 2014 in order to resolve the lawsuit brought by the Department of Justice (on behalf of the United States Environmental Protection Agency), the State of Florida and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection against the County for violations of the Clean Water Act, the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit, and the Florida Air and Water Pollution Control Act. Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. shall be familiar with and acknowledges that it will comply with the requirements of the Consent Decree, which is available for review at WASD'S website at: <http://www.miamidade.gov/water/wastewater-improvement-projects.asp>.

Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. shall provide engineering, design, permitting, construction, testing and commissioning services for the implementation of the replacement/rehabilitation of the 72-inch sanitary sewer force main along Northwest/Northeast 159th Street between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue. The design and construction services rendered by the Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. shall result in a complete, functional, and operational piping project with a minimum of 80 years of design life. The Project shall consist of the following main elements:

1. Remove and salvage the existing 60-inch inline valves located at the intersection of Northwest 2nd Avenue and Northwest 159th Street. The salvaged valves will remain the property of the WASD.
2. Installation of two new 60-inch inline valves at the intersection of Northwest 6th Avenue and Northwest 159th Street and also at the intersection of North Miami Avenue and Northwest 159th Street. These valves will be procured by WASD forces.
3. Booster Pump Station 1310, located at Northwest 151st Street and Douglas Road, will be reconfigured or shut down to allow discharge towards the suction header of Booster Pump Station 300, located at Northwest 30th Avenue and Northwest 127th Street. Pump Station 300 will be evaluated to confirm ability to receive DESIGN-BUILDER'S proposed flow (based on the

- construction approach) and, if necessary, be reconfigured to receive the additional flow from Booster Pump Station 1310.
4. Install an 8-inch temporary bypass for the existing North Miami Beach 8-inch force main connection to the existing 72-inch force main, located at the intersection of Northwest 16th Court and Northwest 155th Terrace.
 5. Install an 8-inch temporary bypass for the existing City of North Miami 8-inch force main connection to the existing 72-inch force main located at the intersection of Northwest 2nd Avenue and Northwest 159th Street.
 6. Install a 16-inch temporary bypass for the existing WASD 16-inch force main connection to the existing 72-inch force main located at the intersection of North Miami Avenue and Northwest 159th Street.
 7. Approximately 15,260 linear feet of Class IV fully structural (to act as a separate pipe with the existing pipe acting as merely a right-of-way for the installation) continuous slip-lining with high density polyethylene application between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue. The preferred material for this slip-lining operation is a 63-inch fusible high density polyethylene pipe, Dimension Ratio (DR) 32.5, manufactured from a pipe resin which meets American Society for Testing Materials (ASTM) D 3350 "Standard Specification for Polyethylene Plastic Pipe and Fittings Material" with a minimum cell classification of 445574C, manufactured to the dimensions of ASTM F714 "Standard Specification for Polyethylene (PE) Plastic Pipe Standard Dimension Ratio Pressure Rated (S.D.R.-PR) Based on Outside Diameter" with a pressure rating between 60 pound per square inch (psi) to 65 psi.
 8. Approximately 1,800 linear feet open cut construction to install a 60-inch pipe to interconnect slip-lining operations between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 2nd Avenue.

Additionally, Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. shall design and construct all ancillary piping, tapping, temporary bypass and tie-in connections to facilitate successful construction and commissioning of the rehabilitated 72-inch sanitary sewer force main without interruption of service to the existing 72-inch sanitary sewer force main and its upstream and downstream pump stations, sewers and force mains.

Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. shall provide and pay for all labor, materials, tools, construction equipment and other ancillary facilities necessary for proper execution, testing, commissioning, and final restoration work required for functional and satisfactory delivery of the work. Any work and services which may be reasonably assumed as necessary to accomplish this objective shall be supplied by Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc.

The project location is in the area bounded by Northwest/Northeast 159th Street between Northwest 17th Avenue and Northeast 10th Avenue.

TRACK RECORD / MONITOR: SBD HISTORY OF VIOLATIONS:

None - Due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status and performance and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Design-Builder's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

EXPLANATION:

On May 2, 2014, a Request for Design-Build Services was issued under full and open competition. On June 6, 2014, the Clerk of the Board received five (5) proposals for the "Step 1: Evaluation of Qualifications" submittal.

STEP 1

At the Step 1 "Evaluation of Qualifications" meeting held on July 22, 2014, the Competitive Selection Committee reviewed and ranked the remaining three (3) proposals received on June 6, 2014. Two (2) firms were found non-compliant due to their failure to meet the minimum experience and qualifications requirements as stipulated in the Request for Design-Build Services and were eliminated from further evaluation by the Competitive Selection Committee.

The Competitive Selection Committee voted to shortlist the following three (3) firms: Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc.; Lanzo Construction Co.; and Insituform Technologies, Inc. to submit technical and price proposals for the "Step 2: Technical and Price Proposal Evaluation Meeting".

STEP 2

The Step 2 "Technical and Price Proposal" meeting (Oral Presentations) was held on September 25, 2014. The Competitive Selection Committee recommended to the County Mayor that it negotiate the design-build contract with the highest ranking firm, Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. As such, authorization to negotiate with Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. was approved on October 14, 2014.

At the first negotiations meeting held on October 22, 2014, it was discovered that Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. failed to include a water tightness requirement in the slip-lining alternate proposal that was approved by the Competitive Selection Committee. It was later revealed that during the review process of the submitted proposals, Lockwood, Andrews & Newnam, Inc., the Design Criteria Professional for this project, failed to identify the lack of water tightness in the Step 2 submittals for Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. and Lanzo Construction Co., Florida, the top two (2) ranked proposers. In addition, the Design Criteria Professional provided inaccurate information regarding the compliance of the Alternate proposals submitted by Insituform Technologies, Inc.

As a result of the irregularity and after further input from the Negotiations Committee, staff and the Design Criteria Professional consulted with the County Attorney's Office. The County Attorney's Office advised that the original solicitation document included the water tightness requirement. The Design Criteria Professional advised that the base proposal and accepted alternate proposals for the top two (2) ranked firms were in non-compliance with said water tightness requirements.

Therefore, on December 16, 2014, it was recommended and approved by the Board via Resolution R-1119-14 to "Reject All Proposals" and declare the Project an Emergency due to the pipe's aging condition and in order to avoid a catastrophic rupture in the surrounding community (Exhibit A).

As a result, the three (3) highest ranking firms selected by the Competitive Selection Committee from the earlier solicitation process were asked to submit a lump sum bid price to execute the work using the slip-lining method of rehabilitation for the Project. On December 23, 2014, Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. was found to be the lowest priced responsive bidder and is now being recommended for award (See tabulation below):

The Negotiation Committee was approved by the County Mayor on January 5, 2015. Negotiations commenced and successfully concluded with Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. on January 21, 2015.

Based on the Internal Services Department CIIIS database, Ric-Man Construction Florida, Inc. has five (5) evaluations with a three point nine (3.9) rating out of a possible total four (4.0) points.

RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or Mayor's designee approve the attached non-exclusive professional services agreement to Tetra Tech, Inc. for Professional Engineering and Geological Services for Water, Wastewater and Reclaimed Water Planning Services, Project No: E14-WASD-01, Agreement No: 14TTI001. The total compensation amount is \$7,700,000 with a total contract term of three (3) years and one (1) two (2) year option-to-renew.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

The County Mayor or Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Agreement. The Ordinance delegates authority to County Mayor or Mayor's designee to terminate the Agreement and resolve disputes. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Agreement to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

On July 30, 2014, a Notice to Professional Consultants was issued under full and open competition. On September 5, 2014, the Clerk of the Board received one (1) proposal in response to this solicitation. Section 3.3 of the Notice to Professional Consultants states the following: "In the event the County receives fewer than three (3) proposals, or fewer than three (3) proposals are determined to be responsive and responsible to perform the required services, the County may proceed with the number of proposal(s) received which are determined to be responsive and responsible, provided that the County has conducted an analysis of market availability for subject services and determined at its sole discretion that there is no further market availability or immediate interest to provide subject services." ISD, therefore, conducted an analysis of market availability on September 10, 2014 and determined that the County should move forward with the one (1) proposal received. ISD's determination was based on: (1) the preclusion language in the Notice to Professional Consultants which states that: "The firm selected will be excluded from future solicitations for design services for facilities identified as part of master planning activities completed under the Agreement. The participation preclusion will remain in effect for an indefinite period of time;" (2) the fact that no other firms submitted proposals; and (3) WASD's need to move forward with long-range facilities planning.

First-Tier

At the First-Tier "Evaluation of Qualifications" meeting held on November 13, 2014, the Competitive Selection Committee reviewed the one (1) proposal received from Tetra Tech, Inc. At this meeting, it was determined that Tetra Tech, Inc. met the minimum qualifications and demonstrated its relevant experience with the project as required by the Notice to Professional Consultants. The Competitive Selection Committee evaluated and ranked the firm. The Competitive Selection Committee by majority vote decided not to hold a Second-Tier (Oral Presentation) meeting and recommended Tetra Tech, Inc. to the County Mayor for approval to negotiate a contract.

The Negotiation Committee was approved by the County Mayor on December 8, 2014. On January 13, 2015, the Negotiation Committee met and concluded negotiations with Tetra Tech, Inc.

The Negotiation Committee also approved a First Task Service Order (attached as Exhibit A) for a total amount of \$44,474.05 for a six month period.

Based on the Internal Services Department's CIIS database, Tetra Tech, Inc. has one (1) evaluation with an average 3.8 rating out of a possible total 4.0 points.




