RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR
MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY
STUDY TO EXAMINE EQUIPPING MIAMI-DADE COUNTY
POLICE VEHICLES WITH DASHBOARD CAMERAS AND TO
PROVIDE A REPORT

WHEREAS, technology increasingly has been used as a mechanism for surveillance and observation both by law enforcement and private entities; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to ensure that the safest possible environment is provided to civilians and police officers; and

WHEREAS, on December 2, 2014, this Board passed Resolution No. R-1078-14, directing the Mayor or designee to conduct a study and prepare a report on the benefits and concerns associated with police officer body-worn cameras, specifically as they pertain to Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the benefits found by the Mayor's study of police officer body-worn cameras included increasing transparency and public confidence in the police, protecting civilians from police misconduct, and protecting police officers from false allegations of misconduct; and

WHEREAS, many of the benefits associated with police officer body-worn cameras may also be realized by police vehicle dashboard cameras; and

WHEREAS, dashboard cameras have been used by police departments throughout the country since the early 1990's as a method of capturing the real-time encounters between police and civilians; and

WHEREAS, dashboard cameras may be effective independently or in conjunction with police officer body-worn cameras, as they could capture footage that body-worn cameras may not record; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, the feasibility of equipping Miami-Dade County police vehicles with dashboard cameras should be examined,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the County Mayor or Mayor's designee to conduct a feasibility study to examine equipping Miami-Dade County police vehicles with dashboard cameras. At a minimum, the feasibility study shall include the (1) the benefits and concerns of police vehicle dashboard cameras; (2) a plan to equip police vehicles with dashboard cameras; (3) the anticipated cost to fully implement the plan; and (4) proposed funding sources for the implementation of the plan.

Section 2. Directs the County Mayor or Mayor's designee to provide a written report detailing the findings, results and recommendations of the feasibility study to this Board within 90 days of the effective date of this resolution and place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Barbara J. Jordan and the Co-Sponsor is Commissioner Audrey M. Edmonson. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
