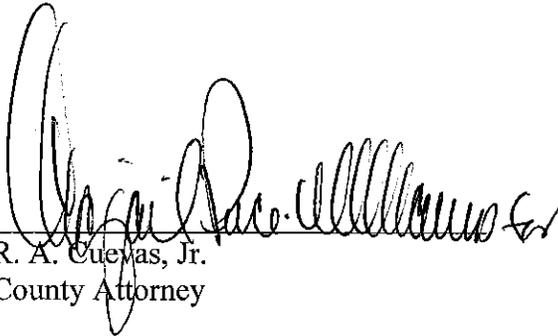

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S
DESIGNEE TO REPORT TO THE BOARD REGARDING THE
PAST, CURRENT, AND FUTURE MANAGEMENT OF
SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Miami-Dade County Charter, this Board is the governing board of all special taxing districts within Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works and Waste Management Department ("PWWM") currently manages over 1,000 active special taxing districts, which provide street lighting, security, and maintenance services to certain areas within Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, it appears that numerous special taxing districts require a significant rate increase in the coming fiscal year, which indicates that prior years' rates were insufficient to pay for the level of service being provided by these districts; and

WHEREAS, the PWWM staff administering the County's special taxing districts has recently been significantly restructured; and

WHEREAS, it is important for this Board, as the governing Board of these districts, to be kept apprised of the management of the County's special taxing districts,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the Mayor or Mayor's designee to prepare a status report on the past, current, and future management of the County's special taxing districts. This report shall, at a minimum, identify and describe the management issues which led to the current need to significantly increase rates for numerous districts. Additionally, this report shall identify lessons

learned from the examination of the prior management structure overseeing special taxing districts, and shall also include a proposed plan for the future management and oversight of special taxing districts, together with a detailed description of how such proposed plan will contribute to the more efficient and effective management of special taxing districts.

Section 2. Directs the Mayor or Mayor's designee to provide the report identified in Section 1 to this Board within 30 days and place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Chairman Jean Monestime. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
