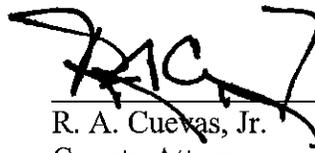

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INCLUDE THE UNDERLINE, THE BISCAYNE-EVERGLADES GREENWAY AND BLACK CREEK TRAIL IN THE FLORIDA SHARED-USE NONMOTORIZED TRAIL NETWORK PROGRAM, AS WELL AS FUNDING FOR THESE TRAILS IN THE 2016-2017 STATE FISCAL YEAR BUDGET

**WHEREAS**, during the recent 2015 Special Session A, the Florida Legislature enacted Chapter No. 2015-22B Laws of Florida (Senate Bill 2514A), which established the Florida Shared-Use Nonmotorized Trail (“SunTrail”) network and provided for the annually recurring allocation of \$25 million to fund SunTrail projects; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 30, 2015, pursuant to Resolution No. R-617-15, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference, this Board urged the Florida Department of Transportation to direct \$6.7 million of the \$25 million allocated for SunTrail funding to Miami-Dade County trail projects in the 2015-2016 state fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, under Senate Bill 2514A, the Florida Department of Transportation will also allocate at least \$25 million to fund SunTrail projects for the 2016-2017 state fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 1, 2015, pursuant to Resolution No. R-744-15, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference, this Board urged the Florida Department of Transportation to direct \$10 million of the at least \$25 million that will be allocated for SunTrail funding to the Ludlam Trail project in the 2016-2017 state fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board urges that \$3.7 million of the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year SunTrail funds be directed to additional Miami-Dade County trail projects in the following amounts: \$2 million for the Underline, \$1.5 million for the Biscayne-Everglades Greenway, and \$200,000 for the Black Creek Trail; and

**WHEREAS**, funding these projects will improve biking and walking safety and increase mobility and recreation alternatives for residents and visitors, enhance economic prosperity, enrich residents' quality of life, and reflect responsible environmental stewardship,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

**Section 1.** Urges the Florida Department of Transportation to include the following trails and respective funding in the Florida Shared-Use Nonmotorized Trail Network Program in the 2016-17 state fiscal year budget: \$2 million for the Underline, \$1.5 million for the Biscayne-Everglades Greenway, and \$200,000 for the Black Creek Trail.

**Section 2.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the Governor, the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation, and the Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation.

**Section 3.** Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the issues and funding set forth herein and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2016 State Legislative Package to include this item.

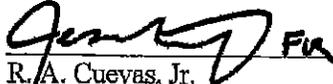

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INCLUDE THE UNDERLINE, THE LUDLAM TRAIL, THE BISCAYNE-EVERGLADES GREENWAY AND BLACK CREEK TRAIL IN THE FLORIDA SHARED-USE NONMOTORIZED TRAIL NETWORK PROGRAM, AS WELL AS FUNDING FOR THESE TRAILS IN THE 2015-16 STATE FISCAL YEAR BUDGET

**WHEREAS**, during the recent 2015 Special Session A, the Florida Legislature enacted Chapter No. 2015-22B Laws of Florida (Senate Bill 2514-A), which established the Florida Shared-Use Nonmotorized Trail ("SunTrail") network and provided for the annually recurring allocation of \$25 million to fund SunTrail projects; and

**WHEREAS**, the SunTrail network provides nonmotorized transportation opportunities for bicyclists and pedestrians statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, Florida Governor Rick Scott vetoed all of Miami-Dade County's trail projects in the fiscal year 2015-16 state budget; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board urges that \$6.7 million of the \$25 million SunTrail fund be directed to Miami-Dade County trail projects in the 2015-16 fiscal year in the following amounts: \$2 million for the Underline, \$3 million for the Ludlam Trail, \$1.5 million for the Biscayne-Everglades Greenway, and \$200,000 for the Black Creek Trail; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2008 Miami-Dade County's Parks and Open Space System Master Plan (OSMP) was approved by the Board of County Commissioners by Resolution No. R-171-08; and

**WHEREAS**, the vision of the OSMP includes Great Parks, Great Public Spaces, Great Natural and Cultural places, Great Streets, and a Great Network of Connected Greenway Trails and Water Trails; and

**WHEREAS**, the Miami-Dade trail network consists of nonmotorized trails which allow bicyclists and pedestrians to access a variety of origins and destinations with limited exposure to motorized vehicles, and which connect or it is anticipated will be connected to the SunTrail network; and

**WHEREAS**, the Miami-Dade trail network includes multiuse trails that by virtue of design, location, extent of connectivity or potential connectivity and allowable uses, provides nonmotorized transportation opportunities for bicyclists and pedestrians to communities, conservation areas, parks, beaches, and other natural or cultural attractions for a variety of travel purposes including work, school, shopping and other personal business, as well as social, recreational and personal fitness purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Miami-Dade County trail network seeks to connect communities, improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, provide an accessible space for exercise, attract development along the trail's path, and generate a positive economic impact; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board has long supported projects geared towards enhancing the livelihood of Miami-Dade County residents while improving the environmental footprint and economic impact of our County; and

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade is one of the most dangerous places to walk and bike in the country—the fourth most dangerous in the country for pedestrians and the most dangerous place in the state for bicyclists.

**WHEREAS**, funding of these projects will improve biking and walking safety and increase mobility and recreation alternatives for residents and visitors, enhance economic prosperity, enrich residents' quality of life, and reflect responsible environmental stewardship,

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**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that this Board:

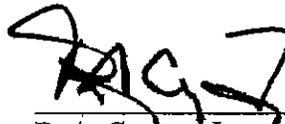

**WHEREAS**, on June 20, 2015, pursuant to Resolution No. R-617-15, a copy of which is attached and incorporated by reference, this Board urged the Florida Department of Transportation to direct \$6.7 million of the \$25 million allocated for SunTrail funding to Miami-Dade County trail projects in the 2015-2016 state fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, under Senate Bill 2514A, the Florida Department of Transportation will also allocate at least \$25 million to fund SunTrail projects for the 2016-2017 state fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the Ludlum Trail is a 6.2-mile linear track of land stretching from Miami International Airport at its northern terminus to Downtown Kendall at its southernmost point; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has determined that the trail can connect more than 32,000 people to five greenways, five schools, four parks, and two transit hubs; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has determined that the trail can provide a safe passageway for cyclists and pedestrians, including 3,700 students, to travel to schools, work, and shopping locations; and

**WHEREAS**, the County also has determined that the trail may eliminate 860,000 vehicle trips annually from Miami-Dade County streets; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has determined that the trail can provide approximately 60 acres of green space, connections to four existing parks, reduce carbon dioxide emissions by nearly 10,000 tons over 25 years, increase local property values, and create positive economic impact of more than \$540 million over a 25-year period; and

**WHEREAS**, funding the Ludlam Trail project will improve biking and walking safety and increase mobility and recreation alternatives for residents and visitors, enhance economic prosperity, enrich residents' quality of life, and reflect responsible environmental stewardship; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board urges that \$10 million of the at least \$25 million that will be allocated for SunTrail funding in the 2016-2017 state fiscal year be directed to the Ludlam Trail project,
