

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR THE MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO PERFORM A STUDY REGARDING LOW-SPEED VEHICLES CURRENTLY OPERATING IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY AND PREPARE A REPORT WITHIN 90 DAYS REGARDING, AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE USE OF SUCH VEHICLES ON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, THE ADEQUACY OF CURRENT STATE AND FEDERAL LAWS REGULATING LOW-SPEED VEHICLES AND THE NEED, IF ANY, FOR FURTHER REGULATION BY MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

**WHEREAS**, in recent years a number of low-speed vehicle operators, commonly referred to as "free-ride" operators, have been operating in Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, these "free-ride" operators generally transport the public short distances in electric vehicles and claim to generate their revenues through advertising; and

**WHEREAS**, these "free-ride" operators are most visible in downtown Miami and Miami Beach; and

**WHEREAS**, current state law imposes restrictions on the operation of low-speed vehicles; and

**WHEREAS**, low-speed vehicles are also subject to federal regulations promulgated by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board believes that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Miami-Dade County for the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to perform a study of low-speed vehicles operating in the County and prepare a report regarding among other things, the need, if any, for further regulation by the County,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that the Board directs the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to perform a study regarding, among other things: (1) the use of low-speed vehicles on the public streets in Miami-Dade County; (2) the number of low-speed vehicles currently transporting members of the public; (3) the type of low-speed vehicles offering transportation to members of the public; (4) the compensation, if any, paid by passengers of low-speed vehicles; (5) the locations in Miami-Dade County where low-speed vehicles frequent; (6) a description of low-speed vehicles operating on the public streets in Miami-Dade County including, but not limited to, the maximum speed of such vehicles; (7) an analysis of current state and federal laws regulating low-speed vehicles; (8) an assessment of the adequacy of current state and federal laws regulating low-speed vehicles; and (9) the need, if any, for further regulation by Miami-Dade County. The Mayor or the Mayor's designee shall prepare a report within 90 days of the effective date of this resolution and shall place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Vice Chairman Esteban L. Bovo, Jr. It was offered by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
