## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD Acceleration Ordinance) for capital projects and related goods and services identified below and in Exhibit A, as attached.

## **Consent Decree and Multi-Year Capital Plan Projects**

Item 1 is a Recommendation for Approval to Establish an Open Pre-Qualification Pool for Protective Coating Services. This item requests ratification of a contract award in the amount of \$48,000,000.00, with a total contract term of eight (8) years to Construction Affairs, Inc., Poole & Kent Company of Florida, and Southland Painting Corp. More firms can be added to this pool as they meet the minimum requirements identified in the solicitation.

## **Scope**

The Commission districts of the project locations are noted on Exhibit A. The goods and services contracts awarded through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

## **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The fiscal impact and funding source for this item are detailed on Exhibit A and the other accompanying attachments.

## **Track Record/Monitoring**

WASD's Deputy Director, Hardeep Anand, will oversee the implementation of this project.

## **Background**

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD's: 1) Consent Decree projects, and 2) projects identified in WASD's Multi-Year Capital Plan's Capital Improvements Program, subject to ratification by the Board.



Subject: Recommendation for Approval to Establish a Pre-Qualification Pool: Protective Coating Services

**RECOMMENDATION**

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance as seen in Section 2-8.2.12 of the County Code, it is recommended that the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee approve the establishment of a pre-qualification pool under *Request to Qualify No. RTQ-00103, Protective Coating Services*. In accordance with the Acceleration Ordinance, the establishment of this pool is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) at the Board's next available meeting. The pool will be used, as needed, by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department to obtain protective coating services required for the maintenance and rehabilitation of water and wastewater pipelines and tanks.

**CONTRACT NUMBER:** RTQ-00103

**CONTRACT TITLE:** Protective Coating Services Pre-qualification

**TERM:** Eight (8) years

**METHOD OF AWARD:** To all responsive and responsible vendors who met the pre-qualification requirements as specified in the solicitation for participation in future spot market competitions. Additional qualified vendors may be added at any time during the pool term subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board.

**PREVIOUS CONTRACT NUMBER, AMOUNT AND TERM:** None

**CONTRACT AMOUNT:** \$48,000,000 for eight (8) years

**BACKGROUND**

A Request to Qualify (RTQ) was issued under full and open competition to establish a pre-qualification pool to purchase protective coating services for Water and Sewer Department infrastructure. This includes sewage and water plant structures, tanks, trains, clarifiers, contact basins, digesters and containment units. The protective coating (typically epoxy) functions as corrosion control. Specifications describing the required work will be supplied to the pre-qualified vendors at the time of spot market competition for each project. The work to be performed may include abrasive blasting, fast set concrete restoration, and the application of high performance epoxy mortar protective coatings in a variety of settings, including confined spaces at various water and wastewater treatment plants.
