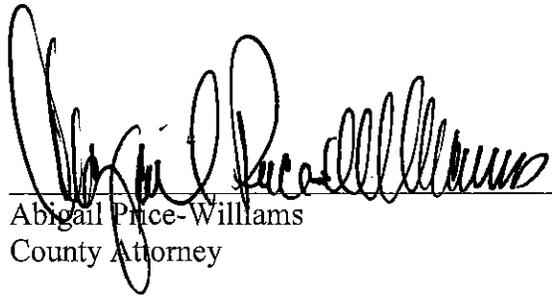

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING THAT PORTION OF NW
25TH AVENUE FROM NW 62ND STREET TO NW 66TH
STREET AS "WILLIAM 'BILL' BRADLEY STREET"

WHEREAS, William Bradley was born on May 10, 1928 in Rains, South Carolina and worked on the tobacco farms before moving to Haines City, Florida; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Bradley served in the United States Army for two years where he specialized as an electronic technician; and

WHEREAS, in 1957, Mr. Bradley moved to Miami, Florida and later became an entrepreneur; and

WHEREAS, in 1961, Mr. Bradley purchased and managed Pastime Bar; and

WHEREAS, in 1971, Mr. Bradley founded Pastime Restaurant located at 2469 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd., in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Bradley also owned Mitchell's Coin Laundry located at 6200 NW 24 Avenue, in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Bradley hired many members of the community, which made a positive economic impact on the area; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Bradley collaborated with local teachers to provide part-time employment to the youth in the neighborhood, many of whom went on to successful full time careers; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2013, Mr. Bradley passed away at the age of 85; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of Mr. Bradley and his contributions to the community by codesignating that portion of NW 25th Avenue from NW 62nd Street to NW 66th Street as “William ‘Bill’ Bradley Street”; and

WHEREAS, that portion of NW 25th Avenue from NW 62nd Street to NW 66th Street is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 3,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates that portion of NW 25th Avenue from NW 62nd Street to NW 66th Street as “William ‘Bill’ Bradley Street”.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade County Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Audrey M. Edmonson. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
