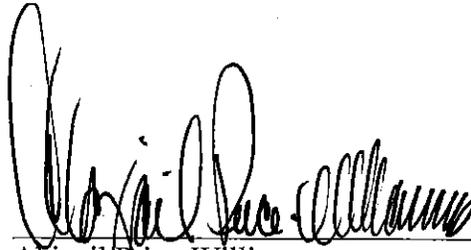

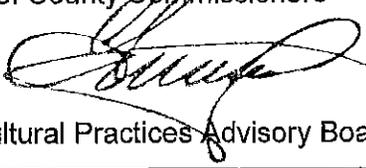

Subject: Appointment of Agricultural Practices Advisory Board Member

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) appoint Arturo Lopez to be the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board's Farm Labor Representative as recommended by the Coalition of Florida Farmworker Organizations, Inc.

Scope

The Agricultural Practices Advisory Board has a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

Track Record/Monitor

Mark Woerner, Chief of the Planning Division in the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, monitors the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board.

Background

The Agricultural Practices Advisory Board consists of 13 members representing a variety of agricultural industries. In the event of a vacancy on the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board, at least one (1) nominee must be submitted to the Board by the appropriate organization in accordance with Section 2-933 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code). The Board considers the nominee(s) and appoints the successor pursuant to Section 2-935 of the Code.

On October 27, 2015, the Board of Directors of the Coalition of Florida Farmworker Organizations, Inc. nominated Mr. Arturo Lopez to be the Farm Labor Representative to replace Advisory Board Member Robert Thompson, who passed away in August 2015. For the Board's reference, attached is Mr. Arturo Lopez's resume and the minutes of the meeting at which he was selected.

Mr. Lopez is currently the Executive Director of the Coalition of Florida Farmworker Organizations, a position he has held since 1985, and is responsible for the solicitation, negotiation, compliance, and monitoring of agency contracts and grants. From 1993 to 1998, Mr. Lopez was a member of the State of Florida Governor's Advisory Council on Farmworker Affairs. Mr. Lopez worked for the Illinois Migrant Council from 1969 to 1985, and served as its Executive Director from 1977 to 1985. Mr. Lopez served in the US Air Force and attended Northern Michigan University and Western New Mexico University.

The term of this appointment begins upon the effective date of this approval and ends four (4) years from such date.

INTRODUCTIONS:

Pedro Narezo informed the members of the purpose for the Executive Committee meeting which was 1) to appoint a member to represent COFFO on the Miami Dade County Agricultural Practices Advisory Council and 2) appoint a Bylaws committee to review and respond to the monitoring recommendations.

ESTABLISHING A QUORUM:

Having determined that there was a quorum, the Vice Chairperson called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to accept the agenda.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

The motion to accept the agenda was made by Victor Larger, seconded by Sinclair Williams, motion passed.

The Chairperson asked the Executive Director to proceed with the agenda items.

The Executive Director informed the members that several years ago he had attended the Miami Dade County Agricultural Practices Advisory Council meeting and that after the meeting he had commented to, then, Commissioner Katy Sorenson why there was not a person representing farmworkers since they were detrimental to agriculture. She agreed and a few days later informed the Advisory Council that she was appointing the Coalition of Florida Farmworker Organizations (COFFO) to represent the interest of farmworkers on the Council.

The Executive Director informed the Committee that the first representative on the Council was Santiago Gonzalez, a COFFO staff member. When Santiago resigned due to illness, the Board appointed Fernando (Chappy) Pro Jr. and when Chappy retired, the Board appointed Bob Thompson who had been representing COFFO for the last 5 years.

The Executive Director attended the last Council meeting and informed the members of Bob's death. The members gave their condolences and he informed them that COFFO would be appointing a replacement. The appointee should be a resident of Miami Dade, which limited the selection to Beatriz Coronado, Joseph Dorsinvil (who said he could not attend the meetings because of his work schedule. The committee meets the 1st Wednesday of each month from 9:00 am to 11:00 pm) and the Executive Director.

The Chairperson commented that because of the history, known by the Executive Director, he should be the representative and opened it up for other recommendations. Victor Larger asked if Beatriz Coronado would be interested in being the representative. She responded by saying that she was new to her position and didn't feel comfortable in being the representative. Victor suggested that the Executive Director be the representative and that Beatriz attend the meetings with him. Beatriz commented that she may not be able to attend all the meetings but would attend some. The Executive Director suggested that he be the representative and that Beatriz Coronado could be the alternate and attend the meetings when possible. Victor Larger moved to accept the recommendation of the Executive Director, seconded by Sinclair Williams, motion passed.

The Executive Director said that the next item on the agenda was the formation of a Bylaws committee to review bylaws and DEO requirements and address the recommendations of the DEO. The Chairperson reviewed the membership and asked Victor Larger, Sinclair Williams and Beatriz if they would serve on the committee. All accepted the appointment.

The Chairman asked the Executive Director to cover what was expected of the committee. The Executive Director inform the members that DEO wanted a timeline on when the Board would review the Board Work Sheet, make changes if needed to the bylaws and have them reviewed by an attorney. The Executive Director reviewed the Draft timeline with the members and said that dates could be changed as needed. The Chairman asked for a motion to accept the Draft timeline. The motion was made by Sinclair Williams, seconded by Victor Larger, motion passed.

The Chairman asked if there were any other business and being none, adjourned the meeting.

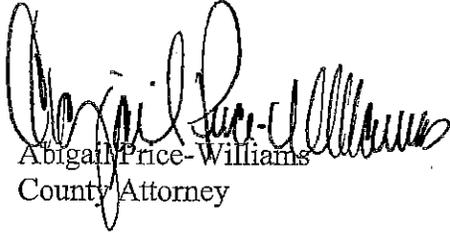

RESOLUTION TO APPOINT MR. ARTURO LOPEZ AS A
MEMBER OF THE AGRICULTURAL PRACTICES
ADVISORY BOARD FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, Sections 2-931 through 2-936 of the Code of Miami-Dade County provide for the creation, composition, terms, purpose and duties of the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-933 of the Code of Miami-Dade County specifically provides for the designated organizations to recommend at least one nominee; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-935 of the Code of Miami-Dade County directs that vacancies on the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board shall be filled by the Board of County Commissioners, and pursuant to Section 2-934, Agricultural Practices Advisory Board members serve for terms of four years each; and

WHEREAS, on October 27, 2015, the Coalition of Florida Farmworker Organizations, Inc. nominated Mr. Arturo Lopez to replace Mr. Robert Thompson as the Farm Labor Representative on the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board due to the death of Mr. Robert Thompson,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that Mr. Arturo Lopez is hereby appointed to the Farm Labor Representative seat of the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board for a term of four years from the effective date of this resolution.
