MDPD North Operations Division Juvenile Crime Information

The Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD), North Operations Division, has received positive feedback from the residents relating to this initiative to keep juveniles safe and off the streets during curfew hours.

The following are enforcement measures taken in order to reduce future delinquencies involving juveniles:

- Provided high visibility patrol in designated areas with the use of on-duty and off-duty officers; using Law Enforcement Trust Funds.
- Conducted curfew sweeps to prevent juvenile crimes in targeted areas where youth are known to congregate to commit crimes.
- Conducted a "Team Life Maze Meeting" at the Betty T. Ferguson Recreational Center, in collaboration with the Miami-Dade County (MDC) State Attorney's Office, personnel from MDPD, and other law enforcement agencies within MDC. The purpose of this meeting was to educate the youth on how to respond to law enforcement officers when making contact and to bridge the gap with youth, educators, and citizens within the community.
- Conducted a Father Power Event at Charles Drew Middle School. Fathers were encouraged to bring their child/children to school, as well as eat breakfast with their children to build bonds and communication.
- Conducted a toy giveaway at Northside District Station. Provided gifts to 125 youths within the District. Families were provided snacks and a presentation regarding proper behavior and the importance of a good education.
- Participated in a toy giveaway at Jessie Trice Health Clinic. Provided uniform presence and spoke with youth that had questions about law enforcement careers.
- Provided uniform presence during NFL Yet Center/Gwen Cherry Park Christmas Festival.
- Conducted "Shop with a Cop" detail. Ten youths were selected and given \$50 gift cards provided by Walmart to youth to shop for gifts for themselves and their family members.
- Participated in Evander Holyfield Toy Giveaway. Boxer Evander Holyfield provided a truckload of toys to youth within the community. The event was held at Charles Drew Middle School.
- Conducted proactive enforcement initiatives to help prevent and/or reduce violent crimes involving juveniles.

- Personnel also participated in activities in the community and at local schools, such as DARE, the Police Explorer Program and spending time in local parks.
- Crimes involving juveniles, as victims or subjects, are not concentrated within a specific area of MDC, but occur randomly throughout MDC. Therefore, it is too early to predict the impact of the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance on criminality, because of the many variables that impact crime.

MDPD South Operations Division Juvenile Crime Information

The South Operations Division's Neighborhood Resource Units (NRU) were tasked with the responsibility of curfew violation enforcement. The details were comprised of the following enforcement initiatives:

- **Traffic Enforcement** - On a weekly basis, officers conducted high visibility traffic enforcement details in areas frequented by youth, before and after school. Traffic details included enforcement and/or education initiatives such as speed zone enforcement and seat belt violations.
- **Truancy Sweeps** - Officers participated in monthly sweeps on dates established by Miami-Dade Schools Police Department, as well as conducted regular truancy sweeps on dates likely to have high truancy (i.e. national skip day) activity.
- **Route Safety** - Enhanced visibility and directed patrol were provided at bus stops/routes (Miami-Dade Transit and Schools Transportation stops) identified as problematic or having rowdy students.
- **Curfew Sweeps** - Officers conducted weekly curfew sweeps targeting specific areas where juvenile delinquency was prevalent.
- **Park and Talk** – During available patrol time, officers responded to schools in their area, parked in a visible location, and engaged in conversation with school staff, parents and students.
- **Roll Calls at Schools** - Area squads routinely conducted roll calls outside of schools in a visible location.
- **radKIDS**- The radKIDS® Personal Empowerment Safety Education Program is 10-hour family-centered safety education program that emphasizes essential decision-making skills, as well as physical resistance options to escape violence. Children from 5-12 years of age participate in the program with their adult caregivers to create a true safety partnership.

During curfew sweeps, NRU officers made a concerted effort to warn and detain juveniles in violation of the ordinance, but also informed their parents of their child's whereabouts in hopes of correcting any detrimental behavior. During this initiative, the NRU's have received positive feedback from residents and parents regarding this initiative to keep juveniles safe and off the street during curfew hours.
