RESOLUTION SUPPORTING CONGRESSWOMAN FREDERICA WILSON IN THE #BRINGBACKOURGIRLS MOVEMENT TO RESCUE THE OVER 200 NIGERIAN SCHOOLGIRLS KIDNAPPED AND HELD CAPTIVE BY THE TERRORIST GROUP, BOKO HARAM

WHEREAS, in April 2014, nearly 300 Nigerian schoolgirls were taken from their school in Chibok, Nigeria by the terrorist group, Boko Haram; and

WHEREAS, some girls have escaped since then, but almost 220 remain in captivity; and

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Frederica Wilson has been advocating for the girls' release and has become one of the most vocal and visible advocates in the United States on this issue; and

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Wilson helped pass two Congressional resolutions condemning the actions of Boko Haram and a Congressional bill funding intelligence to identify the leaders of the terrorist group; and

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Wilson tweets regularly using the phrases "#BringBackOurGirls" and "#JoinRepWilson", and has helped to organize Democratic and Republican colleagues in Congress to wear red on Wednesdays to bring attention to the issue; and

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Wilson has traveled to Nigeria multiple times to meet with the country's leaders about the rescue of the schoolgirls and to maintain international awareness about the issue; and
