Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the actions of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded projects identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

Multi-Year Capital Plan Project

Item 1 - Recommendation to Award: Professional Engineering Services for the Proposed Upgrades to the Miami-Dade Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant and its Appurtenant Facilities including Pump Stations 1 and 2. The item requests ratification of a non-exclusive professional services agreement in the total amount of \$8,800,000 with a total contract term of six (6) years and one (1) two-year option-to-renew to MWH Americas, Inc.

Consent Decree Project

Item 2 - Recommendation to Award: Construction of the Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant Chlorination Facilities – Consent Decree 2.17. The item requests ratification of a contract in the total amount of \$13,413,000 with a total contract term of 673 days to Poole & Kent Company of Florida.

Item 3 – Recommendation to Award: Construction of the Conversion of Sewage Pump Station 418 to Booster Station. The item requests ratification of a contract in the total amount of \$6,843,320 with a total contract term of 770 days to Metro Equipment Service, Inc.

Scope

The commission district of the project locations is noted on Exhibit A. The capital projects awarded through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact and funding source for these projects are detailed on Exhibit A and the other accompanying attachments.

Track Record/Monitoring

WASD's Deputy Director, Hardeep Anand, will oversee the implementation of these projects.

Background


On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD's (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan's Capital Improvements Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve the attached non-exclusive Professional Services Agreement to MWH Americas, Inc. for Professional Engineering Services for the Proposed Upgrades to the Miami-Dade Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant and its Appurtenant Facilities including Pump Stations 1 and 2 - Project No: E15-WASD-10; Contract No: 16MWH A009 (the "Agreement"). The total compensation amount is \$8,800,000, including a ten percent (10%) contingency fee, with a total contract term of six (6) years and one (1) two (2) year option-to-renew.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

In accordance with WASD Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Agreement. The Agreement delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to terminate the Agreement and resolve disputes. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Agreement to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

PROJECT NAME:

Proposed Upgrades to the Miami-Dade Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant and its Appurtenant Facilities including Pump Stations 1 and 2.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The scope of work consists of, but is not limited to, renewal and replacement projects for the plant's existing facilities including evaluation of existing equipment condition, capacity and useful life expectancy, as well as preparation of a prioritized rehabilitation or replacement schedule and related design services. In addition, engineering may include design services for selected plant upgrades and/or renovations. Engineering services during the design phase may include: performing preliminary site investigations; surveying; hydraulic modelling and analysis; coordinating with other utilities; preparing design reports; preparing drawings; and preparing contract specifications for structural, mechanical and electrical projects. Services during the

permitting and procurement phases may include obtaining dry-run permits and participating in obtaining final environmental and building permits. Construction management services are required to provide technical support during construction, including site inspections and attendance at meetings, reviewing shop drawings, processing payment requisitions, responding to information requests, reviewing claims and potential change orders, reviewing contract schedules and schedule of values, and reviewing as-built drawings. Project coordination services are anticipated to include: establishing a plan to implement projects; establishing and tracking project schedules, budgets and deadlines; preparing status reports; and attending meetings as requested.

Additional tasks are anticipated to include:

- a. Evaluating and formulating plans for improving or optimizing the treatment processes, including designing and conducting pilot studies.
- b. Conducting studies and providing recommendations related to improving plant operations and efficiency, including safety, staffing, energy conservation, security, biosolids management, corrosion control and asset management issues. This includes site specific staffing training and preparation of operation and maintenance manuals and operational practices manuals.
- c. Providing services for evaluation of regulatory requirements including preparation of compliance documents and reports.
- d. Providing technical support and assistance for computer system data integration with the programs and systems currently utilized. Providing assistance with selection and procurement of software and hardware enhancements.
- e. Providing other engineering services related to the upgrades at the wastewater treatment plant as required, including participation on a Technical Advisory Committee.

None - Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with ISD Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status and performance and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to MWH Americas, Inc.'s responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

EXPLANATION:

On August 10, 2015, a Notice to Professional Consultants was issued under full and open competition. On September 24, 2015, the Clerk of the Board received three (3) proposals in response to this solicitation. See attached Exhibit "D".

First-Tier

At the First-Tier "Evaluation of Qualifications" meeting held on January 15, 2016, the Competitive Selection Committee reviewed the three (3) proposals received from Stantec Consulting Services, Inc., MWH Americas and Hazen and Sawyer, P.C. The Competitive Selection Committee evaluated and ranked the firms and voted to short-list the three (3) firms. See attached Exhibit "E".

Second-Tier

The Second-Tier "Oral Presentations" meeting was held on February 1, 2016. Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. withdrew from further evaluation. The Competitive Selection Committee ranked MWH Americas, Inc. as the highest ranking firm (see attached Exhibit "E") and recommended to negotiate the contract with MWH Americas, Inc.

The Negotiation Committee was approved by the County Mayor's designee on March 03, 2016. On March 17, 2016, the Negotiation Committee met and concluded negotiations with MWH Americas, Inc.

Based on the ISD CIIS database, MWH Americas, Inc. has fifty (50) evaluations with an average 3.8 rating out of a possible total 4.0 points. See attached Exhibit "F".

The Prime Consultant shall provide a list of members of the proposed Design Team, identifying the overall Design Manager(s), and the team leaders for key design specialties (process-liquid stream treatment, process-biosolids treatment, civil, structural, mechanical, electrical and instrumentation) and the specific role each one of them will perform.

The Prime Consultant shall have successfully designed and constructed at least one (1) major new or upgraded wastewater treatment plant(s) of similar size and scope as in this solicitation, which is currently in operation and in which the Prime Consultant was the designer. For projects in which the Prime Consultant has served as the design consultant, the consultant shall provide the name and contact information for an Executive with the Utility who can confirm their role. The descriptions shall include the client (i.e., municipality or agency), key project staff, the project name, a summary of the work performed, the contract amount, the schedule (to include start and completion dates), the specific role of the Prime firm, the achievements (e.g., projects delivered on schedule, dollars saved, innovative designs implemented, new technology utilized), and a client reference and contact information. 





RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve this contract award recommendation to the Poole & Kent Company of Florida to construct the Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant (CDWWTP) Chlorination Facilities - Consent Decree 2.17, Contract No. S-890. The total compensation amount is \$13,413,000 with a total contract term of 673 days. This contract award recommendation was prepared by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD).

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Contract. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

PROJECT NAME:

CDWWTP Chlorination Facilities - Consent Decree 2.17

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The scope of work consists of furnishing all materials, labor and equipment necessary for the construction of Consent Decree Project 2.17, Chlorination Facilities at the Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant (CDWWTP), located on Virginia Key, 3989 Rickenbacker Causeway, Miami-Dade County, Florida 33149. The proposed facilities will replace existing chlorine gas facilities used for disinfection throughout the CDWWTP. The purpose of the facilities will be to provide on-site storage of concentrated liquid sodium hypochlorite and to provide the metering pumps to serve the necessary discharge points throughout the CDWWTP.

This project includes the construction of three (3) new buildings on auger cast pile foundation: two (2) buildings at Site 1 and one (1) at Site 2. The Site 1 bulk storage building will have the capacity to house up to eighteen (18) 20,000 gallon fiberglass-reinforced plastic (FRP) above ground tanks. It will be built on auger cast pile foundation and have walls to elevation 20.3 feet but without a roofing system. The Site 1 mechanical electrical building will be built on auger cast pile foundation, will be

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with ISD's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status, performance and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Poole & Kent Company of Florida's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

EXPLANATION:

On February 8th, 2016, the Department received and opened a single bid in response to an advertisement for a competitive solicitation for this construction contract. (See EXHIBIT "D", as attached.)

The single bid from the Poole & Kent Company of Florida was sent to the Internal Services Department's (ISD) Division of Small Business Development (SBD) for a compliance review of the Small Business Enterprise participation goals assigned to the construction contract. On February 17, 2016, SBD issued the results of its findings and confirmed that the Poole & Kent Company of Florida was in compliance with the contract measures established. A copy of SBD's Compliance Review along with associated Schedule of Intent Affidavits showing Poole & Kent Company of Florida's commitment to utilize the subcontractors selected to comply with the contract's measures are attached (See EXHIBIT "E", as attached).

Upon opening bids, WASD furnished the single bid submittal to MWH Americas, Inc., the project's Engineer-of-Record, for evaluation. In a February 22, 2016 correspondence to WASD, MWH Americas, Inc. determined the Poole & Kent Company of Florida to be qualified, found its bid responsive and recommended award (See EXHIBIT "F", as attached). Therefore, it is recommended that the project be awarded to the lowest responsible, responsive bidder, Poole & Kent Company of Florida, whose base bid is approximately 13.83% below the revised engineer's base estimate. The base construction estimate was increased from \$12,550,810 to \$13,461,140 via Addendum No. 14, issued on February 1, 2016, attached as EXHIBIT "G".

ISD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database contains 33 evaluations for Poole & Kent Company of Florida. The dates of the evaluations range from 2009 to 2015 with an average overall rating of 3.6 points out of a possible 4 points, which is indicative of above average performance (See EXHIBIT "H", as attached).







Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, It is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve this contract award recommendation to Metro Equipment Service, Inc. to construct the Conversion of Sewage Pump Station No. 418 to Booster Station, Contract No. S-758R. The total compensation amount is \$6,843,320 with a total contract term of 770 days. This contract award recommendation was prepared by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD).

Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (i.e. Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance) delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award Consent Decree Projects that meet certain conditions. Due diligence was conducted by WASD and ISD in accordance with ISD's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status and performance and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Metro Equipment Service, Inc.'s responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

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EXPLANATION:

On December 11, 2015, the Department received and opened six (6) bids (as noted below) in response to an advertisement for a competitive solicitation for this construction contract (See EXHIBIT "D", as attached).

The responses from the two (2) low bidders, Metro Equipment Service, Inc. and Comtech Engineering, were sent to the Internal Services Department's (ISD) Division of Small Business Development (SBD) for a compliance review of the Small Business Enterprise participation goals assigned to the construction contract. On December 14, 2015, SBD issued the results of its findings and confirmed that both low bidders were in compliance with the contract measures established.

The Department recommends that the project be awarded to the lowest, responsible bidder, Metro Equipment Service, Inc., whose base contract amount is 14.99% above the Engineer's base estimate. Due to the notable difference between the low bidder's base contract amount and the Engineer's base estimate, WASD staff performed a detailed review of the Engineer's base estimate which revealed that the estimate accounted for one (1) 1,500 kilowatt diesel generator when the advertised project scope of work requires furnishing and installing two (2) 1,500 kilowatt diesel generators. After accounting for this oversight, Metro Equipment Service, Inc.'s base contract amount is only 0.20 percent above the revised Engineer's base estimate of \$5,752,577 (See EXHIBIT "E"). A copy of SBD's Compliance Review and an executed Schedule of Intent Affidavit showing Metro Equipment Service, Inc.'s commitment to utilize the subcontractors selected to comply with the contract's measures are attached (See EXHIBIT "F").

ISD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database contains 40 evaluations, attached as EXHIBIT "G", for Metro Equipment Service, Inc. The dates of the evaluations range from 2007 to 2015 with an average overall rating of 3.5 points out of a possible 4 points, which is indicative of above average performance.

The Contract, Collusion Affidavit and the Firm's Responsibility Affidavit (also called "Combined Affidavit") executed by Metro Equipment Service, Inc. are attached as EXHIBIT "H", EXHIBIT "I" and Exhibit "J", respectively.

This project is one (1) in a series of projects required to comply with the County's current Consent Decree, which was approved by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida on April 9, 2014 in Case No. 1:12-cv-24400-FAM. Under this Consent Decree, the repair, rehabilitation and upgrade of the County's wastewater system continues to be a regulatory priority.


County Pump Station No. 418 is located at 3330 West 76th Street in the City of Hialeah. For over 15 years, the station has been experiencing high operating pressures mostly due to influent piping originating from three (3) different sources: a 18-inch force main from the City of Hialeah Gardens, a 24-inch force main from the City of Hialeah, and a local gravity system in the City of Hialeah. Some relief was provided when the City of Hialeah constructed and placed into service a new pump station adjacent to Pump Station No. 418, which re-directed flows from the 24-inch force main. Flows from the portion of the local gravity system to the east of West 32nd Avenue will also be re-directed to the new pump station in the City of Hialeah in the near future. Nonetheless, County Pump Station No. 418 has reached the end of its useful life, and a booster station is needed to manage and relieve the station's current operating pressures. The purpose of this project is to convert County Pump Station No. 418 to a booster station that will facilitate the routing of flows to the North District Wastewater Treatment Plant.




