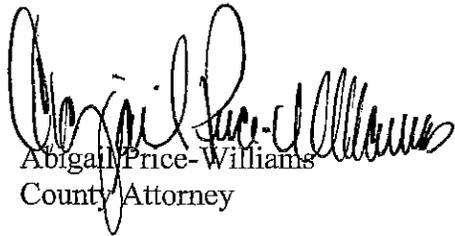

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE HUMAN EXPLOITATION RESCUE OPERATIVE CHILD-RESCUE CORPS (“HERO CORPS”); DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR’S DESIGNEE, IN COORDINATION WITH THE OFFICE OF INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS, TO TAKE STEPS TO CREATE A PARTNERSHIP WITH HERO CORPS TO HELP CREATE EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR HERO CORPS GRADUATES IN THE LAW ENFORCEMENT, GOVERNMENT, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Internet has facilitated an explosion of trafficking in video and images of child sexual abuse and exploitation, more generally referred to as child pornography; and

WHEREAS, to help find and stop child predators and also locate and rescue child victims, the Human Exploitation Rescue Operative Child-Rescue Corps (“HERO Corps”) was created as a program to transition wounded, ill or injured U.S. military veterans (and transitioning service members) into new law enforcement careers as elite, highly trained counter-child-exploitation professionals; and

WHEREAS, the program was developed and is operated by the National Association to Protect Children (PROTECT), U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and the U.S. Special Operations Command (SOCOM), and is therefore a unique partnership of government, military and nonprofit supported and made possible by generous foundations, corporations and individuals in the private sector; and

WHEREAS, each HERO Corps class undergoes an 11-week intensive training course in computers and digital forensics, followed by a 10-month, unpaid law enforcement internship as a computer forensics analyst at a Homeland Security Investigations field office; and

WHEREAS, following their completion of the program, many HERO Corps graduates are hired in federal law enforcement, although employment is not guaranteed; and

WHEREAS, additionally, many state and local law enforcement agencies, as well as some other federal agencies, have expressed a strong desire to hire HERO Corps graduates as the demand for experienced specialists with digital forensic training in law enforcement continues to grow; and

WHEREAS, HERO Corps is an exemplary and effective program not only for combatting child sexual exploitation and rescuing children in danger, but also for helping wounded military veterans transition into non-combat yet highly specialized law enforcement careers; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to express its support for HERO Corps and also direct the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, in coordination with the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs, to take steps to create a partnership with HERO Corps to help create employment opportunities for HERO Corps graduates in the law enforcement, government, public and private sectors in Miami-Dade County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Approves and incorporates the foregoing recitals in this Resolution.

Section 2. Supports the HERO Corps and its mission to combat child sexual exploitation by transitioning wounded military veterans into elite, highly trained counter-child-exploitation professionals.

Section 3.
