



RESOLUTION NAMING A HOSPITAL TOWER TO BE
CONSTRUCTED AT THE JACKSON WEST CAMPUS IN
HONOR OF JOSÉ MILTON

WHEREAS, as part of its mission to serve the citizens of Miami-Dade County, the Public Health Trust seeks to develop a 100-bed acute care hospital, a medical office building, parking garage and support system in western Miami-Dade County to be known as “Jackson West”; and

WHEREAS, the José Milton Foundation will donate \$10 million to support facilities and programs at the new Jackson West campus; and

WHEREAS, the generous donation will be made to the Jackson Health Foundation, whose primary mission is to support the Jackson Health System; and

WHEREAS, on August 25, 2016, the Board of Trustees of the Public Health Trust adopted the attached resolution number PHT 8/16-040 directing the President of the Public Health Trust to pursue approval from this Board of the naming of the new hospital tower at the Jackson West campus; and

WHEREAS, for the significant and generous donation to support facilities and programs at the new Jackson West campus, this Board desires to name the hospital tower to be constructed at the Jackson West campus in honor of José Milton; and

WHEREAS, Rule 9.02 of the Board’s Rules of Procedure provides that resolutions regarding proposed naming, renaming or codesignation of Miami-Dade County facilities or property shall be sponsored by the district commissioner where the facility or property is located; and

WHEREAS, the facility to be named will be located in County Commission District 12,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated in this resolution and are approved.

Section 2. Finds that the José Milton Foundation has generously donated a significant portion of the cost of a new hospital tower to be constructed on the Jackson West campus.

Section 3. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, authorizes the Public Health Trust to name the hospital tower to be constructed at the Jackson West campus in honor of José Milton.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

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

RE: Naming of a Tower at Jackson West Campus

Recommendation

Staff requests authorization to seek approval from the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners to name a tower at the Jackson West Campus for José Milton.

Scope

The proposed name will apply to a tower to be built at the new Jackson West medical facility, located at 7800 Northwest 29th Street, in the City of Doral.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

There is a positive fiscal impact. The José Milton Foundation will donate \$10 million to support facilities and programs at the new Jackson West campus.

Track Record/Monitor

The facility will be overseen by Aristides Pallin, vice president of Jackson West. The process of seeking approval from the Board of County Commissioners will be overseen by Esther Caravia-Abolila, chief of staff to the Public Health Trust President and Chief Executive Officer Carlos A. Migoya. The implementation of the new name in public materials will be overseen by Matthew Pinzur, associate vice president for communications and outreach.

Background

The José Milton Foundation has made a \$10 million gift commitment to the Jackson Health Foundation in support of programs and facilities at the Jackson West Campus. In recognition of this gift, Jackson Health System intends to name a tower at the Jackson West Campus in honor of the Milton family patriarch, local architect and developer, José Milton.
