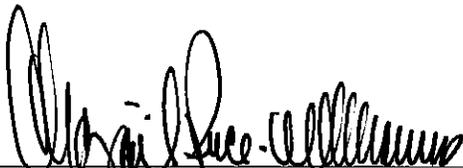

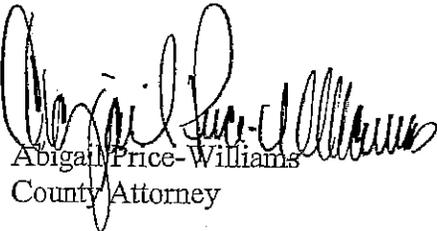

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S
DESIGNEE TO PREPARE A FEASIBILITY STUDY
REGARDING THE CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF A
TRASH AND RECYCLING CENTER IN COUNTY
COMMISSION DISTRICT 11

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County operates 13 Trash and Recycling Centers ("TRCs"), which provide residents a do-it-yourself disposal option for residential waste fee customers who reside in unincorporated Miami-Dade County and the cities of Aventura, Cutler Bay, Doral, Miami Gardens, Miami Lakes, Palmetto Bay, Pinecrest, and Sunny Isles Beach; and

WHEREAS, there are no TRCs located in County Commission District 11 or west of the Turnpike; and

WHEREAS, illegal dumping of household and bulky waste along public streets and right-of-ways is a serious and continual problem in District 11; and

WHEREAS, the lack of TRCs in District 11 contributes to this problem as many residents do not have a do-it-yourself option to dispose of large volumes of waste and recycling items; and

WHEREAS, a TRC within District 11 would likely alleviate this problem and reduce the burden on other County resources currently used to remove household and bulky waste from public roads and right-of-ways in District 11; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like the Mayor or Mayor's designee to study the feasibility of building and operating a TRC in District 11,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the Mayor or Mayor's designee to prepare a feasibility study regarding the construction and operation of a Trash and Recycling Center in County Commission District 11. The study shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) potential sites for the Trash and Recycling Center, including vacant land at or near the Miami Executive Airport;
- (b) estimated fiscal impact of the Trash and Recycling Center; and
- (c) potential funding sources for building and operating the Trash and Recycling Center.

Section 2. Directs the Mayor or Mayor's designee to provide a report of the feasibility study to this Board and place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65 within 90 days of the effective date of this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Juan C. Zapata. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
