

RESOLUTION COMMENDING WAL-MART STORES, INC.
AND EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR ITS "GREENLIGHT A
VET" PROJECT

WHEREAS, there is a substantial veteran population in Miami-Dade County, estimated by the United States Census Bureau at approximately 60,168 for the years 2009 to 2013; and

WHEREAS, military veterans often encounter difficulties in transitioning into civilian life, as noted in a 2011 study by the Pew Research Center showing that of 1,853 surveyed veterans, 27 percent of all veterans said transition into civilian life was difficult, which figure rose to 44 percent for veterans who served in the ten years following the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks; and

WHEREAS, in the spirit of helping veterans with their transition into civilian life, Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. has established the "Greenlight A Vet" campaign, which is designed to create a visible show of support for veterans; and

WHEREAS, through this program, that support is communicated by the illumination of residential porches with green lights, which are kept glowing and made a part of a social media campaign through tracking on a map and the use of the "hashtag" #greenlightavet; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to commend Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. on and express support for its "Greenlight A Vet" initiative,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Commends Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. on and expresses its support for Wal-Mart Stores, Inc.'s "Greenlight A Vet" initiative.


