

RESOLUTION WAIVING BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF MEMBERS PRESENT TERM LIMIT RESTRICTIONS FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY ASIAN AMERICAN ADVISORY BOARD MEMBER SHABBIR MOTORWALA; AND REAPPOINTING SHABBIR MOTORWALA TO THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY ASIAN AMERICAN ADVISORY BOARD FOR AN ADDITIONAL TERM

WHEREAS, on July 22, 1997, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") adopted Ordinance No. 97-128, establishing the Miami-Dade County Asian American Advisory Board ("Asian American Advisory Board"), which is codified in Article LXXIX of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, members of the Asian American Advisory Board have knowledge of and interest in the county's Asian community and advises this Board on such matters; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-1087 of the Code, membership of the Asian American Advisory Board shall consist of 26 members, with each County Commissioner appointing two members; and

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2010, the Board enacted Ordinance No. 10-06, amending Chapter 2, Section 2-11-38.2 of the Code to permit the waiver of term limits for members of County boards; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 2-11.38.2 and 2-1087 of the Code, no board member shall serve more than eight consecutive years on a board unless this Board, by a two-thirds vote of members present, votes to waive the eight year term limit; and

WHEREAS, Shabbir Motorwala was first appointed to the Asian American Advisory Board on April 23, 2002, and has served as a dutiful member for nearly 15 years; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure on the Asian American Advisory Board, Mr. Motorwala served as its 1st Vice Chair; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Motorwala currently serves as a 20th Anniversary Gala Dinner Committee member; and

WHEREAS, a copy of Mr. Motorwala's resume is attached hereto as Attachment A; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Motorwala has demonstrated exceptional dedication and service to the Asian American Advisory Board and this Board desires to waive the applicable term limits and reappoint Mr. Motorwala to serve an additional term on the Asian American Advisory Board,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Ratifies and adopts the matters set forth in the foregoing recitals.

Section 2. By a two-thirds vote of the members present, pursuant to Sections 2-11.38.2 and 2-1087 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, waives term limit restrictions applicable to Asian American Advisory Board member Shabbir Motorwala, and reappoints Shabbir Motorwala to serve as a member of the Asian American Advisory Board for another term of office expiring when the appointing commissioner's term expires, the appointing commissioner leaves office or as otherwise set forth in Article LXXIX of the Code.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Barbara J. Jordan. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


