	DESOLUTION CODESIGNATING TH	JE NW 0500 BLOCK OF

WHEREAS, José Milton was the Cuban-American founder and patriarch of J. Milton Associates, a large family-run real-estate enterprise based in Coral Gables; and

FONTAINEBLEAU BOULEVARD AS "JOSÉ MILTON WAY"

WHEREAS, the son of Lebanese parents who had emigrated to Cuba in the 1920s, Milton worked with his father in the building business in Cuba before leaving the island for Miami in 1963; and

WHEREAS, an architect by training, Milton began his real estate development career in Miami-Dade County by building affordable, garden-style apartments, before later focusing on developing more upscale residences such as luxury oceanfront condominiums; and

WHEREAS, over the decades, J. Milton Associates developed more than 50,000 rental units and more than \$2 billion in condominiums, and today the company manages a portfolio of over 15,000 rental apartments in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties; and

WHEREAS, Milton's company played a key role in the transformation of the Sunny Isles Beach skyline, working on such high-rise projects as Sands Pointe, Pinnacle, King David, Sayan and St. Tropez; and

WHEREAS, Milton was also a tireless champion of helping to fund public parks throughout Miami-Dade County, including Gateway Park in Sunny Isles Beach and the park adjacent to the Miami Bay Club in the Biscayne Corridor; and

WHEREAS, José Milton passed away on July 3, 2013 at the age of 83; and WHEREAS, Milton is survived by his three sons and his wife, Nilda Milton; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of José Milton and his contributions to the community by codesignating the NW 9500 Block of Fontainebleau Boulevard as "José Milton Way"; and

WHEREAS, the Fontainebleau Milton, one of the many luxury rental communities José Milton developed, is located at 9517 Fontainebleau Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, the NW 9500 Block of Fontainebleau Boulevard is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 10,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates the NW 9500 Block of Fontainebleau Boulevard as "José Milton Way".

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade County Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Senator Javier D. Souto. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
