Recommendation for Approval to Award: Animal Food

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of Contract No. FB-00325, Animal Food, for multiple Miami-Dade County departments. The awarded vendors shall provide a wide assortment of foods integral to animal nutrition, growth and longevity. The contract will be primarily used by the Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces and Animal Services departments to support daily operations at Zoo Miami and the new Pet Adoption and Protection Center, respectively. Additionally, the Aviation, Corrections and Rehabilitation, Fire Rescue and Police departments will use the contract to purchase food for canines assisting in search and rescue efforts, security searches and general law enforcement tasks,

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition, and four (4) bids were received in response to the solicitation. The solicitation included two (2) groups: Group A, which was awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder on an item by item basis, and Group B, which establishes a prequalified vendor pool to participate in future spot market competitions. All responsive and responsible bidders will be prequalified for Group B. Additional vendors may qualify to be added to Group B at any time during the term of the pool.

The County Mayor rescinded an earlier recommendation for approval to award this animal food contract (see attached). The decision to rescind was required after one (1) of the recommended vendors, Vet Brands International, Inc. (Vet Brands), notified the County of its inability to offer the items it was awarded. Subsequently, it was determined that awarding to the next lowest bidder would be cost-prohibitive. A separate solicitation will be issued in January 2017 to award the items previously recommended for award to Vet Brands.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$3,570,000. The previous contract, 9411-4/15-4, was valued at \$5,500,000 for five (5) years and six (6) months, expired on August 31, 2016. The allocation requested for the Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces Department is lower than under the previous contract due to the removal of items awarded to Vet Brands. As indicated above, those items will be re-solicited under a separate forthcoming solicitation. All other departmental allocations are substantially similar to the allocations under the current contract.

Recommendation for Approval to Award Animal Food

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve award of Contract No. FB-00325, Animal Food for various Miami-Dade County departments. The awarded vendors will provide a wide variety of foods that provide essential nutrition for growth and longevity of animals for various County departments. This contract will be primarily used by the Miami-Dade Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces and Animal Services departments to support daily operations at Zoo Miami and the new Animal Services facility, respectively. Additionally, the Aviation, Corrections and Rehabilitation, Fire Rescue and Police Departments will use the contract to purchase food for canines that are used for search and rescue efforts, security searches and general law enforcement tasks.

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on March 30, 2016 and four (4) bids were received in response to the solicitation. The solicitation included two groups: Group A, which was awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder on an item by item basis, and Group B, which establishes a pre-qualified pool of vendors to participate in future spot market competitions. All responsive and responsible bidders will be pre-qualified for Group B. Additional vendors may qualify to be added to Group B at any time during the term of the pool.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$8,870,000. The current contract, 9411-4/15-4, is valued at \$5,500,000 for five (5) years and six (6) months. The allocation requested for Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces is higher than under the current contract. The increase includes revisions to animal diets at Zoo Miami based on recommendations provided by the Zoo's nutritionist, as well as the expansion of the Zoo's animal collection during the contract term. The expansion includes additional elephants and koalas along with various animals to be included in the Florida Exhibit. All other departmental allocations are substantially similar to the allocations under the current contract.

FB-00325, FOR PURCHASE OF ANIMAL FOOD FOR COUNTY DEPARTMENTS; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO GIVE NOTICE OF GROUP A AWARD, ISSUE THE APPROPRIATE PURCHASE ORDER TO GIVE EFFECT TO SAME AND EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF CONTRACT PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38; **AUTHORIZING** ESTABLISHMENT OF GROUP B PREQUALIFICATION POOL FB-00325; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO SOLICIT PRICING FOR AWARD CONTRACTS, EXERCISE PROVISIONS OF THE SOLICITATION DOCUMENTS AND ANY RESULTING CONTRACTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38, AND ADD VENDORS TO THE POOL AT ANY TIME, SUBJECT TO RATIFICATION THE BOARD ON A BI-ANNUAL BASIS: AND AUTHORIZING AGGREGATE EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY FOR GROUPS A AND B IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO \$3,570,000.00 FOR THE CONTRACT PREQUALIFICATION POOL COMBINED OVER THE FIVE-YEAR TERM

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board approves award of a Group A Contract No. FB-00325 for purchase of animal food for County departments as set forth in the incorporated memorandum, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to give notice of this award, issue the appropriate purchase order to give effect to same and exercise all provisions of the contract

pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38. A copy of the contract is on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Services Division.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the establishment of a Group B prequalification pool FB-00325 for the purchase of animal food and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to (a) solicit pricing and award contracts up to the aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board, (b) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38, and (c) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis. A copy of the solicitation document and resulting contracts are on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Services Division.

Section 3. This Board further authorizes aggregate expenditure authority in a total amount not to exceed \$3,570,000.00 for the Group A contract and Group B prequalification pool combined over the five-year term.
