RESOLUTION FURTHER CONDEMNING THE VENEZUELAN GOVERNMENT FOR USING VIOLENCE AND INTIMIDATION TO SUPPRESS POLITICAL OPPOSITION; EXPRESSING CONTINUED SUPPORT FOR THOSE VENEZUELANS FIGHTING TO RESTORE THEIR NATION TO A PEACEFUL, DEMOCRATIC STATE; URGING THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES TO TAKE APPROPRIATE DIPLOMATIC ACTION

**WHEREAS**, Nicolás Maduro, a member of the United Socialist Party, was declared the winner of Venezuela's April 14, 2013 presidential election by an incredibly slim margin with 50.6 percent of votes cast; and

WHEREAS, Maduro, who claims to have been elected democratically, has frequently resorted to dictatorial tactics including silencing the media, jailing political opponents, and postponing elections; and

WHEREAS, the Venezuelan government continuously suppresses the voices of its citizens through political arrests, with more than 100 political prisoners currently in jail, including opposition leader Leopoldo López and the former Mayor of Caracas, Antonio Ledezma; and

WHEREAS, police and military raids have led to widespread allegations of abuse, including extrajudicial killings, mass arbitrary detentions, torture in prisons, forced evictions, and arbitrary deportations; and

WHEREAS, Venezuela is mired in a deep economic crisis, with the highest inflation in the world and current inflation estimated to top roughly 1,600 percent in 2017, according to the International Monetary Fund; and

WHEREAS, in July 2016, President Maduro handed over control of the food supply system to the military, which has enabled corruption, fraud, and food trafficking by the military contributing to food shortages, a scarcity of basic goods, and political discrimination in the distribution of food and basic goods; and

WHEREAS, Venezuela is the leading country for asylum requests to the United States in the world, according to data reported by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services; and

WHEREAS, many of the protestors in Venezuela hail from the poorest segments of society, normally the largest bedrock of support for the government; and

WHEREAS, since mass-scale protests erupted in Caracas last month, at least 24 protestors have died, with many killed by the Venezuelan military or other pro-government paramilitary groups; and

WHEREAS, polls indicate that over 80 percent of the country wants Maduro out of office; and

WHEREAS, this Board previously passed Resolution No. R-253-14 condemning the Venezuelan government for using violence and intimidation against its political opposition as early as 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Venezuelan government's rampant disregard for the free speech rights of its citizens has only persisted; and

WHEREAS, these are not the actions of a nation that purports to be democratic and governed by the rule of law; and

WHEREAS, this Board believes that the United States government should address the pressing and escalating situation in Venezuela,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Further condemns the Venezuelan government for using violence and Section 1. intimidation to suppress political opposition.

Continues to express support for those Venezuelans who are valiantly Section 2. fighting to restore their nation to a peaceful, democratic state.

Section 3. Urges the federal government and the Organization of American States to take appropriate diplomatic action to help return democracy to Venezuela.

Section 4. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the members of the Florida Congressional Delegation, the Secretary of State, and the United States Ambassador to the Organization of American States.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
