Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Approval of the Application of ATC Medical Transport Corp. for Three Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the application of ATC Medical Transport Corp. for three Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate three non-emergency vehicles.

SCOPE

These Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity are countywide, allowing the certificate holder to operate in unincorporated and incorporated areas of Miami-Dade County (County).

FISCAL IMPACT

Licensing, operating, permit, and inspection fees are collected by the Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) to support regulatory activities. There is an annual regulatory fee of \$625.00 per certificate that will yield \$1,875.00 in revenue annually for these new certificates. The County also collects \$38.00 per vehicle inspection; with inspection frequency varying with the vehicle age from one to four per year.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

This is an existing permit holder, which currently holds four Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity and is in compliance with all requirements of the County Code. DTPW will be responsible for monitoring this company.

BACKGROUND

On December 18, 1980, the Board adopted Ordinance 80-145, later codified in Chapter 4, Article III of the County Code, providing for the regulation of non-emergency medical transportation. Section 4-44 of the County Code provides the procedures to be followed by the County in processing certificate applications. Based upon those requirements, the Board may issue or refuse to issue the certificate as applied for, or may issue the certificate with modifications or upon such terms and conditions as in its judgment the public interest may require. In reaching a determination, the Board shall consider the application, the Mayor's recommendation, all matters presented during the public hearing, and among others, the following criteria:

- (1) The ability of the applicant to provide the proposed service;
- (2) The adequacy of the management plan of the applicant; and
- (3) The benefits that will accrue to the public interest from the proposed service.

ATC Medical Transport Corp., located at 1250 SW 27 Avenue # 302, Miami, FL 33135, seeks to obtain two Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide wheelchair non-emergency medical transportation service and one Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide sedan non-emergency service to individuals requiring these types of transportation.

The applicant seeks to transport patients to and from various medical facilities throughout the County Monday through Saturday, from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Non-emergency transportation rates are not regulated by the County. However, under the County Code, the Certificate Holder must file their rates with DTPW and post them within the passenger compartment section of each vehicle. The proposed rate schedule is attached. The vehicles operated under these certificates will have to meet the requirements of Section 4-49 of the County Code, establishing vehicle inspection frequencies.

The management plan submitted by Ms. Ivania Arquez, President of ATC Medical Transport Corp., includes maintenance, communication, and recordkeeping systems which meet the requirements of the County Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted. The proposed service standards meet all requirements of the County Code, and adequately meet transportation and comfort needs. A background investigation revealed that all officers of the corporation meet the criteria of the County Code.

The proposed services to be provided under this certificate will increase the availability of licensed non-emergency medical transportation in the County, thus increasing competition and high service standards to the public.
