Subject: Recommendation for Approval to Establish an Authority Bond Counsel Pool

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the establishment of an authority bond counsel pool under *Request for Qualifications (RFQ) No. RFQ-00527* for the Finance Department. The selected firms will be prequalified to provide bond counsel services, on an as-needed basis, for the issuance of municipal bonds through the County's peripheral authorities, including, but not limited to, the Housing Finance, Industrial Development, Educational Facilities, and the Health Facilities Authorities. The solicitation was issued under full and open competition, and the vendors recommended for the pool will be selected for bond transactions on a rotational basis. As a condition of award, each proposer was required to contractually engage with an associate counsel located in Miami-Dade County in an effort to expand the availability of small and local law firms with experience in public finance. Firms recommended for award under the County Bond Counsel and Disclosure Counsel pools, which are being presented under separate agenda items, were ineligible for award under this pool.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the seven-year term is \$4,200,000. The current pool, CBWRFQ663, was awarded with a value of \$4,200,000 for a seven-year term. The Board approved an extension of the current pool for up to one year on a month-to-month basis until February 2018, or until a new pool is established, whichever occurs first, through Resolution No. R-161-17.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to assign work in accordance with the solicitation document, award contracts, and exercise all provisions of the pool, including any cancellation and extension provisions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.

Vendors Recommended for Award

A competitive Request for Qualifications was issued with award being made to the three-highest ranked proposers. Five proposals were received in response to the solicitation and were evaluated by the Competition Selection Committee in accordance with the criteria outlined in the solicitation. Award is being recommended to the three-highest ranked proposers not recommended for the County Bond Counsel and Disclosure Counsel Pools as they are not eligible for this pool.

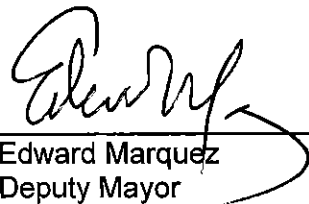
Due Diligence

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues. The lists that were referenced included convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to contractor responsibility.

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-140-15, prior to the re-procurement of this replacement pool, a full review of the scope of services was conducted to ensure the replacement pool reflects the County's current needs. The review included conducting market research, posting draft solicitation for industry comment, and holding meetings and drafting sessions with the user department.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two percent User Access Program provision applies and will be collected on all purchases where permitted by the funding source.
- The Small Business Enterprise measures do not apply as these services are exempt per the Ordinance.
- Local Preference Ordinance was included in the solicitation.
- The Living Wage Ordinance does not apply.

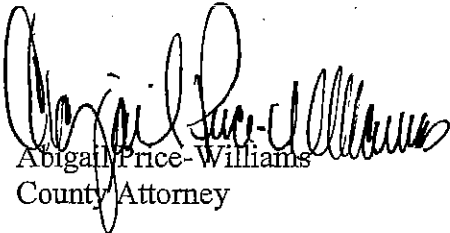

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ESTABLISHMENT OF CLOSED PREQUALIFICATION POOL RTQ-00527 CONSISTING OF BRYANT MILLER OLIVE, P.A., FOLEY & LARDNER, LLP, AND LOCKE LORD, LLP IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$4,200,000.00 FOR A SEVEN YEAR TERM FOR AUTHORITY BOND COUNSEL FOR THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO ASSIGN WORK IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SOLICITATION DOCUMENT, AWARD CONTRACTS, AND EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE CONTRACTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes the establishment of a closed prequalification pool RTQ-00527, consisting of Bryant Miller Olive, P.A., Foley & Lardner, LLP, and Locke Lord, LLP for authority bond counsel for the Finance Department in a total amount up to \$4,200,000.00 for a term of seven years and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to assign work in accordance with the solicitation document, award contracts up to the aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board and exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38. A copy of the solicitation document and resulting contracts are on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Services Division.
