Recommendation to Ratify Emergency Award: Integrated Pest Management

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) waive formal bid procedures pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1 of the County Code by a two-thirds vote of the Board members present and ratify an emergency contract award, *E9930-MT*, *Integrated Pest Management*, in the amount of \$379,003.79 for the Miami-Dade Transportation and Public Works Department. This emergency contract was necessary to immediately address pest control on County buses. Transportation and Public Works utilized a competitively established contract, *Contract No. EPP-WOPR8264-2*, *Integrated Pest Management*, for the purchase of integrated pest management services for its facilities. The contract was awarded to El Toro Exterminator of Florida, Inc. d/b/a Toro Pest Management (Toro) in March 2010. Under the terms of the contract, Toro was responsible for the elimination of indoor pests in Metrorail and Metromover cars and facilities, as well as County buses.

When Transportation and Public Works began to receive numerous complaints regarding insects on County buses, Toro was instructed to begin fumigating 20 buses per week to immediately address the insect population. Transportation and Public Works increased the number of buses receiving fumigation services to 75 in order to maintain maximum suppression of insect activity. In August 2016, the department realized that the additional services were depleting its allocation. A modification for additional expenditure authority was prepared for Board consideration. However, there was insufficient time to present the item prior to the expiration of the contract. Accordingly, ratification of this emergency contract is requested to pay invoices submitted by Toro that exceeded the contract allocation. Staff has evaluated the circumstances that led to this emergency, and future contract modification requests will be presented for timely consideration by the Board.

#### Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

## Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact of this emergency purchase is \$379,003.79.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING WAIVER OF FORMAL BID PROCEDURES PURSUANT TO SECTION 5.03(D) OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER AND SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE COUNTY CODE BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT; RATIFYING AN EMERGENCY CONTRACT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$379,003.79 FOR THE OF INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT PURCHASE SERVICES FOR THE TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE CONTRACT PURSUANT TO **SECTION** 2-8.1 OF THE **COUNTY** CODE AND **IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38** 

WHEREAS, the County Mayor recommends to this Board to waive formal bid procedures for the purchase of goods and services which cannot be purchased under normal bid procedures,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board finds it is in the best interest of Miami-Dade County to waive formal bid procedures, pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1 of the County Code, by a two-thirds vote of the Board members present.

Section 2. This Board ratifies the emergency contract as set forth in the incorporated memorandum in a total amount of \$379,003.79 and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise all provisions of the contract pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38. A copy of the contract is on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Services Division.
