Request for Additional Expenditure to Contract No. BW9928-0/20 Inspections,

Maintenance, Repairs, and Parts for Non-Warranty Items for Bell Helicopters 412

Series

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners waive competitive bidding procedures for the purchase of goods and services pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and authorize additional expenditure authority to *Contract No. BW9928-0/20 Inspections, Maintenance, Repairs, and Parts for Non-Warranty Items for Bell Helicopters 412 Series,* for the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department. The Department is requesting \$1,500,000 in additional expenditure authority to ensure the Department has sufficient funding to purchase maintenance support and inspections for its fleet of four Bell 412 helicopters, which are used to perform air rescue operations throughout Miami-Dade County.

County staff performs routine maintenance in-house on a number of its Bell helicopters. For work that cannot be completed in-house, the County utilizes two contracts to perform required maintenance. The first contract, *Contract No. FB-00086*, *Helicopter Parts, Services and Supplies*, was competitively awarded to Uniflight, LLC located in Grand Prairie, Texas, through Resolution No. R-99-15. The use of *Contract No. FB-00086* requires Fire Rescue to fly its helicopters to and from the vendor's facility in Texas. As a result, the Department incurs substantial costs to perform required maintenance and inspections.

To mitigate those costs, the County awarded this bid waiver contract, *Contract No. BW9928-0/20*, under delegated authority on September 6, 2017. The awarded vendor for this contract has a maintenance facility that is located in Broward County, which allows the County to receive inspections and maintenance in a more timely and cost-effective manner.

Fire Rescue is requesting additional expenditure authority in the amount of \$1,500,000 for *Contract No. BW9928-0/20* to allow the Department to purchase manufacturer-required inspections for three of its helicopters, which will cost approximately \$500,000 each. These helicopters are between 12 and 18 years of age, and inspections will ensure that the helicopters remain in operable condition.

The County issued a competitive solicitation for the purchase of four replacement helicopters and is currently in contract negotiations, which are expected to be completed this fiscal year. Accordingly, it is recommended that the Board approve this modification to allow Fire Rescue to purchase inspection and maintenance services for its Bell helicopters in a cost-effective manner.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The contract term expires on September 5, 2020. The contract has a current allocation of \$250,000. If this request is approved, the contract will have a modified cumulative value of \$1,750,000. The requested increase is based on the Department's current needs.

RESOLUTION WAIVING FORMAL BID PROCEDURES PURSUANT TO SECTION 5.03(D) OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER AND SECTION 2-8.1(B)(1) OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT AND AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,500,000.00 TO CONTRACT NO. BW9928-0/20 FOR THE PURCHASE OF INSPECTIONS, MAINTENANCE, REPAIRS, AND PARTS FOR BELL HELICOPTERS FOR THE FIRE RESCUE DEPARTMENT; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR TO EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE CONTRACT, INCLUDING ANY CANCELLATION, RENEWAL AND EXTENSION PROVISIONS, PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE COUNTY CODE AND IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board finds it is in the best interest of Miami-Dade County to waive formal bid procedures pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1(b)(1) of the Code of Miami-Dade County by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board members present and authorizes additional expenditure authority in an amount up to \$1,500,000.00 to Contract No. BW9928-0/20 for the purchase of inspections, maintenance, repairs, and parts Bell helicopters for the Fire Rescue Department. The Board also authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation, renewal and extension provisions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.
