RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO PREPARE A REPORT WITH RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW TO BEST PROTECT THE COUNTY'S WATER AND SEWER INFRASTRUCTURE AND ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE FROM IMPACTS OF SEA LEVEL RISE

WHEREAS, in 2013, pursuant to Resolution No. R-599-13, this Board created the Miami-Dade County Sea Level Rise Task Force; and

WHEREAS, this Board subsequently adopted multiple resolutions in order to implement the recommendations of the Sea Level Rise Task Force; and

WHEREAS, for example, Resolution No. R-48-15 noted that the County has facilities and infrastructure that could be adversely affected by sea level rise and directed the Mayor or Mayor's designee to conduct a comprehensive study and develop adaptation strategies to address potential flood damage reduction and saltwater intrusion that may be associated with sea level rise; and

WHEREAS, similarly, Resolution No. R-451-14 established the policy that all County infrastructure projects shall consider sea level rise projections and potential impacts as best estimated at the time of the project; and

WHEREAS, the County's water and sewer infrastructure may be particularly vulnerable to the impacts of sea level rise because much of the water and sewer infrastructure is below ground, and therefore could be affected by rising water table levels underground; and

WHEREAS, the County's road systems may also be vulnerable, given that the road system depends on the stormwater drainage systems; and

WHEREAS, because the impacts of sea level rise are still being studied and assessed, it remains unknown what road improvements may be needed and where, and therefore it would be advisable to preserve, to the maximum extent, the County's existing roads and, for example, prevent road closures which could limit the County's ability to adjust to changing road needs, due to sea level rise impacts; and

WHEREAS, a report with recommendations on how to best protect the County's water and sewer infrastructure and road infrastructure from impacts of sea level rise may be particularly useful,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby directs the Mayor or Mayor's designee to prepare a report containing recommendations on how to best protect the County's water and sewer infrastructure and road infrastructure from the impacts of sea level rise, including how best to maintain the County's ability to respond to changing road and water and sewer needs, due to sea level rise impacts, as discussed herein. This report shall also include, but is not limited to, recommendations as to any changes to the Miami-Dade County Code which may be advisable. The Mayor or Mayor's designee shall provide this report to the Board within 180 days of the effective date of this resolution, and shall place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
