Ordinance Amending the Coco Palms Community Development District

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) adopt the attached Ordinance amending the boundaries of the Coco Palms Community Development District (CDD). This proposed district lies wholly within the unincorporated Miami-Dade County (County), Florida, and will be expanding by 24.96 acres, increasing the total acreage of the CDD from 91.43 acres to 116.39 acres pursuant to the authority granted by the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter for the purposes set forth in Chapter 190 of the Florida Statutes.

Scope

This Coco Palms CDD is located within Commission District 8, represented by Commissioner Daniella Levine Cava, and will provide funding for capital improvements, as well as multipurpose maintenance functions, within the CDD. The area of expansion will include residential development such as villas and townhomes.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Amending the boundaries of the Coco Palms CDD will have no fiscal impact to the County. CDD funding is provided by private CDD liens and assessments against affected property and may be collected privately or through the annual Combined Real Property tax bill pursuant to an interlocal agreement with the County. Adoption of this Ordinance will not affect the CDD assessments of the individual owners within the original CDD boundaries.

Social Equity Statement

The proposed Ordinance grants a petition for the amendment of the Coco Palms CDD, pursuant to the procedures and factors set forth in Section 190.046, Florida Statutes.

If approved, pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, the CDD will have the power to levy taxes and special assessments and charge, collect, and enforce fees and other user charges affecting property owners within the proposed district, regardless of their demographics or income levels. The CDD is a timely, efficient, effective, responsive, and economic way to deliver and finance basic community development services.

Track Record/Monitor

A multipurpose maintenance Special Taxing District was created to maintain this development's infrastructure and common areas, should the Homeowners Association or CDD be dissolved or fails to fulfill its maintenance obligations. The Coco Palms Multipurpose Maintenance and Street Lighting Special Taxing District was created and adopted on November 3, 2015, under Ordinance No. 15-122. This Special Taxing District will remain dormant until such time as the County

determines to implement the district.

Background

The Coco Palms CDD was created by the Board on November 3, 2015, pursuant to Ordinance No. 15-123. The original CDD boundary encompasses 91.43 acres with approximately \$13.401 million in infrastructure costs servicing 743 residential dwelling units (309 townhomes, 253 villa units, and 181 single family units). Upon adoption of the attached Ordinance, the Coco Palms CDD will be increased by a net acreage of 24.96 acres encompassing a total of 116.39 acres consisting of 427 townhomes, 416 villa units, and 181 single family units, and infrastructure costs will increase by approximately \$5.070 million. In accordance with Florida Statute 190, the Petitioner has paid a filing fee of \$1,500 to the County and will pay for future advertising costs according to State Statute.

A declaration of restrictive covenants for the amendment has been submitted consistent with the requirements of Resolution No. R-413-05 adopted by the Board on April 5, 2005, and as amended by Resolution No. R-883-06, which was adopted on July 18, 2006, to add language regarding the option to pay capital assessments in full at the time of closing. The restrictive covenants provide for: (1) notice in the public records of the projected taxes and assessments to be levied by the Coco Palms CDD; (2) individual prior notice to the initial purchaser of a residential lot or unit within the development; and (3) provisions for remedial options to initial purchasers whose contract for sale did not include timely notice of the existence and extent of CDD liens and special assessments.

This Board is authorized by the Florida Constitution and the County Home Rule Charter to establish governmental units, such as this CDD, within the County and to prescribe such government's jurisdiction and powers.

ORDINANCE GRANTING PETITION OF COCO PALMS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT TO EXPAND THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE NO. 15-123 BY 24.96 ACRES; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, EXCLUSION FROM THE CODE AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 6(1) of the Florida Constitution provides for exclusive County Charter authority to establish all governmental units within Miami-Dade County and to provide for their government and prescribe their jurisdiction and powers; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.01(A)(21) of the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter grants the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") the authority to exercise all powers and privileges granted to municipalities and counties by the laws of this State; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature created and amended Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, to provide an alternative method to finance and manage basic services for community development; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting of November 3, 2015 the Board adopted Ordinance No. 15-123 establishing the Coco Palms Community Development District ("District" or "Petitioner") and providing for specific boundaries of the District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 190.046, Florida Statutes, the District may petition and the Board has the authority to expand the boundaries of a community development district within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Petitioner has submitted a Petition to expand the District boundaries by 24.96 acres, resulting in a total increase in acreage of the District from 91.43 acres to 116.39 acres; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been conducted by the Board in accordance with the requirements and procedures of Sections 190.005(2)(b) and 190.046(1), Florida Statutes, and the applicable requirements and procedures of the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter and Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the statements contained in the Petition to expand the District boundaries are true and correct; and

WHEREAS, the expansion of the District boundaries is not inconsistent with any applicable element or portion of the State comprehensive plan or the Miami-Dade County Comprehensive Development Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, the area of land within the District as expanded is sufficiently compact and sufficiently contiguous to be developable as one functional interrelated community and the areas of land being added do not impact such functionality; and

WHEREAS, the District as expanded is the best alternative available for delivering the community development services and facilities that will be provided by the District, and the area of land being added will not impact such delivery; and

WHEREAS, the community development facilities and services of the District as expanded will not be incompatible the capacity and uses of existing local and regional community development services and facilities; and

WHEREAS, the area that will be served by the District as expanded is amenable to separate special district government; and

WHEREAS, having made the foregoing findings, after a public hearing, the Board wishes to exercise the powers bestowed upon it by Section 1.01(A)(21) of the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter in the manner provided by Chapter 190, Florida Statutes,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The foregoing findings, which are expressly set forth herein, are hereby adopted and made a part hereof.

Section 2. The Petition to expand the District to include the real properties described in the Petition attached hereto, which was filed by the District on February 14, 2018, and which Petition is on file at the Office of the Clerk of the Board, is hereby granted. A copy of the Petition is attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1 to the Ordinance.

Section 3. The external boundaries of the District as expanded are sufficiently contiguous and shall be as depicted in the certified metes and bounds legal description attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 2 to the Ordinance. Furthermore, the external boundaries shall be as depicted on the location map attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 3 to the Ordinance.

Section 4. Except to expand the boundaries of the District as provided herein, this Ordinance does not affect, amend or modify Ordinance No. 15-123.

<u>Section 5.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 6. It is the intention of the Board, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall be excluded from the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.

PETITION TO EXPAND BOUNDARIES OF COCO PALMS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the Coco Palms Community Development District, an independent special district established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (the "District"), and Section 1.01(A)(21) of the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter by Ordinance No. 15-123 of Miami-Dade County, Florida (the "County"), adopted on November 3, 2015 (the "Ordinance"), hereby submits this petition (the "Petition") to the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA (the "Commission") in accordance with Section 190.046(1) of the Uniform Community Development Act of 1980, Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (the "Act"), to expand the boundaries of the District and in support thereof, hereby attests as follows:

- 1. That approximately 91.43 acres are currently within the external boundaries of the District.
- 2. That the Board desires to expand the boundaries of the District by adding approximately 24.96 acres of real property as legally described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof. Following such expansion of the District's boundaries, all lands in the District will continue to be located wholly within unincorporated Miami-Dade County, Florida.

- 3. That the real property to be annexed into the District does not exceed 50% of the acres initially located within the original boundaries of the District. The total acreage of the boundaries of the District, including this petition and the initial petition seeking establishment of the District, do not encompass more than a total of 1,000 acres.
- 4. That attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> and made a part hereof is a metes and bounds description of the external boundaries of the District following the proposed expansion of such boundaries. No real property within the external boundaries of the District as proposed is to be excluded therefrom.
- 5. That attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u> is the proposed timetable for installation of District services and facilities which will be provided to the real property being annexed into the District and the estimated cost of installing such proposed services and facilities.
- 6. That attached hereto as <u>Exhibit D</u> is evidence of the written consent to the annexation of the subject property into the District by the fee title owner of one hundred percent (100%) of such real property (the "Landowner").
- 7. That attached hereto as <u>Exhibit E</u> is a designation of the future general distribution, location, and extent of public and private uses of land proposed for the area to be annexed into the District by the future land use plan element of the effective local government comprehensive plan.
- 8. That attached hereto as Exhibit F is a statement of estimated regulatory costs in accordance with the requirements of Section 120.541, Florida Statutes.
- 9. That attached hereto as <u>Exhibit G</u> is a copy of the proposed Declaration of Restrictive Covenants applicable to the subject property, which has been executed by the Landowner and is being submitted in support of this Petition.

- 10. That attached hereto as <u>Exhibit H</u> is a copy of the Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the District authorizing the filing of this Petition.
- 11. That following the proposed expansion of the District's boundaries (i) the property within the District will not be inconsistent with any applicable element or portion of the state comprehensive plan or of the effective local government comprehensive plan; (ii) the property comprising the District will be of sufficient size, compactness, and contiguity to be developable as one functional interrelated community; (iii) the District will continue to present the best alternative available for delivering the community development facilities and services to the property that will be served by the District; (iv) the community development facilities and services of the District will not be incompatible with the capacity and uses of existing local and regional community development services and facilities; and (v) the property comprising the District will be amenable to separate special-purpose government.
 - 13. That all statements contained within this Petition are true and correct.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner, the Board of Supervisors of the Coco Palms Community

Development District, hereby respectfully requests the Commission to:

- A. Direct its staff to notice, as soon as practicable, a local public non-emergency hearing pursuant to the requirements of Section 190.046(1)(b) of the Act to consider whether to grant this Petition and to amend the Ordinance establishing the District to reflect the new boundaries of the District.
- B. Grant this Petition and enact an ordinance pursuant to applicable law amending the Ordinance establishing the District to reflect the new boundaries of the District.





STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS

1.0 Introduction

1.1 Purpose and Scope

This Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs ("SERC") supports the petition to expand boundaries of Coco Palms Community Development District (the "District"). The District is a unit of special purpose local government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, and the Miami-Dade County Charter by Ordinance No. 15-123 of Miami-Dade County, Florida (the "County"), adopted on November 3, 2015 (the "Ordinance"). The District is currently comprised of approximately 91.43 gross acres of land located within unincorporated Miami-Dade County (the "County"), and in the State of Florida. The District desires to expand the boundaries by adding approximately 24.96 gross acres ("Expansion Area"). The Expansion Area will be located east of the District. The limitations on the scope of this SERC are explicitly set out in Section 190.002 (2) (d), Florida Statutes, as follows:

"That the process of establishing such a district pursuant to uniform general law shall be fair and based only on factors material to managing and financing the service delivery function of the district, so that any matter concerning permitting or planning of the development is not material or relevant."

1.2 Overview of the Coco Palms Community Development District

The District is designed to provide community infrastructure, services, and facilities along with their operations and maintenance to the Coco Palms Community Development District. Following the expansion, Coco Palms Community Development District will encompass approximately 116.39 gross acres.

The current development plan for the Expansion Area within the District includes the construction of approximately 163 villas and 118 townhomes for a total of 281 residential units. The current development plan is subject to change as market conditions may dictate in the future. The scope of this SERC is limited to evaluating the consequences of approving the proposal to expand the boundaries of the District.

1.3 Requirements for Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs

According to Section 120.541 (2), Florida Statutes, a statement of estimated regulatory costs must contain:

- (a) An economic analysis showing whether the rule directly or indirectly; is likely to have an adverse impact on economic growth, private sector job creation or employment, or private sector investment in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the rule; is likely to have an adverse impact on business competitiveness, including the ability of persons doing business in the state to compete with persons doing business in other states or domestic markets, productivity, or innovation in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the rule; or is likely to increase regulatory costs, including any transactional costs, in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the rule.
- (b) A good faith estimate of the number of individuals and entities likely to be required to comply with the rule, together with a general description of the types of individuals likely to be affected by the rule.
- (c) A good faith estimate of the cost to the agency¹, and to any other state and local government entities, of implementing and enforcing the proposed rule, and any anticipated effect on state and local revenues.
- (d) A good faith estimate of the transactional costs likely to be incurred by individuals and entities, including local governmental entities, required to comply with the requirements of the rule. As used in this paragraph, "transactional costs" are direct costs that are readily ascertainable based upon standard business practices, and include filing fees, the cost of obtaining a license, the cost of equipment required to be installed or used or procedures required to be employed in complying with the rule, additional operating costs incurred, and the cost of monitoring and reporting.
- (e) An analysis of the impact on small businesses as defined by Section 288.703, Florida Statutes and an analysis of the impact on small counties and small cities as defined by Section 120.52, Florida Statutes. The impact analysis for small businesses must include the basis for the agency's decision not to implement alternatives that would reduce impacts on small businesses.
- (f) Any additional information that the agency determines may be useful.
- (g) In the statement or revised statement, whichever applies, a description of any good faith written proposal submitted under paragraph (1) (a) of Section 120.541 and either a statement adopting the alternative or a statement of the reasons for rejecting the alternative in favor of the proposed rule.
- 2.0 An economic analysis showing whether the rule directly or indirectly is likely to have an adverse impact on economic growth, private sector job creation or employment, private sector investment, in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within or 5 years after the implementation of the rule.

It is unlikely the expansion of the District will meet any of the triggers in Section 120.541(2)(a).

¹ For the purposes of this SERC, the term "agency" means the County and the term "rule" means the ordinance(s) which the County will enact in connection with the expansion of the District.

The basis for this determination is provided in the discussions in Section 3.0 through Section 6.0.

3.0 A good faith estimate of the number of individuals and entities likely to be required to comply with the rule, together with a general description of the types of individuals likely to be affected by the rule.

As noted above, the District is a residential community and the Expansion Area of 24.96 acres is estimated to include 163 villas and 118 townhomes. All of the ultimate property owners in the District will be required to comply with District rules and their properties will be encumbered with District obligations to pay for infrastructure and operation and maintenance expenses incurred by the District. Expansion of the District would put all of these areas under the jurisdiction of the District.

- 4.0 Good faith estimate of the cost to state and local government entities, of implementing and enforcing the proposed rule, and any anticipated effect on state and local revenues.
- 4.1 Costs of Governmental Agencies of Implementing and Enforcing Rule

State Government Entities

There will be only modest costs to various State governmental entities to implement and enforce the proposed expansion of the District. The District expanded will encompass under 1,000 acres, therefore the County is the establishing entity under 190.005 (1) Florida Statutes, and the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter. The modest costs to various State entities to implement and enforce the proposed rule relate strictly to the receipt and processing of various reports that the proposed District is required to file with the State and its various entities. Appendix A lists the reporting requirements. The costs to those State agencies that will receive and process the District's reports are very small, because the District is only one of many governmental units that are required to submit the various reports. Therefore, the marginal cost of processing one additional set of reports is inconsequential. Finally, the filing fees paid by the District are designed to offset any additional costs to the State.

Miami-Dade County

The land within the proposed expansion area of the District is located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County and consists of approximately 24.96 gross acres. The County and its staff will analyze the Petition, conduct a public hearing and take final action with respect to the establishment of the District. These activities will absorb staff time and time of the County Commission.

These costs to the County are modest for a number of reasons. First, review of the Petition does not include analysis of the project itself. Second, the Petition itself provides much of the information needed for a staff review. Third, County already possess the staff needed to conduct

the review without the need for new staff. Fourth, there is no capital required to review the Petition. Fifth, potential costs are offset by the required filing fee. Finally, the County routinely

process similar petitions for land uses and zoning charges that are far more complex than is the Petition.

The annual costs to the County because of the establishment of the District are also minimal. The proposed District is an independent unit of local government. The District is required to provide to the County its budget each year, but no County action is required.

4.2 Impact on State and Local Revenues

Adoption of the proposed ordinance expanding the boundaries of the District will have no negative impact on State and local revenues. The District is an independent unit of local government. It is designed to provide community facilities and services to serve the development. It has its own sources of revenue. No State or local subsidies are required or expected.

In this regard it is important to note that any debt obligations incurred by the District as expanded to construct its infrastructure, or for any other reason, are not debts of the State or any unit of local government. In accordance with State law, debts of the District are strictly its own responsibility.

5.0 A good faith estimate of the transactional costs are likely to be incurred by individuals and entities required to comply with the requirements of the ordinance.

Table 1 provides an outline of the various facilities and services the District may provide to the Expansion Area. The water distribution system, sanitary sewer system, roadway improvements, storm water management system, and related incidental costs, as described in **Table 1**, will be funded by the District.

The petitioner has estimated the design and development costs for providing the capital facilities

to the expansion area. The cost estimates are shown in **Table 2** below. Total design and development costs for these facilities are estimated to be approximately \$5,070,000. The District may issue special assessments or other revenue bonds to fund the development of these facilities. These bonds would be repaid through non-ad valorem assessments levied on all properties in the District that may benefit from the District's capital improvement program as outlined in **Table 2**.

Prospective future landowners in the District may be required to pay non-ad valorem assessments levied by the District to secure the debt incurred through bond issuance. In addition to the levy of non-ad valorem assessments for debt service, the District may also impose a non-ad valorem assessment to fund the operations and maintenance of the District and its facilities and services.

Furthermore, the decision made by new property owners to reside in the District is completely voluntary. Thus, ultimately, all owners and users of the affected property choose to accept the non-ad valorem assessments as a tradeoff for the numerous benefits and facilities that the District provides.

A Community Development District ("CDD") provides property owners with the option of having higher levels of facilities and services financed through self-imposed charges. The District is an alternative means to finance necessary community services. District financing is no more expensive, and often less expensive, than the alternatives of a municipal service taxing unit (MSTU), a neighborhood association, County provision, or through developer equity and/or bank loans.

In considering these costs it shall be noted that occupants of the lands to be included within the District will receive three major classes of benefits:

First, those property owners and businesses in the District will receive a higher level of public services and amenities sooner than would otherwise be the case.

Second, a District is a mechanism for assuring that the community services and amenities will be completed concurrently with development of lands within the District. This satisfies the revised growth management legislation, and it assures that growth pays for itself without undue burden on other consumers. Establishment of the District will ensure that these landowners pay for the provision of facilities, services and improvements to these lands.

Third, a District is the sole form of governance which allows District landowners, through landowner voting and ultimately electoral voting for resident elected boards, to determine the type, quality and expense of the District services they receive, provided they meet the County's overall requirements.

The cost impact on the ultimate landowners in the District is not the total cost for the District to provide infrastructure services and facilities. Instead, it is the incremental costs above what the landowners would have paid to install infrastructure via an alternative financing mechanism. Given the low cost of capital for a CDD, the cost impact to landowners is negligible. This incremental cost of the high-quality infrastructure provided by the District is likely to be fairly low.

6.0 An analysis of the impact on small businesses as defined by Section 288.703, Florida Statutes, and an analysis of the impact on small counties and small cities as defined by Section 120.52, Florida Statutes.

There will be no impact on small businesses because of the expansion of the District. If anything, the impact may be positive. This is because the District must competitively bid many of its contracts. This affords small businesses the opportunity to bid on District work.

The District is located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County. The County has an estimated population that is greater than 75,000 according to the 2010 U.S Census. Therefore, the County is not defined as a "small county" according to Sections 120.52 (18) and 120.52 (19) (respectively), Florida Statutes.

7.0 Any additional useful information.

The analysis provided above is based on a straightforward application of economic theory, especially as it relates to tracking the incidence of regulatory costs and benefits. Inputs were received from the District Engineer and other professionals associated with the developer.

8.0 In the statement or revised statement, whichever applies, a description of any good faith written proposal submitted under paragraph (1) (a) and either a statement adopting the alternative or a statement of the reasons for rejecting the alternative in favor of the proposed rule.

There have been no good faith written proposals submitted to the agency as described in Section 120.541(1) (a), Florida Statutes.

(defined below) of the cost of the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, and equipping of certain public infrastructure which benefit the Property either as a one-time assessment at the time of closing or as an annual assessment based on the debt service on bonds to be issued by the District to finance such capital costs until such bonds are retired (collectively, "Capital Assessments"), and (2) the costs associated with (i) operations of the District including administration ("Operations Assessments") and (ii) maintenance of public infrastructure by the District ("Infrastructure Maintenance Assessments"; Operations and Infrastructure Maintenance Assessments are hereinafter collectively referred to as "Administrative Assessments"); and

WHEREAS, other covenants made by Owner include provisions for the long-term maintenance of infrastructure serving the Property including, but not limited to, roadways, drainage, and landscaping; and

WHEREAS, such covenants of Owner are made in order to assure the Board that the representations made by Owner in support of the Petition will be abided by; and

WHEREAS, Owner wishes to provide this new Declaration of Restrictive Covenants (the "Declaration") with respect to the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, Owner freely, voluntarily, and without duress, and on behalf of its heirs, successors, and assigns, makes the following Declaration of Restrictive Covenants covering and running with the Property (this "Declaration"):

1. COVENANTS.

as notice in the public records of the County that unless the District is terminated in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, and such termination is reflected in the public records of the County, the Property and all lands, parcels, lots, and units located within the District's boundaries are subject to the Capital Assessments and Administrative Assessments

levied and imposed by the District, subject only to the exceptions or exemptions from such assessments expressly provided by Florida law.

1.2 CDD and Purchase Contract Notices

Purchaser of an improved individual residential lot or unit within the Property (individually, a "Dwelling Unit") written notice of the estimated annual Capital Assessments and Administrative Assessments (the "CDD Notice") to be imposed on such individual Dwelling substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B prior to, or contemporaneously with, the execution of a purchase and sale contract ("Purchase Contract") for such Dwelling Unit. For the purposes of this Declaration, the term "Owner" means each seller of Dwelling Units within the Property. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if a Prospective Initial Purchaser executed a Purchase Contract before the effective date (10 days after enactment) of the Ordinance (the "Effective Date of the Ordinance") but was not given an contemporaneous CDD Notice, Owner may still give the CDD Notice to such Prospective Initial Purchaser; provided, however, such CDD notice must be given together with the following written notice and must be sent to such Prospective Purchaser by certified mail, professional overnight delivery or hand delivery, with return receipt, not later than the first business day following the Effective Date of the Ordinance:

THE DWELLING UNIT YOU ARE PURCHASING IS SUBJECT TO A RELATED DISTRICT AND Α DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS WHICH REQUIRES THAT CERTAIN NOTICES BE GIVEN TO PURCHASERS BY OWNER, THIS NOTICE AND THE ATTACHED CDD NOTICE ARE BEING GIVEN TO YOU PURSUANT TO SUCH DECLARATION. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE DISTRICT PLANS TO ISSUE OR HAS ISSUED BONDS THAT WILL HAVE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYMENTS APPLICABLE TO THIS DWELLING UNIT OVER A PERIOD OF UP TO THIRTY (30) YEARS TO FUND CONSTRUCTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE SERVING PROPERTY IN THE ESTIMATED AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$39,000.00 FOR A VILLA, AND \$42,000.00 FOR A TOWNHOME UNIT. DWELLING UNITS SHALL BE ASSESSED AN ESTIMATED CAPITAL ASSESSMENT OF \$21,176.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT AND \$22,804.00 FOR TOWNHOME UNIT, IF PAID IN FULL AT CLOSING OR AN ESTIMATED

ANNUAL CAPITAL ASSESSMENT OF \$1,300.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT AND \$1,400.00 FOR A TOWNHOME UNIT FOR ITS PROPORTIONATE SHARE OF DEBT SERVICE ON THE BONDS UNTIL SUCH BONDS ARE PAID IN FULL. WHETHER THE CAPITAL ASSESSMENT IS PAID ONE TIME AT CLOSING OR IN ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS IS AT THE OPTION OF THE PURCHASER TO BE EXERCISED AT THE TIME OF CLOSING. THE ATTACHED NOTICE FULLY DESCRIBES YOUR OBLIGATIONS. YOU MAY ELECT TO RESCIND THE PURCHASE CONTRACT FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTY (30) DAYS FOLLOWING RECEIPT OF THIS NOTICE. UPON SUCH ELECTION, OWNER SHALL RETURN ALL MONIES PAID BY YOU AS THE PROSPECTIVE INITIAL PURCHASER REGARDING THE PURCHASE OF THE REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED IN THE PURCHASE CONTRACT WITHIN TEN (10) CALENDAR DAYS AFTER RECEIVING YOUR WRITTEN NOTICE THAT YOU HAVE ELECTED TO RESCIND THE PURCHASE CONTRACT, AND ALL OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE REMEDIES SET FORTH HEREIN SHALL GOVERN. NO OTHER REMEDIES ARE AVAILABLE TO PURCHASER WHETHER OR NOT YOU ELECT TO RESCIND EXCEPT IN THE EVENT OF AN OWNER DEFAULT WITH RESPECT TO THE CDD NOTICE AND THEN ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DECLARATION.

Owner shall promptly refund any amounts due under the foregoing notice if a Prospective Initial Purchaser properly rescinds a Purchase Contract during the time provided. No other remedies provided in Section 1.4 shall be available to a Prospective Initial Purchaser who terminates a Purchase Contract pursuant to the foregoing notice.

1.2.2. Owner shall also provide substantially the following disclosure ("Purchase Contract Notice") on the first page of each Purchase Contract executed after the Effective Date of the Ordinance for a Dwelling Unit within the Property, immediately after disclosure of the purchase price for the Dwelling Unit:

THIS DWELLING UNIT IS WITHIN A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT"). THE DISTRICT PLANS TO ISSUE OR HAS ISSUED BONDS THAT WILL HAVE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYMENTS APPLICABLE TO THIS DWELLING UNIT OVER A PERIOD OF UP TO THIRTY (30) YEARS TO FUND CONSTRUCTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE SERVING THE PROPERTY IN THE ESTIMATED AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$39,000.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT, AND \$42,000.00 FOR A TOWNHOME UNIT. THE DWELLING UNITS SHALL BE ASSESSED AN ESTIMATED CAPITAL ASSESSMENT OF \$21,176.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT AND \$22,804.00 FOR TOWNHOME UNIT IF PAID IN FULL AT CLOSING OR AN ESTIMATED ANNUAL CAPITAL ASSESSMENT OF \$1,300.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT AND \$1,400.00 FOR A TOWNHOME UNIT FOR ITS PROPORTIONATE SHARE OF DEBT SERVICE ON THE BONDS UNTIL SUCH BONDS ARE PAID IN FULL. WHETHER THE CAPITAL

ASSESSMENT IS PAID ONE TIME AT CLOSING OR IN ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS IS AT THE OPTION OF THE PURCHASER TO BE EXERCISED AT THE TIME OF CLOSING. THESE AMOUNTS ARE DUE OVER THE TERM OF THE BONDS IN ADDITION TO THE PURCHASE PRICE. INITIAL PURCHASER ALSO UNDERSTANDS THAT IF THE ACTUAL ANNUAL CAPITAL ASSESSMENTS ON THE DWELLING UNIT ARE MORE THAN FIVE PERCENT (5%) HIGHER THAN THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT PROVIDED HEREIN, INITIAL PURCHASER SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO RESCIND THIS AGREEMENT AT ANY TIME PRIOR TO CLOSING. INITIAL PURCHASER FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT OF CAPITAL ASSESSMENTS DOES NOT INCLUDE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSESSMENTS WHICH SHALL **OPERATIONS** DISTRICT FOR THE LEVIED BYINFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE AND MAY VARY FROM YEAR TO YEAR AND FROM TIME TO TIME. IN THE EVENT OF ANY CONFLICT BETWEEN THE DISCLOSURES IN THIS PROVISION AND THE ATTACHED CDD NOTICE, THE CDD NOTICE SHALL CONTROL.

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Owner shall cause each Prospective Initial Purchaser to initial the Purchaser Contract Notice where indicated.

1.3 Relief to Prospective Initial Purchaser for Owner Default.

- 1.3.1. Owner shall provide relief, in the manner provided by this Section
 1.3 to any Prospective Initial Purchaser who has not yet closed on a Dwelling Unit if any one of
 the following events shall occur (an "Owner Default"):
- 1.3.1.1. Owner fails to provide a timely CDD Notice or Purchase Contract Notice as required; and/or
- 1.3.1.2. Owner provides a timely CDD Notice; however, such CDD Notice underestimates the aggregate or monthly actual Administrative Assessments for the District's first three fiscal years by more than five percent (5%); and/or
- 1.3.1.3. Owner provides a timely CDD Notice and/or Purchase Contract; however, such CDD Notice and/or Purchase Contract Notice underestimates the actual

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Capital Assessment, if paid in full at closing, by more than five percent (5%) and/or monthly actual Annual Capital Assessments by more than five percent (5%).

Notice (as hereinafter defined), a Prospective Initial Purchaser may, in writing (a "Termination Notice"), elect to rescind the Purchase Contract at any time prior to closing. Upon such election, Owner shall return all monies paid by the Prospective Initial Purchaser regarding the purchase of the real property identified in the Purchase Contract within ten (10) calendar days after receiving written notice from the Prospective Initial Purchaser that such Prospective Initial Purchaser has elected to rescind the Purchase Contract. No other remedies provided in Section 1.4 shall be available to a Prospective Initial Purchaser who terminates a Purchase Contract pursuant to this provision.

Initial Purchaser affected by an Owner Default, Owner shall have an opportunity to cure any Owner Default by providing a written notice (a "Late Notice") to such affected Prospective Initial Purchaser (i) prior to closing and (ii) within the later of ninety (90) days from (x) the date of execution of the Purchase Contract or (y) the Recording Date (the "Cure Period"). If the Owner Default set forth in Section 1.3.1.3 is due solely to a fluctuation of interest rates on the bonds once the pricing of the bonds is completed, Owner shall have the opportunity to cure such Owner Default by providing a written notice setting forth the new annual Capital Assessments to such affected Prospective Initial Purchaser (the "Extended Late Notice") no later than the earlier of (i) the closing date of the Dwelling Unit or (ii) ninety (90) days from the pricing of the bonds (the "Extended Cure Period"). An Owner Default cannot be cured as to an affected Prospective Initial Purchaser after the expiration of the applicable Cure Period or applicable Extended Cure Period.

If Owner provides (i) a Late Notice to a Prospective Initial Purchaser during the applicable Cure Period or (ii) an Extended Late Notice during applicable Extended Cure Period, then such Prospective Initial Purchaser may still elect to rescind the Purchase Contract at anytime for a period of thirty (30) days following receipt of Late Notice or Extended Late Notice. Upon such election, Owner shall return all monies paid by the Prospective Initial Purchaser regarding the purchase of the real property identified in the Purchase Contract within ten (10) calendar days after receiving written notice from the Prospective Initial Purchaser that such Prospective Initial Purchaser has elected to rescind the Purchase Contract. No other remedies provided in Section 1.4 shall be available to a Prospective Initial Purchaser who receives an accurate Late Notice or Extended Late Notice during the Cure Period or Extended Cure Period, as applicable, regardless of whether the Prospective Initial Purchaser elects to rescind the Purchase Contract.

1.3.4. Every Late Notice or Extended Late Notice sent by Owner to a Prospective Initial Purchaser must include the following in bold type in a font at least as large as the largest font in such Late Notice or Extended Late Notice (with correct type of notice indicated):

THE DWELLING UNIT YOU ARE PURCHASING IS SUBJECT TO A RELATED DISTRICT ANDDEVELOPMENT Α COMMUNITY DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS WHICH REQUIRES THAT CERTAIN NOTICES BE GIVEN TO PURCHASERS BY OWNER, THIS IS A [LATE NOTICE or EXTENDED LATE NOTICE] UNDER SUCH DECLARATION, IF OWNER PROVIDES YOU WITH THIS [LATE NOTICE or EXTENDED LATE NOTICE] DURING THE APPLICABLE CURE PERIOD, THEN YOU AS A PROSPECTIVE INITIAL PURCHASER MAY STILL ELECT TO RESCIND THE PURCHASE CONTRACT FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTY (30) DAYS FOLLOWING RECEIPT OF THIS [LATE NOTICE or EXTENDED LATE NOTICE]. UPON SUCH ELECTION, OWNER SHALL RETURN ALL MONIES PAID BY YOU AS THE PROSPECTIVE INITIAL PURCHASER REGARDING THE PURCHASE OF THE REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED IN THE PURCHASE CONTRACT WITHIN TEN (10) CALENDAR DAYS AFTER RECEIVING YOUR WRITTEN NOTICE YOU HAVE BLECTED TO RESCIND THE PURCHASE CONTRACT., AND ALL OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE REMEDIES SET FORTH HEREIN SHALL GOVERN. NO OTHER REMEDIES PROVIDED IN SECTION 1.4 OF THE DECLARATION SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO YOU AS A PROSPECTIVE INITIAL PURCHASER IF YOU RECEIVE THIS [LATE NOTICE or EXTENDED LATE NOTICEJ DURING THE APPLICABLE CURE

PERIOD, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER YOU AS A PROSPECTIVE INITIAL PURCHASER ELECT TO RESCIND THE PURCHASE CONTRACT.

1.3.5. If the Owner Default involves the failure to provide a Purchase Contract Notice or Owner provided a Purchase Contract Notice in substantially the correct form and location; however, such Purchase Contract Notice underestimated the actual Capital Assessment, if paid in full at closing, by more than five percent (5%) and/or the annual Capital Assessments by more than five percent (5%), then the Late Notice or Extended Late Notice shall also contain the following:

YOUR PURCHASE CONTRACT PROVIDES THAT THE PURCHASE PRICE FOR YOUR DWELLING UNIT IS AS FOLLOWS: [INSERT PURCHASE PRICE INFORMATION]. THIS DWELLING UNIT IS OR WILL BE WITHIN A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT"). DISTRICT PLANS TO ISSUE OR HAS ISSUED BONDS THAT WILL HAVE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYMENTS APPLICABLE TO THIS DWELLING UNIT OVER A PERIOD OF UP TO THIRTY (30) YEARS TO CONSTRUCTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE SERVING PROPERTY IN THE ESTIMATED AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$39,000.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT, AND \$42,000.00 FOR A TOWNHOME UNIT. THIS DWELLING UNIT SHALL BE ASSESSED AN ESTIMATED CAPITAL ASSESSMENT OF \$21,176.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT AND \$22,804.00 FOR A TOWNHOME UNIT IF PAID IN FULL AT CLOSING OR AN ESTIMATED ANNUAL CAPITAL ASSESSMENT OF \$1,300.00 FOR A VILLA UNIT AND \$1,400.00 FOR A TOWNHOME UNIT FOR ITS PROPORTIONATE SHARE OF DEBT SERVICE ON THE BONDS UNTIL SUCH BONDS ARE PAID IN FULL, WHETHER THE CAPITAL ASSESSMENT IS PAID IN FULL AT CLOSING OR IN ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS IS AT THE OPTION OF THE PURCHASER TO BE EXERCISED AT THE TIME OF CLOSING. THESE AMOUNTS ARE DUE OVER THE TERM OF THE BONDS IN ADDITION TO THE PURCHASE PRICE. PURCHASER ALSO UNDERSTANDS THAT IF THE ACTUAL ANNUAL CAPITAL ASSESSMENTS ON THE DWELLING UNIT ARE MORE THAN FIVE PERCENT (5%) HIGHER THAN THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT PROVIDED HEREIN, PURCHASER SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO RESCIND THIS AGREEMENT AT ANY TIME PRIOR TO CLOSING. PURCHASER FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT OF CAPITAL ASSESSMENTS DOES NOT INCLUDE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSESSMENTS WHICH SHALL THE DISTRICT FOR OPERATIONS LEVIED BY INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE AND MAY VARY FROM YEAR TO YEAR AND FROM TIME TO TIME. IN THE EVENT OF ANY CONFLICT BETWEEN THE DISCLOSURES IN THIS PROVISION AND THE ATTACHED CDD NOTICE, THE CDD NOTICE SHALL CONTROL.

1.3.6. If the Owner Default involves the failure to provide a CDD Notice or Owner provided a timely CDD Notice; however, such CDD Notice underestimated (i) the actual

aggregate Administrative Assessments for each of the District's first three fiscal years by more than five percent (5%) and/or (ii) the actual Capital Assessment, if paid in full at closing, by more than five percent (5%) and/or the actual annual Capital Assessment by more than five percent (5%), then the Late Notice or Extended Late Notice must also include a CDD Notice, if the Owner Default involves a failure to provide a CDD Notice or an accurate revised CDD Notice, if the Owner Default involves a timely but inaccurate CDD Notice.

- 1.4 Relief to a Prospective Initial Purchaser Who Actually Closes on a Dwelling

 Unit After an Uncorrected Owner Default.
- timely CDD Notice, and such failure is not corrected by a timely and accurate Late Notice, then a Prospective Initial Purchaser that closes on the Dwelling Unit ("Actual Initial Purchaser") may demand, in writing, that Owner pay such Actual Initial Purchaser (i) the amount necessary to prepay all Capital Assessments principal, and interest on such Capital Assessments principal due through the next applicable bond payment date respecting the Dwelling Unit plus (ii) an amount equal to the sum of the share of the actual Administrative Assessments levied by the District on such Dwelling Unit for the District's first three (3) fiscal years immediately following the closing respecting the Dwelling Unit.
 - 1.4.2. In the event that Owner gave to an Actual Initial Purchaser (i) both a timely CDD Notice and Purchase Contract Notice and either underestimated the actual Capital Assessment, if paid in full at closing, by more than five percent (5%) and/or the actual annual Capital Assessments (as set forth in Table 1 of the CDD Notice) by more than five percent (5%) and such underestimate was not corrected by a timely and accurate Late Notice or Extended Late Notice or (ii) a timely CDD Notice and no Purchase Contract Notice, if applicable, and the CDD

Notice underestimated the actual Capital Assessment, if paid in full at closing, by more than five percent (5%) and/or the actual annual Capital Assessments by more than five percent (5%) and such underestimate was not corrected by a timely and accurate Late Notice or Extended Late Notice, then such Actual Initial Purchaser may demand, in writing, that Owner (a) pay such actual Initial Purchaser, in the event he or she elects to pay the Capital Assessment in full at closing, an amount equal to the difference between the actual Capital Assessment due at closing and the estimated Capital Assessment due at closing disclosed in the CDD Notice to the Actual Initial Purchaser or pay such Actual Initial Purchaser, in the event he or she elects to pay an annual Capital Assessment, an amount equal to the difference between the actual aggregate amount of annual Capital Assessments, calculated over the term of the bonds, levied and imposed by the District on such Dwelling Unit and the aggregate amount of estimated annual Capital Assessments, calculated over the term of the bonds, actually disclosed in the CDD Notice to the Actual Initial Purchaser or, (b) if less, the amount necessary to prepay all Capital Assessments principal and interest on such Capital Assessments principal through the next applicable bond payment date with respect to the Dwelling Unit.

1.4.3. In the event that Owner gave an Actual Initial Purchaser a timely CDD Notice and such CDD Notice underestimated the actual annual Administrative Assessments by more than five percent (5%) and such underestimate was not corrected by a timely and accurate Late Notice, then such Actual Initial Purchaser may demand, in writing, that Owner pay such Actual Initial Purchaser an amount equal to the difference between the actual amount of the Administrative Assessments levied and imposed by the District on such Dwelling Unit and the amount of estimated Administrative Assessments disclosed to the Actual Initial Purchaser in the

CDD Notice calculated for the District's first three (3) fiscal years immediately following the closing based on the initial actual annual Administrative Assessments.

- 1.4.4. Upon such demand by an Actual Initial Purchaser under this Section 1.4, Owner shall deliver the applicable amount to the Actual Initial Purchaser within ten (10) calendar days after: (1) receipt of written demand, or (2) after the date Capital Assessments and Administrative Assessments first become payable, whichever is later, unless Owner and Actual Initial Purchaser agree to another manner or time of payment. An Actual Initial Purchaser shall provide to Owner written notice of election of remedy in this Section on or before one (1) year after the earlier of (1) the date that Capital Assessments and Administrative Assessments first appear on the Actual Initial Purchaser's Combined Real Property tax bill for the affected Dwelling Unit or (2) if such assessments are directly billed by the District and do not appear on the Actual Initial Purchaser's Combined Real Property tax bill, then the date that such Capital Assessment and Administrative Assessments first appear on any bill sent to the Actual Initial Purchaser by the District for the affected Dwelling Unit. After the expiration of that year, Owner shall not be obligated to provide any relief to such Actual Initial Purchaser under this Declaration.
- 1.4.5. Nothing in this Section 1.4 shall be construed to relieve any Actual Initial Purchaser of the individual Dwelling Unit of liability for all lawful taxes and assessments including, but not limited to, any tax liability resulting from Owner's payments to such Actual Initial Purchaser under Section 1.4.
- 1.5. Additional Disclosure through District Sign. Owner shall display at every entrance to a sales office or area, in a conspicuous location readily available for viewing by Prospective Initial Purchasers of Dwelling Units, a sign with information about the District. The remedy provisions discussed in Section 1.4 shall not apply to this Section. Such sign(s) shall be

no smaller than twenty-four inches by thirty-six inches (24" x 36"), and shall contain the following language in substantially similar form in large, boldface type:

COCO PALMS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 190, FLORIDA STATUTES, THE COCO PALMS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT MAY IMPOSE TAXES OR ASSESSMENTS, OR BOTH TAXES AND ASSESSMENTS, ON THIS PROPERTY THROUGH A SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT. THESE TAXES AND ASSESSMENTS PAY THE CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE COSTS OF CERTAIN PUBLIC FACILITIES OF THE DISTRICT AND ARE SET ANNUALLY BY THE GOVERNING BOARD IN ADDITION TO COUNTY AND ALL OTHER TAXES AND ASSESSMENTS THE COCO PALMS COMMUNITY PROVIDED FOR BY LAW. DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT EXPECTS TO ISSUE BONDS TO FINANCE A THE CONSTRUCTION OF REQUIRED PUBLIC PORTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE IN COCO PALMS. A PURCHASER OF PROPERTY IN COCO PALMS WILL BE OBLIGATED TO PAY ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS TO AMORTIZE THE DEBT AND FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, WHICH AMOUNTS ARE SEPARATE FROM THE PURCHASE PRICE OF THE PROPERTY AND OTHER ASSESSMENTS ON THE PROPERTY, AND WHICH MAY VARY FROM YEAR TO YEAR AND FROM TIME TO TIME. THE TOTAL ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS VARY IN RELATION TO THE INFRASTRUCTURE BENEFIT ALLOCATED TO THE PROPERTY ASSESSED, AND ARE EXPECTED TO APPEAR ON A PURCHASER'S PROPERTY TAX BILL EACH YEAR, BUT MAY BE BILLED DIRECTLY BY THE COCO PALMS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT. A PURCHASER SHALL HAVE THE OPTION TO PAY IN FULL AT ANY TIME THE PRO RATA SHARE, AS ALLOCATED TO THE PURCHASER'S PROPERTY, OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF DISTRICT CAPITAL ASSESSMENTS DUE. FOR FURTHER INFORMATION ON THE COCO PALMS AND A PURCHASER'S BENEFITS AND OBLIGATIONS RELATING THERETO, CONTACT [INSERT APPROPRIATE CONTACT INFORMATION]."

allow or provide for the District to allow County representatives to review all pertinent records in order to assess the overall performance of Owner in providing timely and accurate disclosure of estimated Capital Assessments and Administrative Assessments on Dwelling Units within the District. Prompt access shall be provided without prior notice of inspection by the County representatives, but only during normal business hours and without disruption of sales operations. The purpose of such inspection is only to determine Owner's overall compliance with the aforementioned notice requirements and such inspection shall not authorize the County to seek

any relief provided under Section 1.4, either on behalf of itself or on behalf of any Prospective Initial Purchaser or Actual Initial Purchaser.

- 1.7. <u>Sole Provider of Water, Wastewater, and Reuse ServiceOwner</u> acknowledges and agrees that the Miami-Dade County Water and Sewer Department ("<u>WASD</u>"), or its successor agency or department, shall be the exclusive provider of water, wastewater, and reuse service to all lands within the Property. Service shall be provided by WASD in accordance with its general policies and procedures for providing service throughout the County.
- Application for Multi-Purpose Special Taxing District to Maintain 1.8 Infrastructure. The costs of maintaining the infrastructure constructed with funding provided through the District shall be the responsibility of the District and its successors and assigns. In order to assure that such maintenance is performed, however, before the recording of a final plat on any portion of the Property, Owner shall submit to the Board a complete application for the amendment of the multi-purpose maintenance and street lighting special taxing district that was created pursuant to Ordinance No. 15-122 on November 3, 2015 to maintain the infrastructure serving the Property including, but not limited to, roadways, drainage, lighting and landscaping, as applicable. Upon approval of the amendment of the aforementioned special taxing districts by the Board, such special taxing districts may remain dormant until, in the sole and exclusive opinion of the Board, both the District and any homeowners' or similar association shall have failed to maintain the infrastructure serving the Property, as such failure is defined in any easement and/or covenant recorded in the public records and governing the infrastructure or similar agreement provided by Owner, or in the absence of such easement, covenant or agreement, as determined by the Board. Upon such determination, the Board shall authorize the activation of the special taxing districts and cause the infrastructure to be maintained at the expense of such taxing district. By

this provision, Owner hereby authorizes the Board and its officials, employees, and agents to enter upon the Property if the special taxing district(s) is activated for the purpose of maintaining the infrastructure serving the Property. Owner further agrees to apply, at the time of plat, replat, or waiver of plat, as applicable, to provide for an easement for the benefit of the County and providing that at any and all times during which the infrastructure or any portion thereof is maintained by the County, the public shall have a right of perpetual access and use in those portions of the Property on which the infrastructure is located including, but not limited to, the roadways serving the Property.

BENEFITS AND ENFORCEMENT.

- 2.1. The covenants set forth in Sections 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4 shall run and be in favor of and to the benefit of Prospective Initial Purchasers and Actual Initial Purchasers of individual Dwelling Units within the Property, and their heirs, successors, and assigns, and shall be enforceable exclusively by such persons. After an individual Dwelling Unit, has been once conveyed to an Actual Initial Purchaser, no further notice shall be required to be provided by Owner to any purchaser of a Dwelling Unit if the same has been improved with a residence. If a Dwelling Unit is conveyed as unimproved land, then such Dwelling Unit shall not be deemed to have been conveyed to a Prospective Initial Purchaser or Actual Initial Purchaser, and all of the covenants set forth in Sections 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4 shall apply to the Dwelling Unit and any Owner offering such Dwelling Unit for sale to Prospective Initial Purchasers.
- 2.2. The covenants set forth in Sections 1.6, 1.7 and 1.8 shall run and be in favor of and to the benefit of the County or any successor municipal government, and shall be enforceable exclusively by such governmental entity.
- 2.3. Enforcement shall be by action against any party or person violating, or attempting to violate, any covenants herein. The prevailing party in any action or suit pertaining

to or arising out of this Declaration shall be entitled to recover, in addition to costs and disbursements allowed by law, such sum as the Court may adjudge to be reasonable for attorney and paraprofessional fees and costs and expenses and trial and upon appeal. This enforcement provision shall be in addition to any other remedies available at law or in equity, or both.

3. COVENANT RUNNING WITH THE LAND.

This Declaration on the part of Owner shall constitute a covenant running with the land and shall be recorded, at the expense of Owner in the public records of the County, following the acceptance by the Board of an ordinance approving the creation of the District, and shall remain in full force and effect and be binding upon the undersigned Owner, and its successors and assigns, until such time as the same is modified or released. These restrictions during their lifetime shall be for the benefit of, and litigation upon, all present and future owners of the Property and for the public welfare. Owner, on behalf of itself and its heirs, successors, and assigns, acknowledges that acceptance of this Declaration does not in any way obligate the County to undertake the construction or maintenance of any infrastructure or any other duty or obligation of the District.

4. TERM.

This Declaration is to run with the land and shall be binding on all parties and all persons claiming under it for a period of thirty (30) years from the date this Declaration is recorded, after which time it shall be extended automatically for successive periods of ten (10) years each, unless an instrument signed by the then owner(s) of the Property has been recorded agreeing to change the covenant in whole, or in part, provided that the Declaration has first been modified or released by the County.

5. MODIFICATION, AMENDMENT, OR RELEASE.

his Declaration may be modified, amended, or released as to the land herein described, or any portion thereof, by a written instrument executed by the then owner(s) of all of the Property, or of such portion as will be affected by the modification, amendment, or release, including joinders of any and all mortgagees, provided that the same is also approved by the Board, after public hearing.

Should this Declaration be modified, amended, or released, the County Mayor or Designee, or the assistant in charge of the office in the County Mayor's or Designee's absence, shall forthwith execute a written instrument effectuating and acknowledging such modification, amendment, or release.

ELECTION OF REMEDIES.

All rights, remedies, and privileges granted herein shall be deemed to be cumulative, and the exercise of any one or more shall neither be deemed to constitute an election of remedies, nor shall such exercise preclude the party exercising the same from exercising such other additional rights, remedies, or privileges.

7. SEVERABILITY.

Invalidation of any one of the covenants herein by judgment of Court shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Declaration which shall remain in full force and effect. However, if any material portion of the covenants herein is invalidated and such provision is not timely amended or replaced, or cannot be timely amended or replaced in an enforceable way with materially the same effect as the invalidated provision, the County shall be entitled to revoke any approval predicated upon the invalidated portion. It shall be Owner's obligation to apply for and diligently pursue any such application for amendment or replacement.

ACCEPTANCE OF DECLARATION.

Owner acknowledges that acceptance of this Declaration does not obligate the County in any manner with respect to the District, or with respect to any land use application on the Property, nor does it entitle Owner to a favorable recommendation or the approval of any application, zoning

or otherwise, and the Board and/or any Community Zoning Appeals Board and other County boards, officials, and employees retain full authority to approve or deny such application.

1. The District. All of the residential dwelling units ("Dwelling Units") in the Coco Palms (the "Development") are also located within the boundaries of the Coco Palms Community Development District (the "District"). The District is a local unit of special-purpose government organized and existing under the laws of the State of Florida and the Home Rule Charter of Miami-Dade County, Florida and located in Miami-Dade County ("County"). The primary purpose of the District is to finance the cost of the public infrastructure of the Development which may include, without limitation, water and sewer facilities, environmental mitigation, roadways, the surface water management system, utility plants and lines, land acquisition, miscellaneous utilities for the Development, as applicable, and other infrastructure projects and services necessitated by the development of land within the Development (collectively, the "Public Infrastructure").

2. The District Board. The Board of Supervisors of the District (the " <u>District Board</u> ") is initially elected by the landowner in the District. The Board is required to advertise its meetings in advance and all District Board meetings are required to be open to the public. The District Board is required to prepare a budget each fiscal year and adopt the same in an open, public meeting. All owners of property within the District are invited to attend District Board meetings and participate in the public process.

3. <u>District Finance and Assessments</u> . The current plan is for the District to issue bonds to acquire, construct, reconstruct, and equip all or a portion of the Public Infrastructure identified in Section 1. Currently, it is estimated that the Dwelling Units in the Development will be assessed based on the Capital and Administrative Assessments listed in Table 1 above and in Sections 3.1 and 3.4 below (if paid in November) to retire the debt of the District, to pay for operations of the District and maintenance of the Public Infrastructure. District assessments will either appear on the County real estate tax bill of each property located within the District and will be paid at the same time as County taxes are paid, or will be directly billed by the District. Capital assessments to repay the principal portion of the bond debt could be levied by the District for a period of up to thirty (30) years.

3.1 <u>District Capital Assessments</u> . The District expects to issue bonds (the " <u>Bonds</u> "), the principal of and interest on which will be payable from non-ad valorem special assessments (" <u>District Capital Assessments</u> ") levied by the District on the property within the Development, which property is found to be specially benefited by the Public Infrastructure. Each Dwelling Unit is subject to a District Capital Assessment to repay the bonds.
PURCHASER'S INITIALS
3.2. Amount. The estimated amount of annual District Capital Assessments including principal and interest levied on each Dwelling Unit is expected to be approximately \$1,300.00 for a villa unit (approximately \$108.33 per month), and approximately \$1,400.00 for a townhome unit (approximately \$116.67), which sum shall be payable annually for the term of the Bonds (the principal repayment period may not exceed thirty (30) years). The aggregate amount of District Capital Assessments including principal and interest expected to be levied and imposed on each Dwelling Unit over the term of the Bonds is approximately \$39,000.00 for a villa unit, and \$42,000.00 for a townhome unit.

In addition to District Capital Assessments, the District will impose an annual non-ad valorem assessment to fund District operations and maintenance of its Public Infrastructure (collectively, "District Administrative Assessments"). The budget from which District Administrative Assessments are derived is subject to change each year, and may vary from year to year and from time to time. During each of the first three (3) fiscal years of the District, it is anticipated that District Administrative Assessments for the Dwelling Unit will be approximately \$152.00 per year per Dwelling Unit, after which time such assessments may vary from year to year and from time to time. A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COCO PALMS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT AMENDING AND RESTATING RESOLUTION NO. 2017-01, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A PETITION WITH MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA TO EXPAND THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT, PROVIDING FOR THE CORRECTED EXPANSION AREA ACREAGE; AND PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Coco Palms Community Development District ("District") received a request from the landowner of an adjacent parcel, SFI Palm Tree Farms, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, that the landowner's parcel be annexed into the District; and

WHEREAS, the District Board of Supervisors ("Board") on April 19, 2017 determined that it is in the best interests of the District and its residents to expand the boundaries of the District by approximately 31.32 +/- acres and subsequently granted the request of the landowner; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 190.046. Florida Statutes, the District Board by adoption of Resolution No. 2017-01 authorized the boundary expansion of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District was notified that the acreage to be amended into the District was not 31.32 +/- acres, but was 24.96 +/- acres; and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the Board hereby determines to amend and restate Resolution No. 2017-01 by reducing the expansion area acreage to approximately 24.96+/- acres.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COCO PALMS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, THAT:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals clauses are true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution by reference.

The District hereby authorizes, ratifies and confirms the filing with Miami-Dade County, Florida, a petition to expand the boundaries of the District to include the area described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto (the "Expansion Area"), all in accordance with Section 190.046, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 3. The proper District officials are hereby authorized and directed to take all steps necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

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SECTION 4. All Resolutions or parts of Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5. If any clause, section or other part or application of this Resolution is held by court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or as applied, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this Resolution.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.







<u>SECTION 3</u>. The proper District officials are hereby authorized and directed to take all steps necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

SECTION 4. All Resolutions or parts of Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5. If any clause, section or other part or application of this Resolution is held by court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or as applied, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this Resolution.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.

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




