FY 2017-18 Report of Employee Ideas/Suggestions (First Quarter)

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-777-14 sponsored by Commissioner Barbara J. Jordan and approved by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) on September 3, 2014, attached is the FY 2017-2018 First Quarter Report (October 1 through December 31) that provides a list of County employees whose cost-saving or efficiency-maximizing ideas/suggestions have been implemented.

Since the last report, on February 21, 2017, no employee suggestions have been approved for cash awards. We can report this quarter that two (2) ideas have been successfully implemented by County departments, with intangible benefits reported. A total of \$600 is being awarded to the employees. Attached is a summary of the following ideas implemented:

These awards are funded by the departments that accepted the ideas and received the resulting benefits. In accordance with Employee Suggestion Program, A.O. 7-8, employees who submit ideas/suggestions that, based on departmental review, do not yield tangible savings are eligible to receive between \$50 and \$1,000, and those whose ideas are deemed to yield tangible savings to the County are awarded 10 percent of the projected annual savings, with a maximum of \$5,000.
