This item was amended at the March 12, 2018 Housing and Social Services Committee meeting to include a reference to Board approval of the Amended North Miami Beach Redevelopment Plan in the Background section.

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) consider the attached resolution approving the North Miami Beach Community Redevelopment Agency's (Agency) FY 2017-18 budget for the North Miami Beach Community Redevelopment Area (Area) in the amount of \$2,732,830.

The Board must approve the Agency's budget prior to the Agency expending any funding in the Trust Fund, as required by Section III D of the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement (Interlocal Agreement) between the County, the City of North Miami Beach (City) and the Agency.

### Scope

The Area lies within Commission Districts 2 and 4, represented by Commissioner Jean Monestime and Commissioner Sally A. Heyman, respectively.

### Fiscal Impact / Funding Source

The Agency's main revenue source is tax increment financing (TIF), which is generated through the incremental growth of ad valorem revenues beyond an established base year, as defined in Section 163.387, Florida Statutes. The Countywide TIF payment into the Agency's Trust Fund is \$550,385 and the City's TIF payment into the Trust Fund is \$770,445.

The County will continue to make annual payments to the Agency through 2028, which is when the Agency and the Area will sunset.

### Track Record / Monitor

This item does not provide for contracting with any specific entity and only approves the Agency's FY 2017-18 Budget of \$2,732,830 (Exhibit A).

### Background

On November 30, 2004 the Board adopted Resolution No. R-1345-04 adopting the Finding of Necessity and creating the Agency. On June 7, 2005, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-611-05 that approved the Agency's Community Redevelopment Plan (Plan) and Interlocal Agreement. The Board adopted Ordinance No. 05-110 on June 7, 2005, which provided a funding mechanism for implementation of the Plan (Trust Fund). On December 19, 2006, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-1427-06 allowing the Agency to enter into a loan for infrastructure improvements and property purchase not to exceed \$8 million, and to extend the life of the Agency and the Area from 2015 to 2028. On May 15, 2012, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-429-12 approving the Amended North Miami Beach Redevelopment Plan. On March 7, 2017, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-213-17, amending the North Miami Beach Redevelopment Plan to include new projects, update information and incentivize a healthy mix of affordable, workforce and market housing.

The Agency's FY 2017-18 budget was approved by the Agency and the City on August 24, 2017 and October 17, 2017, respectively. The budget includes \$550,385 in County TIF, \$770,445 in City TIF, carryover of \$1,400,000, and interest earnings of \$12,000.

Administrative expenditures total \$221,795, excluding the 1.5 percent County administrative charge of \$8,256, and represent eight (8) percent of total expenditures, which satisfies the Interlocal Agreement's 20 percent cap on administrative expenditures.

Operating expenditures total \$2,502,779 including:

- \$1,280,000 for various grant programs that include:
  - \$750,000 for a Targeted Industry Incentive Project;
  - \$200,000 for Commercial Facade Improvements and Commercial Improvement Programs:
  - \$300,000 a Wastewater Connection Fee Assistance Program, and \$30,000 for Art in Public Places pilot program to engage local artists in creating local themes.
- \$767,422 for Capital and Infrastructure improvements including:
  - \$225,000 for the West Dixie Highway Implementation Strategy;
  - \$192,422 for Land acquisition opportunities to include workforce/affordable housing;
  - \$150,000 for Wayfinding Signage, Place making, and Branding;
  - \$100,000 for Hanford Blvd. enhanced lighting and landscaping beautification, and
  - \$100,000 for development of a future Passenger Rail Station.
- \$200,700 for the debt service payment on the 2007 loan that matures in 2027.
- \$136,407 for other operating expenditures including salary and fringes associated with Agency operations, legal services, marketing, printing and publishing.
- \$118,250 for consulting services to assist with review of TIF Recapture Incentive applications, targeted industry market analysis, branding and economic development services.

The budget does not include a contingency reserve.

### Fiscal Year 2018 Budget

For the Fiscal Year Starting on October 1st, 2017 and ending on September 30th, 2018 CRA Board approved 6-0 on 8/24/2017 through Resolution 2017-5

### **Overview**

The North Miami Beach Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA") was created in 2005 by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners ("BCC"), and is a successful partnership between the City of North Miami Beach ("City") and the BCC.

The BCC delegated many of the CRA powers to the City, which then created the CRA. The BCC retained other CRA powers such as approval of the annual budget, amending the Redevelopment Plan, approval of long-term debt such as loans and bonds, and other CRA powers, which was described in the 2005 Interlocal Agreement between the BCC, City, and CRA.

### The CRA's goals are:

- 1) Eliminate and prevent blight,
- 2) Improve the public infrastructure, and
- 3) Prevent and reduce incidents of crime.

The CRA is a dependent special district that may only take on projects and programs that were approved in the Redevelopment Plan.

The latest Redevelopment Plan amendment was adopted by the BCC on March 7th, 2017 through Resolution R-239-17.

### 4, Travel (\$ 5,000)

Travel to conventions, seminars, continuing education, conferences, and developer meetings.

### 5. City Administrative Support (\$ 154,089)

The City of North Miami Beach will continue provide support services to the CRA.

### 6. Other Administrative Expenses (\$ 23,570)

Other Administrative Expenses include but are not limited to overhead expenses, operating supplies, bank fees, education program, communication services, repair and maintenance, office supplies, operating supplies, books and memberships, maintenance and repair of vehicles, fuel, computer equipment and software, postage, professional organization membership dues, subscriptions to publications, and maintenance agreements. Also included in the annual Florida Special Districts fee.

### 7. County Administrative Charge (\$8,256)

Required County Fee @ 1.5% of County's tax increment contribution.

### Total Administrative Expenses including salary/fringe

**\$230,051** 

### **Operating Expenses**

### 1. Employee Salary and Fringe (\$ 96,407)

75% of Administrator's salary and fringe. The Administrator also receives a 3% merit raise effective October  $11^{th}$ , 2017.

### 2. Contractual Services (\$ 118,250)

CRA will contract will consultants to assist with, but not limited to, review of Tax Increment Finance Recapture Incentive applications, meeting recording, meeting minutes, targeted industry market analysis, marketing, branding, and economic development services.

Added 12/21/2017: Contractual Services includes a Parking System Study (\$30,000) - The CRA is to provide financial assistance to pay its pro-rata share of the cost for a parking system study.

### 3. Printing and Publishing (\$ 5,000)

Covers the cost of producing agendas / annual reports and other documents required by the CRA Board and the Redevelopment Advisory Board. Also included are developer recruitment packages, welcome packages including annual public information, and other materials needed to provide an economic overview.

### 4. Marketing/Promotional Activities (\$ 15,000)

Through promotional activities and marketing, the CRA will promote its services and the Redevelopment Area to new businesses and developers and prevent the spread of blighting conditions. The CRA will continue to annually provide customary sponsorship to the Heart

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Health Walk and Bike305 events, in addition to other activities as approved by the CRA Board.

5. Legal Services Costs (\$ 20,000)

Outside legal assistance for development agreements/legal issues and attendance at CRA Board, Redevelopment Advisory Board Meetings, and other meetings as needed. "Legal services" shall include the review of contracts and agreements and the rendering of legal opinions as requested.

### 6. Grant Programs

Commercial Improvement Programs (\$ 200,000)

Commercial Improvement Grant Program: The grant will pay for 50% of the total cost of an approved project up to a maximum cost of \$25,000. All improvements must comply with any and all applicable codes, design standards, and all other restrictions of the City of North Miami Beach.

### Wastewater Impact and Connection Fee Assistance Program (\$ 300,000)

The grant will reimburse up to 50% of the impact and connection fees.

Art in Public Places (\$ 30,000)

The CRA will develop an Arts in Public Places pilot program. Emphasis will be placed on utilizing local artists to create local themes.

### Targeted Industry Incentive Projects (\$ 750,000)

These grants will create new employment opportunities through the attraction of targeted industries.

Phase 1: Craft brewery - \$500,000 with surplus funding rolling into Phase 2

Phase 2: Micro distillery - \$250,000

7. Debt Service (\$ 200,700)

The repayment of borrowed funds for one (1) \$3,000,000 tax exempt loan drawn down in 2007. The loan will expire on 2/1/2027.

### Total Operating:

\$1,735,357

### **Capital Improvements**

The following is recognized as ongoing and potential future infrastructure improvements within the Redevelopment Area:

### Wayfinding Signage, Placemaking, and Branding (\$ 150,000)

This project will create wayfinding signage, mark public parking, public facilities, historic facilities, landmarks, places of interest, bicycle lane improvements, and place making improvements of utility and telephone boxes.

### Passenger Rail Station (\$ 100,000)

This project is to provide financial assistance for the planned North Miami Beach rail station.

### West Dixie Highway Implementation Strategy (\$ 225,000)

This project is to provide financial assistance for a partnership between the CRA and Miami-Dade County for

- a) Façade improvement on a rebuilt West Dixie Highway bridge over the Royal Glade Canal and
- b) West Dixie Highway roadway, landscaping, and streetscape improvements between NE 163<sup>rd</sup> Street and NE 172<sup>hd</sup> Street, a Miami-Dade County project.

### Land Banking - Redevelopment Opportunities - Offices (\$ 192,422)

The CRA may purchase property for redevelopment opportunities such as but not limited to parking, developments, CRA offices, and workforce/affordable housing.

### Hanford Boulevard (\$ 100,000)

The CRA is to provide financial assistance to pay for the up lighting, landscaping and improved safety, which includes but is not limited to materials, safety, and beautification.


- The CRA Board at their regular meeting on 8/24/2017: Parking study must be completed before Hanford Blvd uplighting, landscaping, and security improvements are made.




## Infrastructure
