RESOLUTION WAIVING BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT THE TERM LIMIT RESTRICTION FOR COUNTY BOARD MEMBERS AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 2-11.38.2 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY AND APPROVING THE REAPPOINTMENT OF PAUL SCHWIEP TO THE CITIZENS' INDEPENDENT TRANSPORTATION TRUST

WHEREAS, Paul Schwiep has served on the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) with distinction; and

WHEREAS, Paul Schwiep's third term on the CITT began on October 12, 2014 and ends on October 12, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Paul Schwiep has continuously served as an active member of the CITT and has reached his term limits; and

WHEREAS, section 2-11.38.2 of the Code authorizes a waiver of the eight-year term limit for members of County Boards by a two-thirds vote of the County Commission members present; and

WHEREAS, a copy of Paul Schwiep's resume is attached; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to reappoint Paul Schwiep to an additional four-year term on the CITT,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board waives by a two-thirds vote of the members present the term limit restriction for County Board members and approves the reappointment of Paul Schwiep to an additional four-year term on the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust ending on October 12, 2022.
