1A INVOCATION AS PROVIDED IN RULE 5.05 (H)

1B ROLL CALL

Report:

SETTING THE AGENDA

Assistant County Attorney Monica Rizo-Perez advised there were no requested changes for today's (2/14) agenda.

It was moved by Commission Suarez that today's agenda be approved as presented. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Monestime, and upon being put to a vote, the vote passed 4-0.

1C PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Report

Chairman Souto opened the floor to allow the public a reasonable opportunity to speak. There being no persons wishing to speak, the floor for reasonable opportunity was closed.

1F <u>DISCUSSION ITEM(S)</u>

Report:

Commissioner Suarez commented on a prior initiative proposed by Chairman Souto to provide mini libraries and technical facilities that provided Wi-Fi in County parks and asked staff to provide an update at the next committee meeting.

Ms. Maria Nardi, Director, Parks and Open Spaces, stated a resolution was passed a few years ago to include libraries within existing recreation centers and noted the Parks Department was currently working on a new project, the Chuck Pezoldt Recreation Center, would include a library component in the design of the center. She also commented on another project that consisted of the co-purchasing of land between the Parks and Library Departments to develop a library and park and Olympic Park, adjacent to a library, that was being designed to include outdoor reading spaces for children. Ms. Nardi clarified, where funding was available, Commissioner Souto's initiative was being implemented.

Commissioner Suarez requested from Ms. Nardi a quantification of the number of parks that provided Wi-Fi.

Chairman Souto requested Ms. Nardi investigate the possibility of expediting pending projects through Tallahassee in an effort to obtain more Wi-Fi by possibly adding/amending a legislative bill. He commented on the importance of having Wi-Fi at parks to encourage reading.

Commissioner Suarez commented on the need to reactivate law libraries at the branch courts and suggested this item be added to a future agenda.

Mr. Ray Baker, Director, Miami-Dade Public Library, addressed Chairman Souto's comment regarding building more library hubs for the public to have access to books, noting the department was currently evaluating how to maximize the use of available County space to convert into library hubs. He also spoke about the Little Free Library Movement, a trending neighborhood initiative the Miami-Dade Libraries supported, but their main focus was on big free libraries.

Chairman Souto suggested County Administrators

to seek immediate assistance through state funding to raise money.

Mr. Baker mentioned there were six projects qualified for funding through the Public Library Construction Grant Program. He indicated those projects were on the State Libraries Ranked List, that they would be in Tallahassee next week for Library Legislative Day, and would meet with Dade Delegation members to address library needs.

Commissioner Suarez stated pro-se litigants and/or lawyers should have the means to research the law and suggested the County obtain recycled and/or unused law books that could be used as a resource for pro-se individuals. He asked Administration to research the feasibility of his suggestion and report back to the committee.

Michael Spring stated would look into Commissioner Suarez request and would coordinate with the Mr. Baker on the feasibility.

Commissioner Suarez commented on the need for increased staffing at county parks and also suggested various ways to improve park activities and safety by hiring park rangers, installing camera monitoring, and/or to have a police officer living on site. He asked these issues be placed on a future committee agenda for further discussion.

Chairman Souto commented on the challenge of finding funding for parks without placing the burden on residents and suggested a park entry fee be charged to non-Miami-Dade County residents. He also expressed his intent to improve park safety in his district by paying for the installation of cameras out of his district office funds in an effort to deter criminal activities and improve neighborhood safety. He urged his colleagues to consider doing the same.

Commissioner Monestime noted he has received numerous complaints from residents in his district over a gun range, located on NW 17th Avenue and NW 103rd Street, due to its close proximity to residential homes and asked if it was privately owned, and if not, if the gun range could be turned into a park.

Ms. Nardi stated she would research the possibility; however, confirmed the property was not operated by Parks Department.

Commissioner Monestime suggested County Administration make a public presentation on minority business opportunities that could be available during Super Bowl 2020 at Hard Rock Stadium.

Mr. Spring stated Deputy Mayor Alina Hudak was aware of Commissioner Monestime's request and the Superbowl Business Development Committee would have oversight over that issue. He noted Ms. Hudak would lead the coordination of a presentation on Super Bowl LIV (54) 2020 business opportunities to the community.

Chairman Souto stressed the need to find new ideas for generating park funding through the creation of new venues, programs, or activities.

In addition, Chairman Souto directed County Administration to accelerate pending resolutions/ordinances by expediting Request for Proposals (RFP) to begin collecting monies for parks.
