Subject: Recommendation for Approval to Award Prime Mover; and Authorizing the Use of
Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds for Such Purpose

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve a competitive contract award, *Contract No. FB-00964, Prime Mover*, for the Department of Transportation and Public Works (Transportation and Public Works), for the purchase of two new Prime Movers. There is no current contract for the purchase of Prime Movers. The last Prime Mover was purchased on October 13, 2016 under *Contract No. FB-00377, Prime Mover*, which was awarded by the Board for a one-year term.

This item is placed for Board review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). The Board may only consider this item if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the issuance of this recommendation. If CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the issuance of this recommendation, a withdrawal of this item will be requested.

Background

This contract will provide for the purchase and delivery of two Prime Movers, in ready-to-work condition, to be utilized as work trains to tow revenue trains, transport employees to and from the work area, perform replacement/repair of rail, as well as provide power for hydraulic and pneumatic tools, and other wayside related maintenance tasks. Prime Movers are used 365 days-a-year on the main line and at rail operations located at the William Lehman Center for new rail car movements.

Prime Movers will have a more efficient layout and advanced technological equipment that support all aspects of track maintenance and safety standards. The units are designed to safely and efficiently conduct track maintenance work and respond quickly to any track hazards or emergency. These units will be a direct replacement for the current outdated fleet and will provide a safer, more efficient work environment. The units will assist with maintaining Federally Mandated Track Standards as well as assist with all Rail Vehicle Car support.

Four bids were received in response to the solicitation. The lowest bidder did not offer the product specified in the solicitation. The second lowest bidder is being recommended for award.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the one-year term is \$2,700,000. The allocation under this contract is lower than the previous contract due to economies of scale in manufacturing two Prime Movers. The contract is funded by the Charter County Transportation Surtax funds.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation and extension provisions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.

Vendor Recommended for Award

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition. Four bids were received in response to the solicitation. The lowest bidder did not offer the product specified in the solicitation.

Pursuant to disclosure requirements in Resolution No. R-477-18, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder is recommended in accordance with the solicitation and is a non-local vendor. There are no manufacturers of heavy rail equipment located within Miami-Dade County.



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

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board approves award of Contract No. FB-00964 for the purchase of two prime movers for the Department of Transportation and Public Works for a one-year term in an amount not to exceed \$2,700,000.00, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to give notice of this award, issue the appropriate purchase orders to give effect to same and exercise all provisions of the contract pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38. A copy of the contract document is on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds for such purposes.
