Subject: Recommendation for Approval of the Use of Up To \$6,696,364.61 in Charter
County Transportation Surtax Funds for Traffic Signal Improvement Contracts

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax (Surtax) Funds for Contracts, which have previously been awarded under the Miscellaneous Construction Contracts (MCC) 7040 Plans, for a Push-Button Contract for Traffic Signal Improvement projects. These contracts are currently approved for the use of non-Surtax funding sources via the MCC Program, with this item seeking approval of Surtax funding for those traffic signals improvement projects included within the People's Transportation Plan (PTP). The contracts are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Contract No. 1 –Push-Button Contract for Traffic Signal Improvements – North (RPQ No. 20180074, MCC 7040 Plan) in the amount of \$3,389,130.79 to AUM Construction, Inc.

Contract No. 2 –Push-Button Contract for Traffic Signal Improvements - South (RPQ No. 20180075, MCC 7040 Plan) in the amount of \$3,307,233.82 to AUM Construction, Inc.

This Contract Award Recommendation is placed for Committee review pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code Section 29-124(f). This Contract Award Recommendation may only be considered by the Board if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or forty-five (45) days have elapsed since the filing with the Clerk of the Board of this Contract Award Recommendation. If the CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and forty-five (45) days have not elapsed since the filing of this Contract Award Recommendation, I will request a withdrawal of this item.

Scope

These contracts have been previously awarded under the MCC Program, with a scope of work consisting of Traffic Signal improvements throughout Miami-Dade County (County). Detailed Scope of Work is listed under Exhibit A.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The individual surtax projects will be funded through INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS - COUNTYWIDE (2000000535) in the FY 2018-19 Adopted Multi-Year Capital Plan. The fiscal impact to the Surtax shall not exceed the contract award amount for each contract. Work orders funded by the Surtax will only be issued when written approval is received from a Commission District office for the use of their PTP allocation approved by Resolution No. R-507-04. There is no additional fiscal impact to operations or maintenance.

Delegation of Authority

No additional authority is being requested within the body of this Contract.

Track Record/Monitor

The Push-Button Contract for Traffic Signal Improvements projects will be assigned to Oscar Rubio, Construction Project Coordinator in the Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) for the day-to-day responsibilities.


Background

These contracts were procured through the MCC Program, as noted in Exhibit A, with Road Impact Fee funding identified. DTPW forwarded a Request for Price Quotation by way of facsimile transmission, to a pool of firms that had registered with the Internal Services Department (ISD) for each respective trade. Additionally, DTPW advertised each project in the Miami Dade County web site and all solicitations were available online through the County's portal under the "Procurement Solicitations" link. Each project's award evaluation was based upon the bid submitted by the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, and due diligence was conducted in accordance with ISD's Procurement Guidelines to determine Contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status with the Florida Department of State's Division of Corporations and review of performance or compliance issues. A copy of all bids, and the bid tabulation for all projects, is available by contacting the Chief of the Capital Improvements Division of DTPW.

Consistent with Florida Statute 212.055, and section 29-124 and 2-1421 of the County Code, Surtax funds will be used for projects included in the Five Year PTP Implementation Plan.

Push-Button contracts provide DTPW a means of quickly responding to critical construction and repair needs via a competitively bid contract. The work on these contracts is initiated via work order on an as-needed basis to address these needs. Within the contract, an estimated quantity is provided for bidding purposes as plan details are not available at the time of the bid.

Bidders are advised that actual quantities may vary, depending on the scope of work identified in each work order. Payment is based on the authorized work completed by the contractor.

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Background: On June 14, 2018, DTPW forwarded an RPQ for Push-Button Contract for Traffic Signal Improvements - North, utilizing the MCC 7040 Plan – CICC 7040-0/07 Contract, to a list of 54 pre-qualified firms. Four submitted contract documents, and all four firms proffered a bid.

On July 18, 2018, AUM Construction, Inc. proffered the lowest responsive and responsible base bid of \$2,994,002.49, 0.23 percent below the County's cost estimate. The second lowest bidder, Reyes Electric, Inc. proffered a base bid of \$ 3,559,312.99, 19.95 percent above the County's cost estimate. The third lowest bidder, R & D Electric, Inc., proffered a base bid of \$3,849,359.93, 28.28 percent above the County's cost estimate. The four lowest bidder, Statewide Electrical Services, Inc., proffered a base bid of \$4,418,904.30, 47.26 percent above the County's cost estimate. Based on the results of the solicitation, DTPW issued a recommendation for award on August 13, 2018 for RPQ No. 20180074 to AUM Construction, Inc.

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Background: On June 21, 2018, DTPW forwarded an RPQ for Push-Button Contract for Traffic Signal Improvements - South, utilizing the MCC 7040 Plan – CICC 7040-0/07 Contract, to a list of 54 pre-qualified firms. Three firms submitted contract documents, and all three firms proffered a bid.

On July 25, 2018, AUM Construction, Inc. proffered the lowest responsive and responsible base bid of \$2,920,880.20, 2.66 percent below the County's cost estimate. The second lowest bidder, R & D Electric, Inc. proffered a base bid of \$3,594,595.53, 19.79 percent above the County's cost estimate. The third lowest bidder, Reyes Electric, Inc., proffered a base bid of \$3,597,714.99, 19.89 percent above the County's cost estimate. Based on the results of the solicitation, DTPW issued a recommendation for award on August 13, 2018 for RPQ No. 20180075 to AUM Construction, Inc.


