Recommendation for Approval to Award Rail Car Vehicle Lift, and Authorizing the Use

of Charter County Transportation Strax Funds for Such Purpose

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve a competitive contract award, *Contract No. FB-00795*, *Rail Car Vehicle Lift*, for the Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW).

The contract provides for the purchase of one Rail Car Vehicle Lift (System) and replacement of the existing System, which was installed in 1984 when Metrorail began service. The System has been maintained by DTPW's staff, and is now in need of a replacement due to increased maintenance costs and down time. The awarded bidder shall remove the existing System and furnish a complete turnkey ready-to-work system by providing all design, engineering, licenses, permits, labor, materials, testing, and training to operate the new System.

This item is placed for Board review pursuant to Miami-Dade County (County) Code Section 29-124(f). The Board may only consider this item if the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has forwarded a recommendation to the Board prior to the date scheduled for Board consideration or 45 days have elapsed since the issuance of this recommendation. If CITT has not forwarded a recommendation and 45 days have not elapsed since the issuance of this recommendation, a withdrawal of this item will be requested.

Background

The System is designed to lift Metroral vehicles to allow under car maintenance. The System raises the rail cars by lifting a section of track under the wheels. Body supports engage the jacking pads on the rail car's body in order to support the elevated cars. The scope of work includes the removal of the existing System to include the main structure, motors, gears, wiring, fasteners, control panels and all other related components.

The County received five bids in response to the solicitation, including one "No Bid." Two bids were deemed non-responsive by the County Attorney's Office and one bidder was deemed non-responsible by the Internal Services Department. The bidder recommended for award was the lowest priced bidder in the aggregate. Because there was only one responsive and responsible bidder, the County entered into negotiations with the recommended bidder, which resulted in a cost savings of \$308,000.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the three-year term is \$4,901,000, and includes a five-year warranty. There is no current contract. This purchase will be funded by Charter County Transportation Surtax funds.

### **Track Record/Monitor**

Vanessa Stroman of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Manager.

### **Delegated Authority**

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation, renewal and extension provisions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.

### Vendor(s) Recommended for Award

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition. A total of 1,977 vendors were notified, of which 68 vendors viewed the solicitation. Five bids were received in response to the solicitation, including one "No Bid."

Pursuant to disclosure requirements in Resolution No. R-477-18, the lowest bidder is recommended in accordance with the method of award per the solicitation and is a non-local vendor due to a diminished local market for the goods and services solicited.

Responsiveness of Bids received pursuant to Solicitation FB-00795, Rail Car Vehicle

Lift

You have asked this office if bids from Begus Online, LLC and TCS Contracting Corp., are responsive to Solicitation FB-00795, Rail Car Vehicle Lift. For the reasons set forth below, we conclude that Begus Online, LLC's and TCS Contracting Corp's bids are ineligible for award.

### **FACTS**

We rely on the bid solicitation documents and the bid submittals, as well as the information provided in our meeting.

You indicate that Begus Online, LLC submitted a bid with a bid price of \$4900. You also indicated that there were three other bidders and that all three bidders submitted bid prices in excess of \$3,000,000. On July 30, 2018, ISD sent an email to a representative of Begus Online, LLC confirming if Begus Online LLC had submitted a price for rail car lifts as opposed to automobile lifts. On August 1, 2018, Begus Online LLC responded via email that it did provide a price quote for the rail car lift and that it lacked availability to provide such a rail car lift.

Section 2.4.1 of the Special Terms and Conditions states "[b]idder shall be the manufacturer of the System, or an approved dealer of a manufacturer." Nothing in its bid submittal indicated that TCS Contracting Corp was either a manufacturer of the System or an approved dealer of the manufacturer. Indeed, the County received written documentation demonstrating that TCS Contracting Corp is not an authorized dealer of the proposed manufacturer. The County received from the manufacturer of the System, IME-Autolift, correspondence dated July 19, 2018 identifying Lif-Tech Equipment as the distributor of its product in the United States and Canada. In a subsequent letter, dated August 3, 2018, IME-Autolift identifies TCS Contracting Corp as the general contractor and as authorized "to install the underfloor lifts and related equipment", while Lif-Tech Equipment is identified as the authorized distributor.

### DISCUSSION

It is readily apparent (and acknowledged by the bidder itself) that Begus Online LLC submitted a bid without considering the actual specifications for the work and the product to be delivered. As such, Begus Online LLC's bid may not be considered for award.

The clear and unambiguous terms of the bid solicitation require the bidder to be either the manufacturer of the System or an authorized dealer of the manufacturer. One principle reason for this requirement was to ensure quality control and the honoring of the required warranties. A bidder who is neither the manufacturer of the System nor an authorized dealer is not eligible for award. In this instance, the evidence shows that TCS Contracting Corp. is not the manufacturer nor the authorized dealer. As such, TCS Contracting Corp. is ineligible for award and said bid shall not be considered.

A copy of the contract document is on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division.

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Section 2. This Board authorizes the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds for such purposes.
