



RESOLUTION SUPPORTING GOVERNOR RON DESANTIS'S REQUEST TO ADD ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND OTHER TYPES OF DEMENTIA AS A PRIORITY WITHIN THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S STATE HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN; URGING THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO INCLUDE ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND OTHER TYPES OF DEMENTIA AS A PRIORITY IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY'S COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN; AND DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO WORK WITH GOVERNOR DESANTIS AND THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE OFFICE OF INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS, TO SUPPORT STATE HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN GOALS THAT STRENGTHEN RESOURCES RELATED TO ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND OTHER TYPES OF DEMENTIA IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States and the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, between 2000 and 2017 deaths from Alzheimer's disease have increased 145 percent; and

WHEREAS, more than 5.8 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's disease and that number is projected to rise to nearly 14 million by 2050; and

WHEREAS, in Florida, at least 560,000 individuals age 65 or older are living with Alzheimer's disease; and

WHEREAS, by 2025, the number of individuals in the State of Florida age 65 and older with Alzheimer's dementia is estimated to increase by 28.6 percent reaching 720,000; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Health developed Florida's 2017-2021 State Health Improvement Plan ("SHIP") in collaboration with the State Surgeon General and a range of stakeholders including state and local government agencies to improve the health of Floridians through efficient and targeted collective action; and

WHEREAS, the SHIP set forth eight priorities related to: health equity; maternal and child health; immunizations; injury; safety and violence; healthy weight; nutrition and physical activity; behavioral health (including mental illness and substance abuse); sexually transmitted disease; and chronic diseases and conditions; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia were not added as a priority to the SHIP; and

WHEREAS, Governor DeSantis recently directed the Florida Department of Health to add Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia as a SHIP priority; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County developed the Miami-Dade County Community Health Improvement Plan ("CHIP"), a plan directly linked to the SHIP, to coordinate resources in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County's CHIP addresses five key health priorities, which include: access to care; chronic disease prevention; community redevelopment and partnerships; health finance and infrastructure; and health protection; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia are currently not included as a priority of Miami-Dade County's CHIP; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to have Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia included as a priority in Miami-Dade County's CHIP,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Supports Governor Ron DeSantis’s request to add Alzheimer’s disease and other types of dementia as a priority within the Florida Department of Health’s State Health Improvement Plan.

Section 2. Urges the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County to include Alzheimer’s disease and other types of dementia as a priority in Miami-Dade County’s Community Health Improvement Plan.

Section 3. Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to work with Governor DeSantis and the Florida Department of Health, in conjunction with the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs, to support the State Health Improvement Plan goals that strengthen resources related to Alzheimer’s disease and other types of dementia in Miami-Dade County.

Section 4. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to Governor DeSantis, the Florida Department of Health, the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Esteban L. Bovo, Jr. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
