



RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO IDENTIFY AND REPAIR TRAFFIC CONTROL AND NON-TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNS DAMAGED OR DESTROYED BY HURRICANE IRMA THAT ARE CURRENTLY IN A STATE OF DISREPAIR AND TO PROVIDE A REPORT TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, Hurricane Irma made landfall in the State of Florida on September 9, 2017 with hurricane and tropical storm force winds extending to Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, Hurricane Irma caused substantial damage to traffic control and non-traffic control signs throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, since that time, the County Department of Transportation and Public Works has been repairing and replacing such damaged or destroyed signs, with an emphasis on ensuring that all traffic control signs damaged by Hurricane Irma were restored to an operational condition; and

WHEREAS, a small number of traffic control signs, although operational, are still in a leaning condition, and approximately five to ten percent of non-traffic control signs are still in need of repair or replacement; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the County to complete the repair or replacement of all traffic control and non-traffic control signs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to identify the signs throughout Miami-Dade County damaged by Hurricane Irma that are still in need of repair and replacement, and to forthwith commence and complete the repair or replacement of such signs.

Section 2. Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to submit a written report to this Board within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution providing the status of such repair and replacement efforts, the number of signs that remain in a state of disrepair, if any, and setting forth a plan for completion of such repairs or replacement for any such remaining signs, and is further directed to place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.
