WHEREAS, "El Encanto," Havana's most famous department store, was also considered one of the world's best during the 1950s, comparable to modern day Bloomingdales or Nordstrom in the United States; and

STREET AS "ANTIGUOS EMPLEADOS DE EL ENCANTO

WHEREAS, founded in 1888 by two partners, José Solís and Aquilino Entrialgo, "El Encanto" was located at the corner of Old Havana's most famous intersection, Galiano and San Rafael, and had subsidiaries in many other cities in Cuba; and

WHEREAS, "El Encanto" attracted celebrities from all over the world, including Hollywood luminaries Errol Flynn, Robert Taylor, John Wayne, Tyrone Power, Ray Milland, Debbie Reynolds, Pier Angelli, Lana Turner and many others; and

WHEREAS, from its humble beginnings as a small store over 130 years ago, "El Encanto" grew into one of the world's most prominent and fashionable department stores in the 1950s; and

WHEREAS, "El Encanto" was the embodiment of prestige, reliability and seriousness, and united the best yearnings of social, national, and cultural advances, making it possible to become a public service institution, worthy of the admiration, respect and gratitude of the nation; and

WHEREAS, in 1961, "El Encanto" had about 930 employees; and

WHEREAS, unfortunately, "El Encanto" was destroyed in a terrorist arson attack in April, 1961; and

WHEREAS, the former site of the department store is now the location of the Fe del Valle park, in honor of one of the store employees who died in the attack; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory of "El Encanto," its founders and its employees by codesignating that portion of SW 97th Avenue at its intersection with SW 23rd Street as "Antiguos Empleados De El Encanto Way"; and

WHEREAS, that portion of SW 97th Avenue at its intersection with SW 23rd Street is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 10,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates that portion of SW 97th Avenue at its intersection with SW 23rd Street as "Antiguos Empleados De El Encanto Way".

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Senator Javier D. Souto. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
